Arthur Henry Howard Heming (1870 - 1940) gained international renown as the "chronicler of the North" for his vivid depictions of Canada's northlands in paintings, sketches, essays and books. Interestingly, he was colour blind and worked primarily in black and white. Gilbert John Elliot-Kynynmound, 4th earl of Minto, was a British politician, Governor General of Canada, and Viceroy of India, whose convictions as to the importance of preserving Canadian heritage led to the creation of the National Archives of Canada. £350.00

At present we are confining ourselves to biographies. If we undertake a biography in which the result of your researches can be utilised, I shall give myself the pleasure of writing to you again. Single sheet contained in a purpose-made card folder with title label to front cover. vg+. The letter reads: "Dear Sir Kenneth, Thank you very much for your interesting letter. I was with Milner in South Africa at the time of the Bushveldt murder, and was interested in it as I had once come across the murderer. In the last number of the Police Review there was an article by someone

in the Transvaal Police service. I was in Africa from 1901 - 3 as Lord Milner's private secretary, and as I was also for some time Acting Commissioner for Lands, I got to know the Northern part of the country pretty well. A story of mine, Prester John, is the result of my experiences in the Northern Transvaal. Yours sincerely, John Buchan."

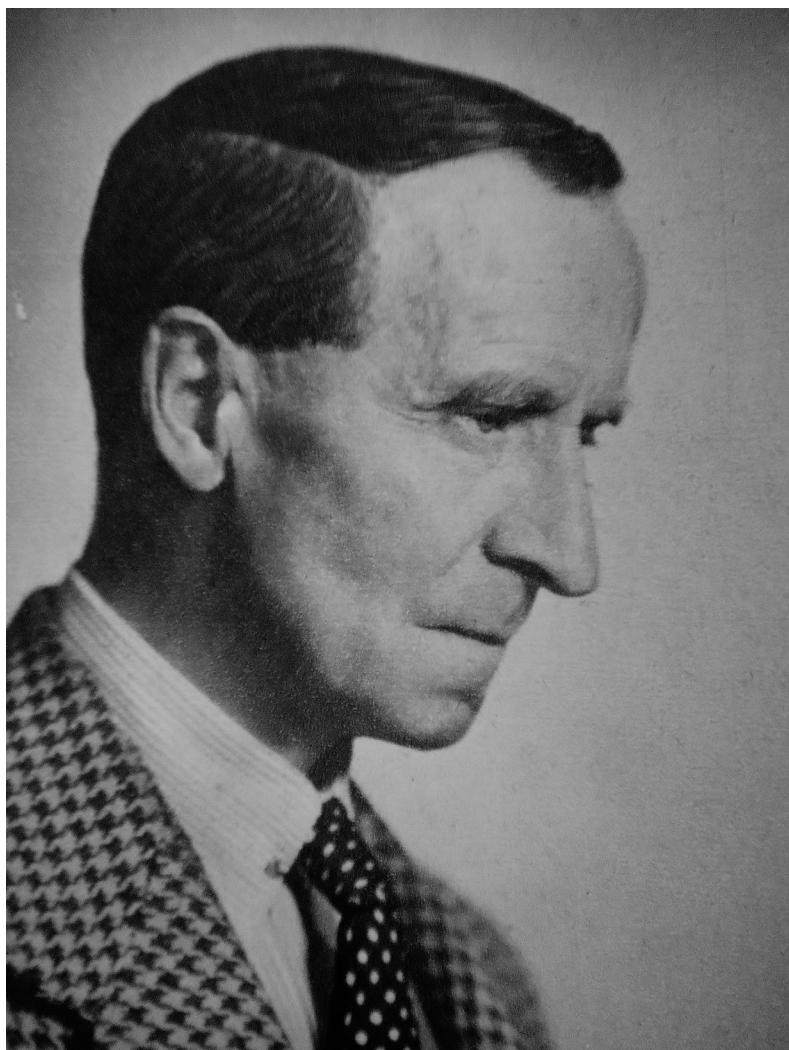
