#### A NOTE ON THE TYPEFACE

This catalogue has been set in The Doves Type® This was developed in the 19th Century by Thomas James Cobden Sanderson, along with engraver Emery Walker for use on the Doves Press. In 1916, Cobden Sanderson began to systematically destroy the entire type to prevent Walker from possessing his promised portion and the possibility of this leading to it being used on a mechanised press. He did this by throwing it from Hammersmith Bridge! After three years of research and dredging the Thames, Robert Green has been able to re-create the type from some of the originals. We love both the look of the type and its history.

Full contemporary vellum. Ascribed to Paul the Deacon by the typescript Oxford Intercollegiate Catalogue; to Alcuin by Adams and listed under the heading Alcuin by BM STC German, 1455-1600, though described as a suppositious work. Title and date printed in red and black within a woodcut architectural border. Woodcut initials. Text printed in double columns. 230 ff. 250 x 180 mm (9¾ x 7 inches). Some darkening to the covers. Internally generally a good clean copy with some slight dustiness. Penciled inscriptions to inside paste down. There is worming to the blank lower margin, and also to leaves 166-189 with loss of text. COPAC shows a single copy of this 1538 edition. (Oxford).


#### Northern Netherlands: N/P (1754)

First edition. A scarce engraving by an unknown engraver from 1754. It shows the arrival of Daniël Raap in Hell. A caricature on the death of the merchant and Orangist Daniël Raap on 15 January 1754 in Amsterdam. Raap with his ally Teepken in hell standing before the Devil on his throne. Details in the image numbered 1-5 but there is no legend. tipped onto a paper sheet and held under passe partout. We cannot find any other copies of this for sale, and the only copy we can locate is in the Rijksmuseum (RP-P-OB-84.474) also with no legend. engraved area is 21cm x 31cm. Sheet is 25cm x 34cm. Passe partout is 35cm x 50cm. The sheet is a little darkened, and has a closed tear to one edge (not affecting engraved area). The title is added in Dutch in manuscript to the bottom right, and the number 114 to the bottom left. Small area of loss to the top edge of border, hidden by passe partout. A scarce item.

Daniel Raap (1703–1754) was a Dutch porcelain merchant from Amsterdam who played a significant role during the Orangist revolution in the Netherlands between 1747 and 1751. He was known for his agitation against the ruling Regent class, advocating for greater public influence in government and supporting the restoration of the stadtholderate under William IV, Prince of Orange. Raap, along with other activists, published pamphlets demanding democratic reforms and hereditary stadtholder rule. He organized petitions and called for the direct election of militia captains, the restoration of guild privileges, and auctioning of vacant public offices. His activities led to William IV intervening in Dutch politics, but when the new city government remained dominated by the traditional regent families, Raap found himself at odds with both more radical democrats and Orangists. By the time of his death, Raap's former popularity had turned to hostility; riots occurred at his funeral, and his coffin was even destroyed by a mob.

Beautiful copy of this numbered limited comic approach to the French Penal Code. This is one of only 50 copies which are on papier annam de Rives. The book comes with a full suite of the illustrations in colour, and a second suite in black and white. This should also come with an original watercolour - but this is not present. Orange / red slipcase, with a little rubbing but no major damage. cream faux vellum folder containing the soft covered book and 2 suites. The wrapper of the book is covered in glassine. There is a small hole in the glassine (presumably where a sticker has been removed). Otherwise immaculate. The text itself is loose in gathers, with Dratz's colour illustrations throughout. 243 [iii], pp. 270 by 235mm (10¾ by 9¼ inches).



An original caricature by a Belgian artist. First edition. This attractive cartoon, in the style of the early Twentieth Century, is signed, and dated 1918, but we cannot make out the signature. Perhaps Renan, Renard or similar? The work is entitled "Jeu de Soldat" and shows a small top atop a pile of wartime debris. He is obviously in charge, and is looking down at his friends, who has a collection of play weapons. The comment below is along the line of "friends, if you all want to be Belgians now, who will be the enemy" presumably a comment on the children's desire to be Belgian now that the National Army is winning the war. Good clean water colour image, with signature and note in pencil. In excellent condition. A very well made caricature, by a skilled hand. 25cm x 20cm.







Full of Buffet's striking illustrations, including a calligraphic front cover. three black and white or colour full page illustrations. Five colour or black and white double page illustrations. And two half page illustrations. (A total of ten original lithographs that cannot be found elsewhere). Also includes information and statistics about French and World cinema, and the Cannes festival of 1958. A rare item, we can find no other copies of this item available. 34 pages. 31cm x 24cm. Slight darkening to the white front cover, otherwise in excellent condition.

First edition. Hardback limited edition of this magnificent children's work. One of only 150 copies on Van Gelder Hollande paper. Sadly, our copy no longer has the suite of black and white illustrations. Inspired by the E Épinal chapbook style publications of the nineteenth century, this lovely book was assembled using stencil coloured blocks. This leads to a vibrancy of colour that gives the appearance of hand colouring. The hardback boards are slightly darkened, but substantially sound, with a sound red cloth spine. There is a slight area of bleeding to the colour in the top right of the boards. Internally clean and bright throughout. 45 pages. 390 x 290 mm (15½ x 11½ inches).


## BARRETT / ASHBURTON, Charles Alfred Queen Margaret in derision crowning the Head of the Duke of York with a Paper Crown

A hand coloured engraving from Ashburton's History of England London: W. & J. Stratford (1792)

First edition. A lovely copy of this engraving, which has been skillfully hand coloured. Originally for Ashburton's History of England, it is now held beneath passe partout. The plate is in good, clean fractionally darkened condition. Slightly rough edge where originally bound into the book. Engraving is 23cm x 39cm. Mount is 33cm x 45cm. The scene in which Queen Margaret places a paper crown on the head of the Duke of York is one of the most memorable moments in William Shakespeare's play Henry VI, Part 3. The episode occurs during the Wars of the Roses, a series of dynastic conflicts between the houses of Lancaster and York for the English throne in the 15th century. After the Battle of Wakefield (1460), Richard, Duke of York, is captured by the Lancastrian forces led by Queen Margaret of Anjou. In an act of cruel mockery, Margaret and her allies taunt York for his failed claim to the throne. She places a paper crown on his head, ridiculing his royal ambitions before ordering his execution. "York cannot speak, unless he wear a crown. A crown for York! and, lords, bow low to him: Hold you his hands, whilst I do set it on. (Putting a paper crown on his head) Ay, marry, sir, now looks he like a king!" (Henry VI, Part 3, Act 1, Scene 4).



First Edition of this uncommon work giving an overview of the United States of America at the beginning of the Nineteenth Century. Complete with all maps and tables. Contemporary green hardback binding with burgundy and gilt spine label. The binding is somewhat rubbed and darkened. A weakness to the front board has been repaired and sewn at some point. There is a large (50cm x 38cm) map of North America with hand coloured borders and boundaries. This has a repaired hole to the top right edge (not really affecting map detail) and a repaired closed tear to the book edge, through the cartouche. There are also 17 charts and plans to the the rear showing statistical information. 274 pages. The pages are clean, with a little darkening to the edges only. A decent copy. 230 by 150mm (9 by 6 inches). The author was the French Consul General in the United States From 1804 to 1810, representing Napoleon Bonaparte to Thomas Jefferson. First edition. A very nice copy of this original lithographic poster by Bezombes. A good clean copy, with a light crease to one corner, but otherwise in excellent condition. This exhibition was to advertise an exhibition of paintings, designs and engravings by Bezomes. 76cm x 51cm. The Salle du jeu de Paume - or the Tennis Court room, is an important location at Versailles, used during the French Revolution, the Jeu de Paume Hall became a symbol of the Revolution in progress. On June 20, 1789, the deputies of the Third Estate met there for the Estates-General. Roger Bezombes (1913-1994) was a French painter, sculptor, printmaker, medallist, and designer, best known for his vibrant and experimental work influenced by his extensive travels and modern art movements.







Partly the story of a Mongolian child, partly a documentary of Mongolian life, it is illustrated throughout by Ergy's fine photographs. Black and white throughout. Soft covers with red and black detail and photographs to front and rear cover. There is fractional bumping and fractional darkening to the covers. Internally spotless throughout. Ergy Landau (1896–1967) was a Hungarian-French photographer best known for her portraits, female nudes, advertising work, and dynamic images of inter war Paris. Despite significant contributions to 20th-century photography, her name remains less recognised than many of her male contemporaries such as Brassaï or Robert Capa. Unpaginated but 46 pages.



Published initially from 1749 to 1788 (with supplements and further





An attractive, limited, numbered and signed engraving of the Île de la Cité from the Seine, with the Square du Vert-Galant in the foreground. Typical of Cluzeau's river engravings, although undated, this is circa 1935. Good clean impression. The artists red monogram, and the number 21/60 are below to the left. A strong signature in pencil below to the right. On stiff art card. All are clean and tidy, with perhaps fractional darkening to the paper. Engraving is 16cm x 28cm. The sheet is 32cm x 48cm. Pierre-Antoine-Marie Cluzeau (1884–1963), was a French painter, engraver, illustrator, and draughtsman celebrated for his evocative landscapes, architectural scenes, and portraits. His works are particularly associated with the regions along the Seine and Marne rivers, where he depicted both the quiet poetry of rural life and the vibrant energy of urban France.





#### : Editions Langlaude (2021)

First edition thus. A beautiful fine art, limited reproduction of this iconic art deco poster. Originally produced by Harper's Bazaar, as the November 1920 Winter Fashions catalogue cover, this edition, on heavy, matte, fine art paper is limited to 50 numbered copies. (this is copy 5). In perfect condition, the vibrant red of this poster is particularly striking. A large piece, the coloured image is 64cm x 50cm whilst the poster itself is 80cm x 60cm. Erté (Romain de Tirtoff) had an extraordinary and defining relationship with Harper's Bazaar magazine. From 1915 to 1936, he contributed over 240 covers and more than 2,500 illustrations, including fashion drawings, accessories, interior designs, and even society columns for the magazine. His work established an iconic Art Deco aesthetic for Harper's Bazaar, with bold colors, geometric forms, and elaborate couture designs that helped revolutionize fashion illustration and set the magazine apart as a creative leader during the early 20th century.

This scarce children's collection of prints, each contains 30 double page sheets, with hand coloured illustrations of different subjects. So here we are offering 60 double plate sheets. The binding is in old paper covered stiff card, with bumping and loss of surface paper. The spine has been renewed quite some time ago with archival cloth. No titles. The contents for the first few pages are breaking away from the binding - but still holding together. First edition of this charming collection of French burlesque texts published for the English market by Robert Triphook. The publisher Triphook is particularly known for its editions of unusual texts of this type (a "marotte" is a fool's cap with bells). The texts offered are facetious tales featuring various kings of the Ancien Régime (particularly Henry IV), counts and presidents, doctors and lawyers... Text in French. viii, 292 pages. 15.5cm x 9.5cm.

The book bears the bookplate of Sir Edward Walpole, the member of Parliament and son of Sir Robert Walpole (the United Kingdom's longest serving prime minister). However this presents a problem, as Walpole died 30 years before the book was published. The book also bears the plate "Stolen from Dangstein." This was a country estate, owned by Reginald Henry Nevill who appears to have been Edward Walpole's heir (through his wife, who was a Walpole). It seems that the bookplate was added long after walpole's death. The estate of Dangstein was largely designed by Lady Dorothy Nevill. Perhaps the person who read this book of amusing texts found it amusing to place an old bookplate for an impossible author into it.






### WEISHÄUPL, Hans Faces of Evil

What appears to be photographs of dictators is actually composite images of individuals from the dictator's homeland. "Between November, 2007 and March, 2008, we took photographs of over 350 people in........ From them emerged the thirteen FACES OF EVIL, assembled from faces of people of the same ethnic origin as the according dictators. For example, the portrait of Hitler consists of 37 people. His nose belongs to an estate agent from Berlin, his upper lip to a locksmith in Dresden. His hair is put together from the hair of an artist in Weiden and a painter in Bamberg. The chin stems from a Hamburg restaurant owner, the eyes are those of a bank advisor in Frankfurt, the lachrymal sacks are from a precision mechanic in Bautzen, the throat is that of a Viennese banker...." So what is the point ! the artist believes dictators emerge "Because society allowed them, sometimes even encouraged them to do their evil. This suggests that a multitude of faces of active and passive accomplices stand behind the face of every dictator. Whilst everyone joins in to say "Never again!" after a reign of terror has ended, history shows that new tyrants can be allowed to rise to power again and again, in all parts of the world." 






He published important anti-slavery tracts such as Justice and Expediency and was known for his involvement in abolitionist publications like the Pennsylvania Freeman.
