A NOTE ON THE TYPEFACE

This catalogue has been set in The Doves Type® This was developed in the 19th Century by Thomas James Cobden Sanderson, along with engraver Emery Walker for use on the Doves Press. In 1916, Cobden Sanderson began to systematically destroy the entire type to prevent Walker from possessing his promised portion and the possibility of this leading to it being used on a mechanised press. He did this by throwing it from Hammersmith Bridge! After three years of research and dredging the Thames, Robert Green has been able to re-create the type from some of the originals. We love both the look of the type and its history.

First edition. An attractive French work teaching illustration to young people. Original cloth spine and hardback boards to paper covered binding with an intricate design to the front board. This has an individual number stamped to it (#770) so presumably the work was limited. There is no separate title, but there is a printed sheet giving information about the book. Then follow 25 plates for learning to draw, showing a variety of subjects. Curiously, we can find only one OCLC listing and one copy of this work for sale, and both list 24 plates (se we seem to have gained an extra)! Title and place of publication from cover. Some leaves with imprint: "Imp. Becquet fres." or "Lith. de Becquet fres." 26 leaves. 15cm x 22cm (oblong). Other than the additional plate, conforms to WorldCat / OCLC: 1340484746.



This collection compiles popular songs performed at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane and other public venues. J. Pitts (John Pitts) was a prominent London street ballad printer active from approximately 1765 to 1844. He operated in the Seven Dials district, a well-known center for popular and chea print production in the late 18th and early 19th centuries Pitts specialized in printing broadsides—single sheets featuring ballads, songs, and topical verses—intended fo



First edition. Preliminary programme for this 1940 exhibition held under the patronage of Goebbels. This version is in English (although obviously badly translated in some places). Cover is title page, in red and black. 12 unnumbered pages including a gate fold illustration / plan of the exhibition space. Light foxing on the front of the soft covers. Sewn together with red thread. This exhibition, at least as it was planned, never took place. $300 \times 210 \text{ mm}$ ($11\frac{3}{4} \times 8\frac{1}{4}$ inches). Overall in excellent condition. The gatefold has been (almost) invisibly strengthened to one edge. Fractional foxing to the front cover. 14 pages. The exhibition was planned for 1940 to celebrate the invention of printing. It was to take place in Leipzig, a centre of book production and the Reich's "fair city" (Reichsmessestadt). The exhibition took place only in a very modest, scaled down version, largely due to the gap between Goebbels' grandiose ideas, and the local planners more practical abilities. Despite the proximity to the war, of all of the printing organisations invited, only the Finnish turned down the invitation.




Alasco: A Tragedy, in five acts, excluded from the stage by the authority of the Lord Chamberlain.

London: Sherwood, Jones, and Co, 1824. First Edition. Original hardback drab boards, with more recent paper quarter paper backing. Attractive book plate of Mary Clarkson Bagby (born Mary Clarkson-Allen in 1896, in Baltimore, U.S.A) to the front. Mary lived in various locations due to her husband's diplomatic and military career, including a notable period in China after World War I. This book obviously remained in the family, as it also bears the name Mary G. Duyvendak - Allen written to the front in neat ink handwriting. Internally clean. Bound in after Preface is a single leaf manuscript copy of a letter from George Colman dated February 1824, citing its inclusion in the memoirs of Sir William Knighton, 1838. This must have been bound in when the book was rebacked. lvi, [ii], [4], [1] - 169 [1]. 16. (Sherwood New Works dated January 1824) pp. 240 x 150 mm (9½ x 6 inches).

Martin Archer Shee was an Irish-born painter and writer. This play was first performed in 1824 at the Theatre Royal, Covent Garden, London. Set in Poland, it centres on the character Alasco, a Polish nobleman involved in a dramatic struggle against tyranny, persecution, and oppression. The play is notable not just for its content but for the controversy surrounding its production. The Lord Chamberlain, who was responsible for licensing plays in Britain, initially refused to license this play for performance at Drury Lane Theatre due to its perceived political radicalism and revolutionary themes. This decision was likely influenced by the authorities' fear of plays that might incite unrest or challenge the established order, especially in the wake of the French Revolution and ongoing political agitation in Europe. The refusal to license Alasco sparked public debate about censorship and the limits of artistic expression. Eventually, the play was performed at Covent Garden after some changes were made to the text. The incident highlighted the tension between creative freedom and government control in the early 19th century. In summary, Alasco is remembered as a tragedy that became a symbol of the struggles over censorship and free expression in British theatre history.

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BARRETT / ASHBURTON, Charles Alfred Henry VIII reproving Bishop Gardiner who was come to seize Catherine Parr while conversing with him in the

First edition. A hand coloured engraving from Ashburton's History of England A lovely copy of this engraving, which has been skillfully hand coloured. Originally for Ashburton's History of England, it is now held beneath passe partout. The plate is in good, clean fractionally darkened condition. Slightly rough edge where originally bound into the book. Engraving is 23cm x 39cm. Mount is 33cm x 45cm. In the latter years of Henry VIII's reign, his sixth wife, Catherine Parr, was known for her intelligence, piety, and reformist religious sympathies. She engaged in theological discussions with the king, sometimes challenging his views and advocating for Protestant reforms. This made her a target for conservative factions at court, particularly Bishop Stephen Gardiner, a staunch Catholic and influential member of Henry's council. Bishop Gardiner and his allies grew concerned about Catherine's influence and her Protestant leanings. They sought to convince Henry that she was guilty of heresy. Gardiner managed to secure a warrant for Catherine's arrest, intending to seize her while she was with the king.

According to tradition (and as recounted by later chroniclers such as John Foxe in his Acts and Monuments), Catherine was warned of the plot by her friends and, possibly, by sympathetic courtiers. Realising the danger, she sought an audience with Henry while he was walking in the palace garden. During their conversation, Catherine humbly acknowledged the king's wisdom and authority in matters of religion, claiming that her discussions were meant only to divert and comfort him, not to instruct or correct. She professed herself his humble scholar, not his teacher. At this moment, Bishop Gardiner arrived in the garden, warrant in hand, ready to arrest the queen. However, Henry, having been mollified by Catherine's humility and reassurances, turned on Gardiner with anger. He rebuked the bishop sharply, accusing him of overstepping his bounds and seeking to sow discord between the king and his queen. Gardiner, realising his peril, withdrew in disgrace. Catherine was spared, and her enemies at court were temporarily discredited.





1792. Second edition. A rather lovely copy of the new, constitution, presented to the King in September 1791. This copy is date 1792 to the title page. It appears to be the second Volland edition (see below). Original dark blue paper covers, with title (erroneously dated 1791 to the front cover). To the inside cover, is a charming contemporary inscription entitle "A vin" extolling the virtues of reading the work. (By professor A.N. Motte or Hotte). To the inside rear cover is a further annotation signed by professor and dated Year 1 of the French Empire (Ie. February 1805). Pages are in very good, clean condition, with a touch of edgewear only. The book contains the Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen; the French Constitution; A message from the King to the National Assembly, September 13, 1791; The speech and oath of the King, for the acceptance of the Constitution, at the session of the National Assembly, September 14, 1791; And the speech by Mr. Thouret, President of the National Assembly, to the King, September 14, 1791. 91 pages. 13cm x 7cm. Chez Volland was a well-known Parisian bookseller and publisher located on the Quai des Augustins, recognized for publishing important political works by authors such as Jean-Jacques Rousseau, Mme Riccoboni, and Etienne-Louis Geoffroy.



Paris: Armand le Chevalier (1873)

First edition. Two volumes. A marvellous collection of facsimiles of political posters from the start of the Franco-Prussian war and the commune of Paris, through to the end of May 1871. These are complete reproductions of the original posters, complete with hand colouring where appropriate. Leather spine with green leather labels and gilt titles. There is some rubbing to the spine, but still attractive. Marbled boards with a little rubbing. Internally the pages are clean and tidy throughout. A little darkening to the rear pages (of index) which are printed on cheaper paper. The first volume deals with the war and the siege. (Paris was besieged and surrounded by the Germans from September 1870 to january 28th 1871 when the French surrendered). The harsh terms of the armistice and the humiliation of defeat contributed to the radicalization of Paris's population. Just weeks after the siege, the revolutionary Paris Commune was declared.* Volume two contains facsimiles of the political posters during the commune, which ended on May 28th 1871. The original title page from volume one is in four colours (the French flag and a yellow background). In addition to this, there is a second title page, dated the following year, which was inserted when the second volume was produced, and the two sold as a set. [vi], 1022., 676. pages. Each volume has indexes. 28cm x 23cm. *The commune was a radical and revolutionary government that ruled Paris from March 18 to May 28, 1871. The French government, now based in Versailles and led by Adolphe Thiers, viewed the Commune as an existential threat. Beginning in April 1871, government forces launched a military offensive to retake Paris. The final assault, known as "Bloody Week" (La Semaine sanglante), began on May 21. Fierce street fighting ensued, with barricades erected throughout the city. The government's victory was marked by mass executions and reprisals: estimates of Communard deaths range from 20,000 to 30,000, making it one of the bloodiest events in Parisian history.




First edition thus. First edition of the first full translation of Dante's Divine Comedy into English. Recent full green leather binding with black labels and gilt titles and details. These are immaculate. Inside, this is an ex reference library edition, with a few small library stamps throughout, but quite unobtrusive. The pages are a little darkened, but still in very good condition. One pager (69/70) has a closed tear to the corner of the page (not affecting text). Frontis portrait of Dante by R.H. Cromek after T. Stothard. Apparently part of the reason that there had not been a prior English translation, was because it was felt that Dante's Catholic views would be unpopular or irrelevant in Protestant England. vi, [i], 408., 384., 420. 

First edition thus. (First edition printed in the Netherlands in the same year as the Rollins publication). An attractive four volume set, in full leather with profuse gilt decorations to the spine. Title and volume labels to the spine. The boards are in sound condition but with a little rubbing and loss to some parts. Marbled end papers. Internally, the four volumes are in excellent clean condition. Bears the name in each volume of Jean-Frédéric de Montmollin (1740–1812). He was a prominent statesman, industrialist, and community leader from Neuchâtel, Switzerland. This edition is dedicated to the Prince of Orange. Complete with an attractive folding pictorial family tree and folding map of Spain by I.B. Nolin. It's full title was traditionally known as 'History of the Revolutions of Spain from the Destruction of the Empire of the Goths to the Complete and Perfect Reunification of the Kingdoms.' 'The work of Fr. d'Orleans is exactly included in the first, second and third volumes up to page 139. The rest of the third volume up to page 85 of the fourth is by the late Fr. Castleford's Chronicle, also known as the Boke of Brute, is a major Middle English verse chronicle attributed to Thomas Castleford. Composed in the early 14th century, it is one of the longest English chronicles of its time, totaling nearly 40,000 lines in eleven books and a prologue. The work survives in a single manuscript, now held at the State and University Library in Göttingen, Germany. The chronicle tells the history of Britain from its legendary origins, beginning with Albina and her sisters and the arrival of Brutus (a foundational myth popularized by Geoffrey of Monmouth), up to the reign of Edward II in the early 14th century.

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





Second edition. A nice copy of this open letter to his constituents, from the political radical Charles James Fox. It argued his radical position and opposition to war with France. Significant here, as France declared war on the United Kingdom six days later. Although this copy seems to lack the half title and a blank, as it begins with the title page, and the next leaf has the signature B, our copy follows the pagination of OCLC 6595972. So we assume that the second edition had no half title. Contents themselves are complete. To the end is a single leaf of advertisements from Debretts, end with a hanging "the" indicating there should be a second leaf (here lacking). Sewn with twine (as with all other copies we have seen). The covers have a little marking and edgewear, but inside, the contents are clean and tidy throughout. [ii], 43, [1]. pages. Charles James Fox, a radical Whig reformer, was first elected for a rotten borough in 1768 whilst he was still underage. A lovely copy of this First Edition. Original red blind embossed boards with bevelled edges and gilt decoration and titles to the spine. A touch of marking, but overall in excellent condition. Internally, a good, clean copy, with light foxing and marking to the pages. Gift inscription to Hélené, the wife of Prince Roger de Podenas (an Indre Loire dignitary). After and engraved title, there are 13 engraved text leaves, and 12 engraved leaves, each plated with a printed (titled) paper guard. Complete. The book has been recently restored, so the perfect binding is perfect once more! (Perhaps the most inaccurate bookbinding term, this style of binding is notorious for its falling apart as the glue disintegrates. A very nice copy. By 1885, these infections were responsible for the deaths of 20-30% of bottle-fed infants in France. Following the work of Louis Pasteur, German scientist Franz von Soxhlet developed a technique for sterilising milk in 1886. This work was part of the proving to the public and the scientific community that this process was essential for infant health. By the early Twentieth century, sterilisation of infant milk was the norm in France (and in America it became the norm by 1912).


A lovely architectural sketch album of a tour of Normandy in the 1860s by the eminent architect Richard Suter. Held in a large (48cm x 30cm) half red leather and green buckram binding. In 1860, Richard Suter* accompanied Benjamin Stacey esq. and his two daughters on a fourteen day tour of Normandy and Paris. As an accomplished architect, he undertook sketches and drawings along the way, and presented these in an album to the family. He created this album as an exact copy of the first to keep for himself. There is a note that he tipped into the front stating the details of the gift and that all the drawings in this album were tracings by hand by himself from the originals. The works are created on glassine / heavy tracing paper. The album comprises: A circular itinerary of the trip, and a map of the route taken below this. There are then 80 medium or large sketches / drawings, and a further 33 sketches which are small (more like vignettes). In addition there are two watercolours that he tipped in. Presumably these weren't in the gifted album, as one, a magnificent folding panorama of Caen, dated 1849. (This is 96cm x 17cm showing the town from the shore side). There are also seven lithographs of architectural churches from a published work, and a stereoscope photograph. The sketches include a handful of quick portraits, but are mostly of hotels, chateaux, the interior and exterior of churches, details of architectural features etc. A particularly nice sketch is of the Seine through the window of the Louvre. An accomplished work, with an architects eye for detail.

* Richard Suter (1797–1883) was a prominent English architect based in London, known for his extensive work as Surveyor to The Fishmongers' Company and for designing several notable buildings in both England and Ireland. His architectural contributions include: Presbyterian Churches: Ballykelly (1825–27) and Banagher (1825) on the Fishmongers' Company's Estate in County Londonderry. Drawings of these buildings were exhibited at the Royal Academy in 1827; In Ballykelly, he was responsible for the Model Farm (1823-24), Lancasterian Schools (1828-30), Company Agent's House (1830-32, now a hotel), a range of houses (1823-24), a lodge in the Presbyterian churchyard (1828), and the Dispensary (1829), all executed in the Classical style; In London, he designed St Peter's Almshouses in Wandsworth (1849-51) and contributed to the Old School-House at Gresham's School, Holt, Norfolk (1859), both in the Elizabethan style. He also worked as Surveyor to the Trinity House Corporation, and designed houses erected by Thomas Cubitt in 1821-23 on a site adjoining Trinity House. Richard Suter's legacy is marked by his role in shaping both ecclesiastical and civic architecture in the 19th century, particularly through his association with influential London livery companies and his contributions to educational and charitable buildings. Approximately 65 pages (in a book with 176 numbered pages, hence quite a few blank pages to the rear. Overall in excellent, slightly darkened condition.









The animals are fighting for their freedom against a circus director/tamer, who is a a look-a-like of Adolf Hitler. The book takes as its premise, the tongue twister "Imagine and imaginary menagerie managed by an imaginary manager." Stiff card covers. A little marking and foxing to these. The covers have become detached from the block as some point and are not secured by archival tape. Slight loss of card to the top edge of the spine. Internally clean and tidy throughout with full page images presented in black with one colour (differs throughout). Vignettes also. Unpaginated by 50 pages. No date, circa 1945. Gaston Ry is Rene Rostagny (1902-1978). 27.5cm x 22cm. Conforms to WorldCat / OCLC: 458449553. A scarce item, there is only one library holding at the BnF.

Third edition. Brown cloth covered hardback boards with gilt title to spine. Lacks half title, and final adverts, seemingly never having been bound in Page 84 has been crudely repaired, but is totally legible. A good reading copy. 385 pages. 185 x 120 mm ($7\frac{1}{4}$ x $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches).

Richard Watson became a fellow of Trinity College Cambridge in 1760, and received his MA in 1762. He was appointed Professor of Chemistry at Cambridge in 1764, despite having limited formal training in the subject, and transitioned to theology, becoming Regius Professor of Divinity at Cambridge in 1771, a post he obtained with royal support - again despite lacking a divinity degree (at that time). Watson was known for his rational, biblical approach, recognising no authority but the New Testament and showing little interest in systematic or historical theology. He associated with the influential

Thomas Paine (1737–1809), was a pivotal figure of the Enlightenment and the American Revolution, and is renowned for his radical critique of the Bible and organised Christianity, most famously articulated in his work The Age of Reason, which began this series of letters.

group of Edmund Law's followers, which included John Hey and William Paley.
