

Approx 28 x 22cm. L'shana Tova: Rosh Hashanah V-Mail from World War II. This one was for use by the US Forces in the Pacific. This is an unused copy to be completed by the sender and then photographed and then transported for printing.

To ease the burden on the postal system, V-mail was introduced during World War II for correspondence with service members stationed abroad. Stationery was photographed and transported on microfilm and then reproduced on small paper sheets at the destination. It was the primary way for soldiers and their families at home to communicate during the war. This method was also used for sending Shana Tovah [Happy New Year Cards and Greetings] and Passover related greetings etc. Some of these were made from templates provided by Jewish chaplains. They illustrate the importance of the holidays and friends and family to the morale of these men and women. This item relates to the South Pacific and the areas that were impacted by the Battle of Tinian. The National Museum of American Jewish Military History has 11 examples on its website (used ones), not including this one.


"This album illustrates some of the activities of the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews, which were set on foot in October 1933. These activities were financed in the main from contributions of American Jewry, the Central British Fund for German Jewry, the Council for German Jewry the Keren Hayesod.... JNF.


The services rendered by the Central Bureau to the immigrants were of a comprehensive character. They included the reception and care of the immigrants on landing, the provision of temporary housing accommodation and the creation of training facilities. Special attention was paid to the settlement of newcomers on the land. With this object in view existing agricultural settlements were enlarged and new ones established. Industrial development was assisted by long term credits. Furthermore, provision was made for cultural requirements and social services.

Special mention should be made of the youth immigration scheme under which some 1,600 youths have been placed in agricultural settlements and educational institutions.

The number of German-Jewish immigrants to Palestine totals about 40,000. The funds hitherto spent by the Central Bureau aggregate £P 450,000. The enclosed photographs are intended to illustrate the various activities undertaken by the Central Bureau for the Settlement of German Jews. Jerusalem, February, 1937."



Includes the opening prayer both in Hebrew and English J....."Thou who favourest man with knowledge, and teachest mortals understanding, mercifully bestow upon us the aid of Thy fatherly guidance in the work which lies before us on this and the coming days".] White slavery was a big problem for the Jewish community in the later part of the 19th Century and in the early part of the 20th century. Jewish traffickers would lure Jewish women from Eastern Europe under the guise of marrying them or promising them jobs in London or other major cities. The traffickers would often meet vulnerable women when they arrived at the ports. To counter this the Jewish Association for the Protection of Girls and Women was founded in 1885 by Constance Flower [Rothschild, Baroness Battersea] and Claude Montefiore. They sent agents to the docks to protect vulnerable women and girls from the traffickers and held several conferences in London which had the support of Chief Rabbis Adler and Hertz as this sermon demonstrates.
