Rachel Reckitt's book illustrations, including the complete set of woodblocks engraved for The Mill on the Floss, & what was lost in their making. A UK Limited edition. One of 185 cloth bound copies, this being copy number 93. Set in 14 pt. Van Dijck at Gloucester Typesetting and printed at Whittington on Zerkall mould-made papers. Fine in matching paper covered slipcase. Unfaded, no inscriptions, tight and bright. A lovely copy.

Book: The book is square and very tight. There are no previous ownership inscriptions. The boards are clean and unfaded, the corners sharp. The pages and closed page edges are clean and bright. The binding is tight - no cracked hinges. No remainder marks. This copy has been **FLAT SIGNED** by both Quentin Blake and Emma Chichester Clark to the title page. A lovely copy in a protected wrapper.




Greene, Graham - May We Borrow Your Husband ? And Other Comedies of the Sexual Life - *SIGNED* £220.00

V Sackville West - Even More for Your Garden £110.00


A bright UK first edition.

Wrapper: The wrapper on this copy is bright, clean, unfaded and complete. It is unclipped. It shows a trace of bruising to the upper edge of the back panel and to the head of the spine. Looks sharp.

Book: The book is square and very tight. There are no previous ownership inscriptions. The boards are clean and unfaded. The corners are sharp. The spine ends are inconsequentially bruised. The pages are clean. The closed page edges are sound - the top edge is lightly flecked. No dog-eared pages. The binding is tight - no cracked hinges. A very nice copy in a protected wrapper.

BOOK: The book is square and very tight. The boards are clean and fresh. The corners are sharp. The pages are clean. No foxing. The closed page edges are very slightly dusty. No dog-eared pages. The binding is solid - no cracked hinges. There are no previous ownership inscriptions. A good looking copy in a protected wrapper.
