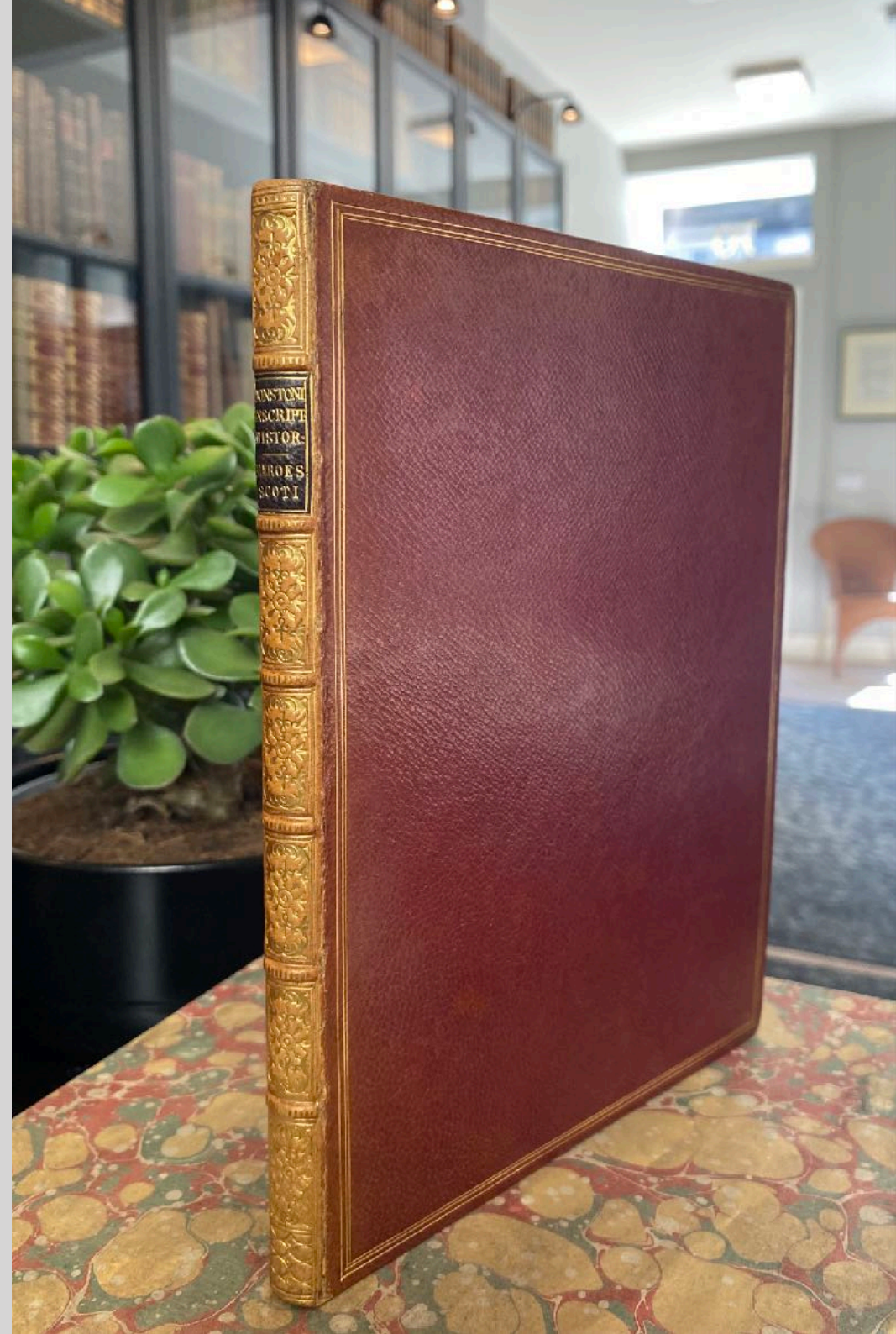
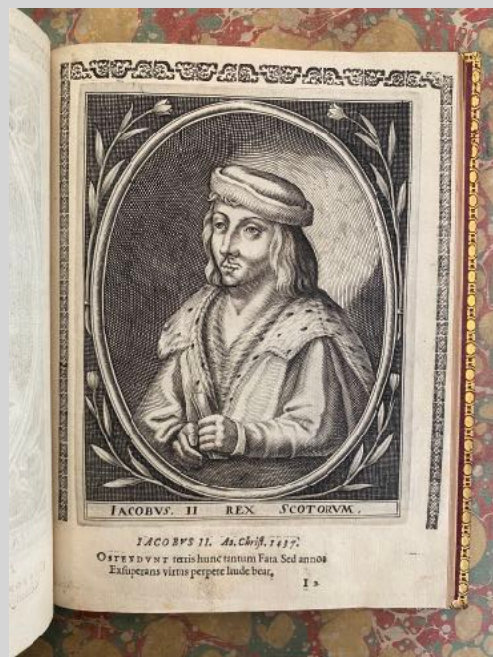
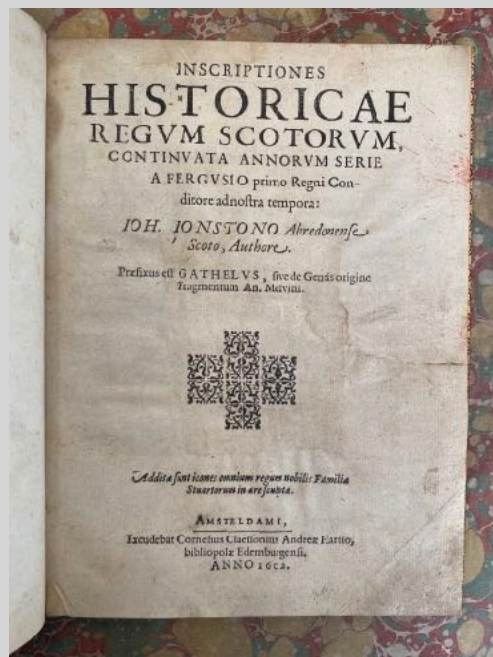
Full red Morocco, bevelled edges, bands gilt extra, titled direct, bound by Sotheran's. Armorial Ex Libris "Paine", (Cornelius Paine's library was sold at Sotheby's 16th February 1891.) Booksellers label William Brown, Princes St. Edinburgh. A previous copy had a pencil note, "One of three copies printed on vellum."

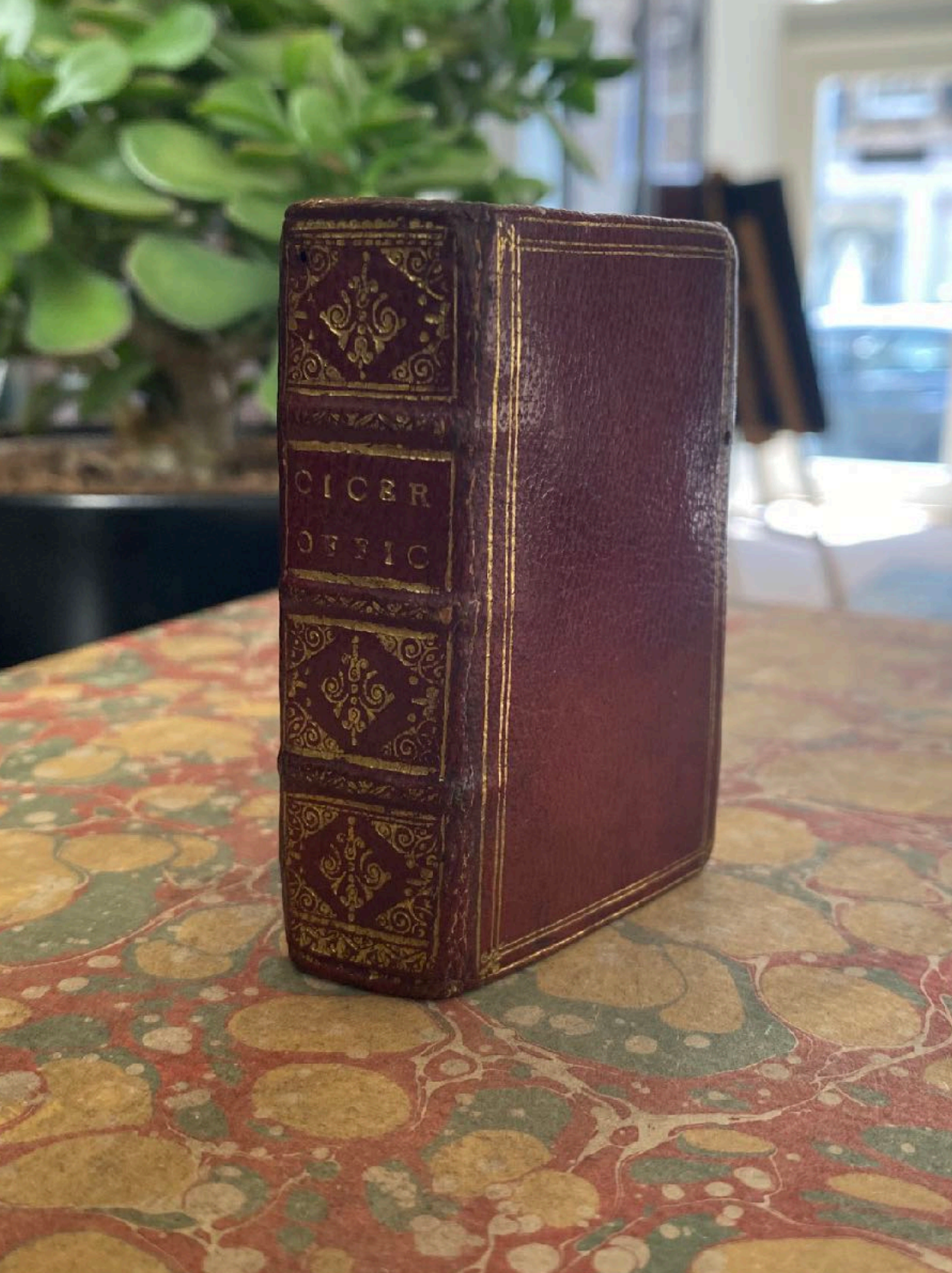

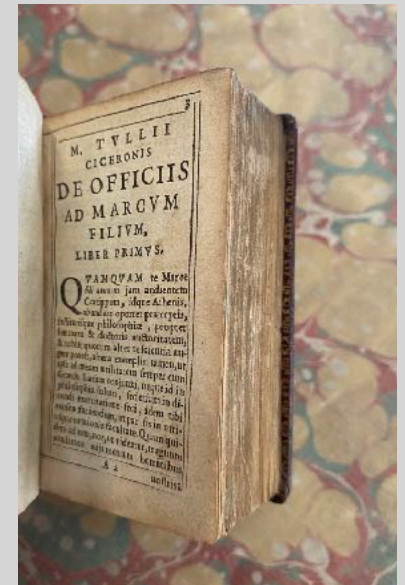

Bound by Riviere & Son. Year 1932 has slight loss of gilt on raised band and some very slight wear to front hinge, year 1937 has some similar wear to raised bands and very slight wear to front hinge.

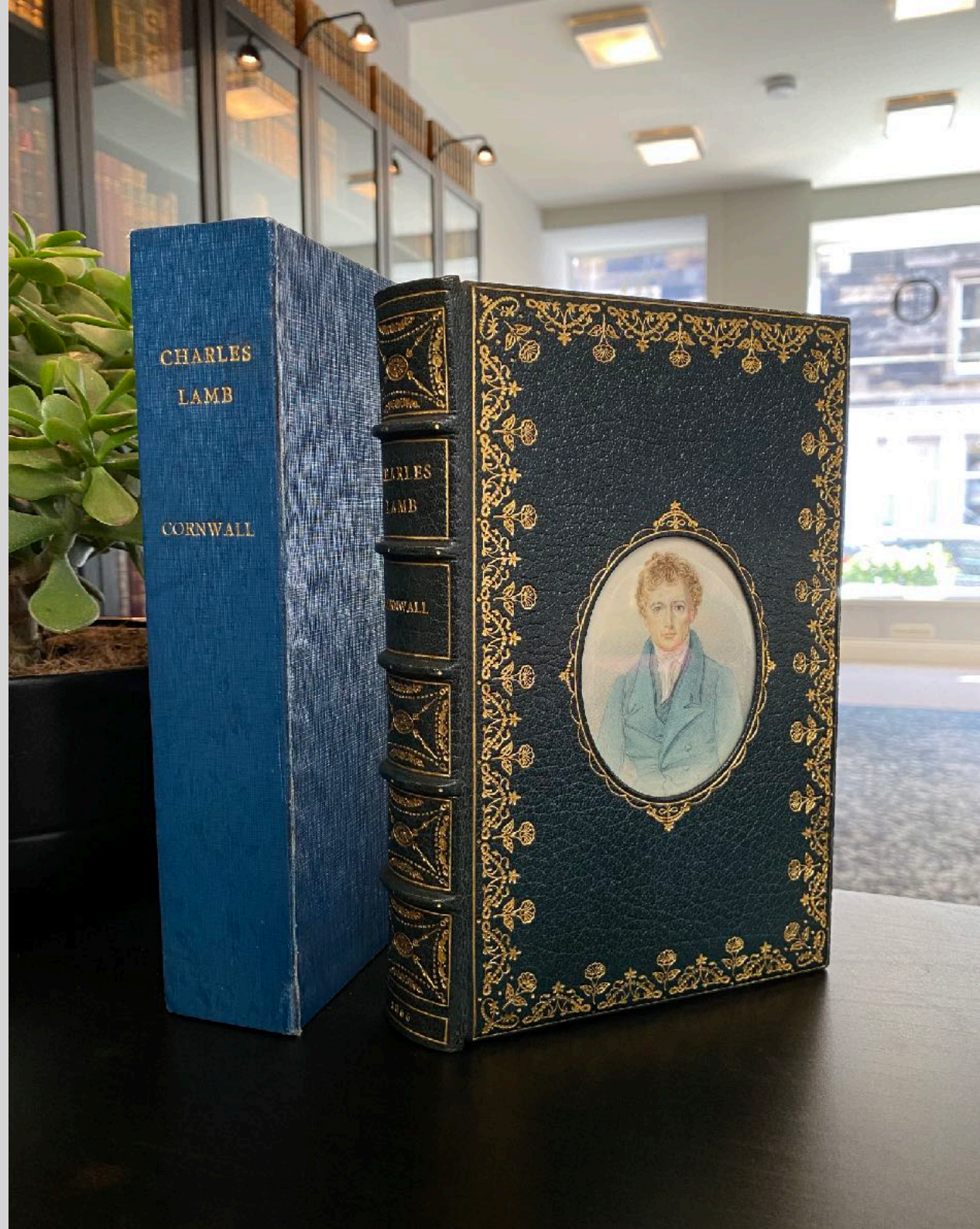

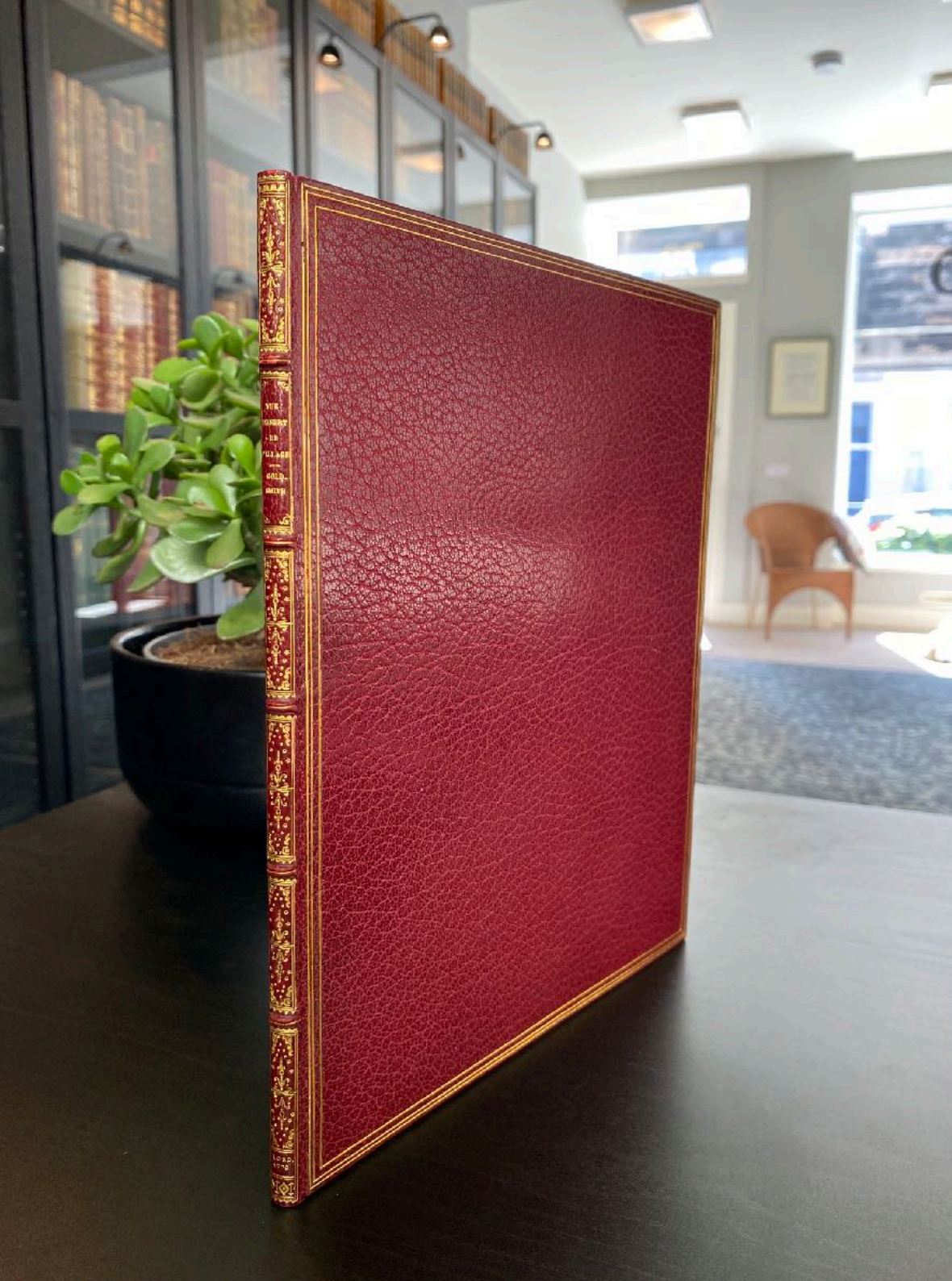

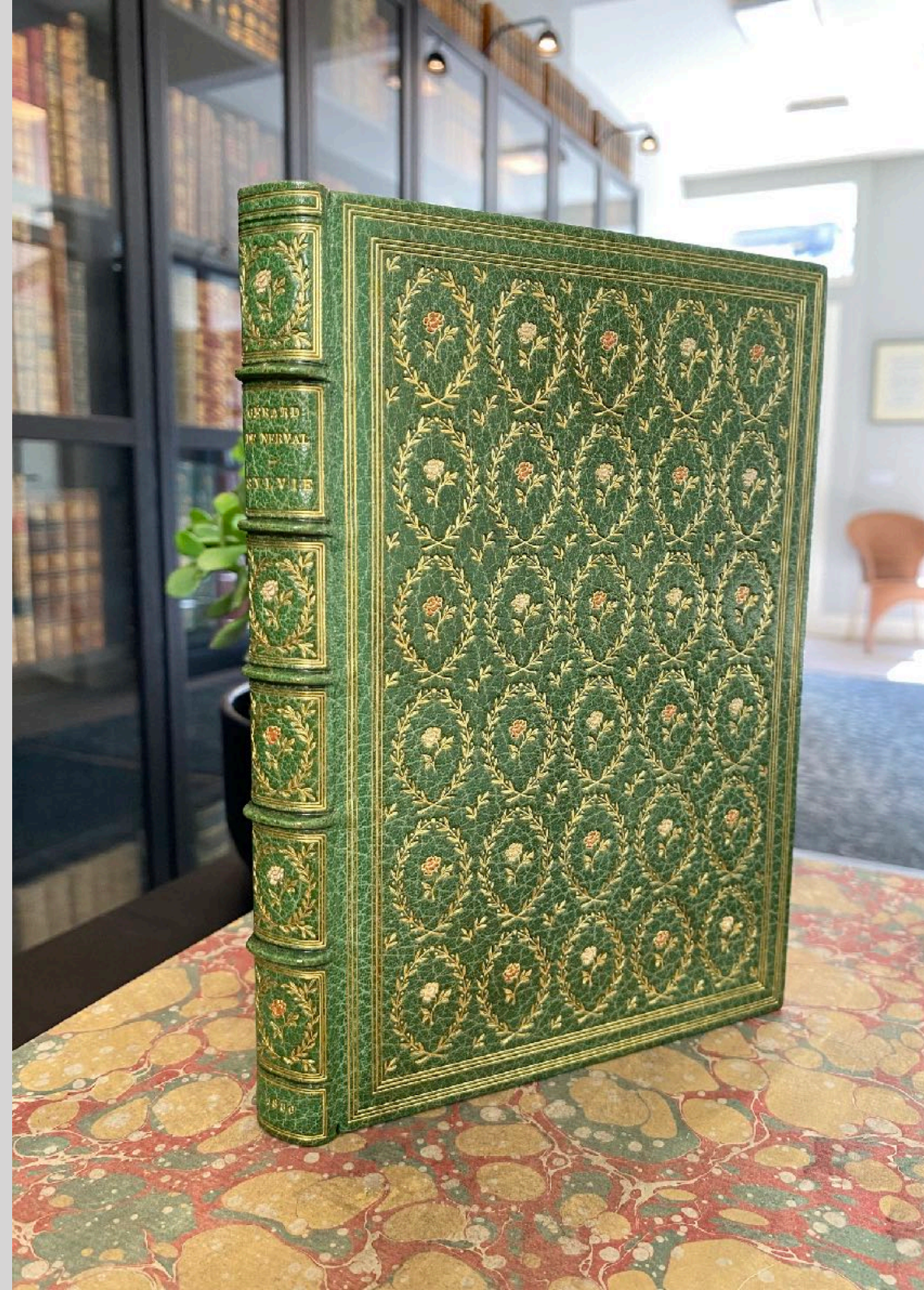

Very slight discolouration to bottom corner of front board around 1cm in size.

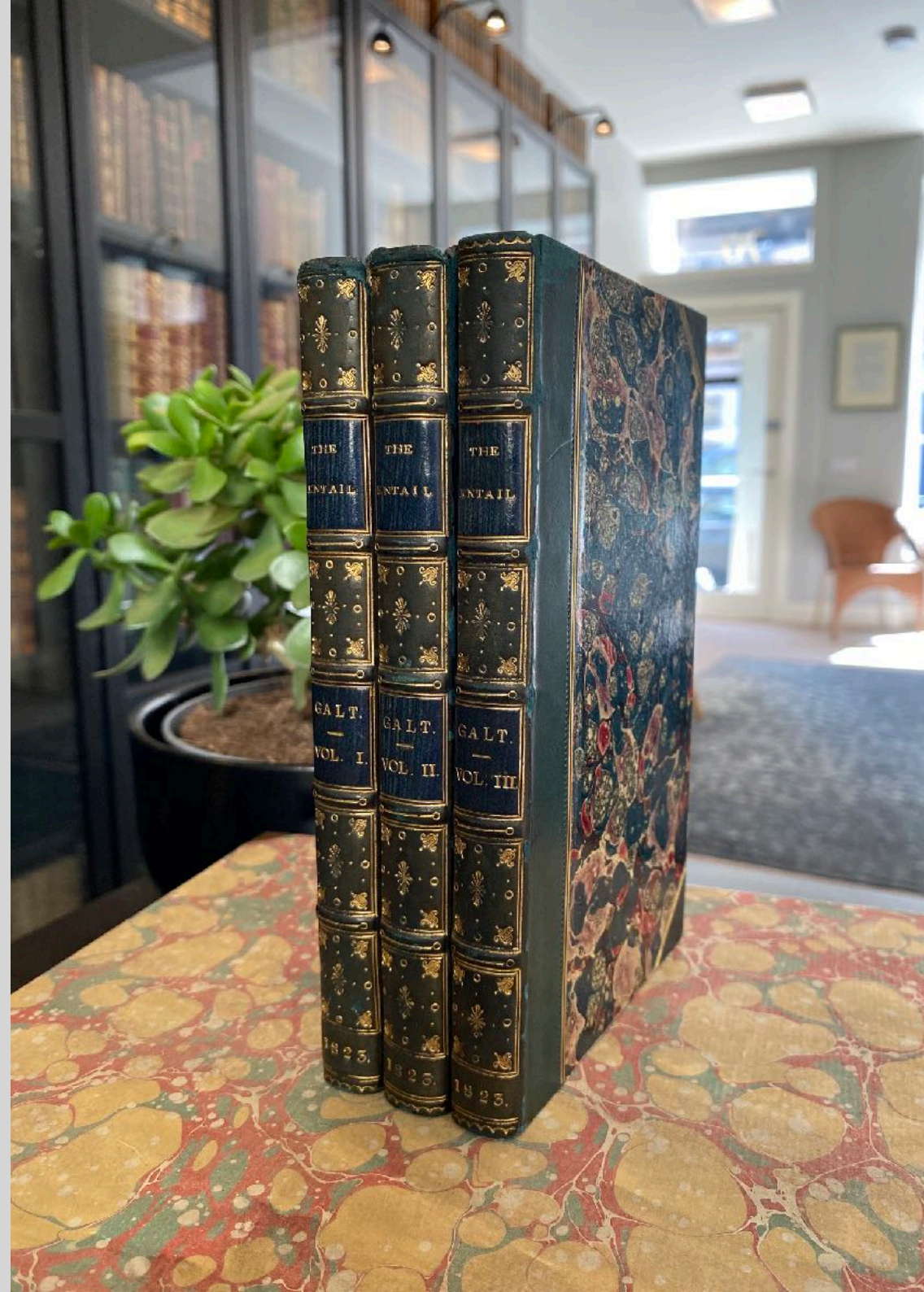

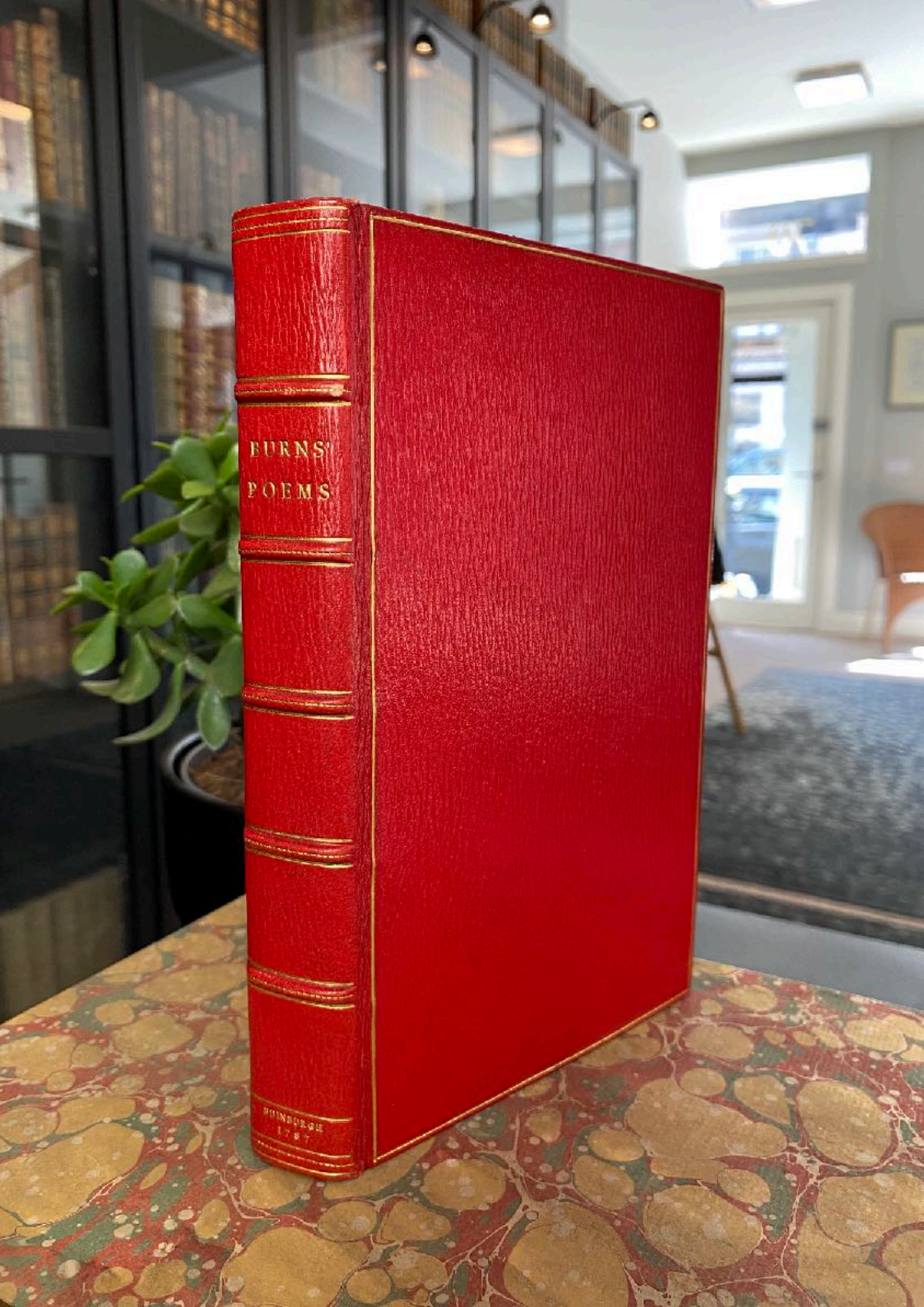
