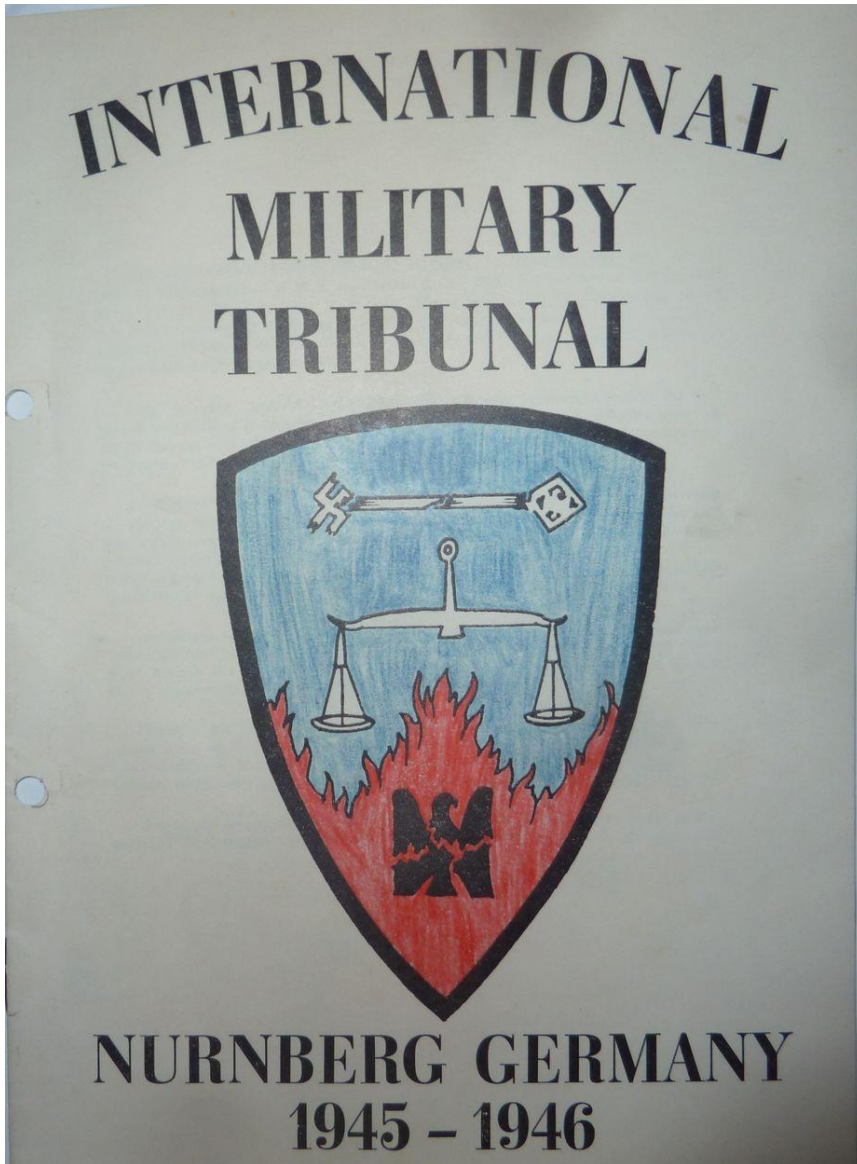

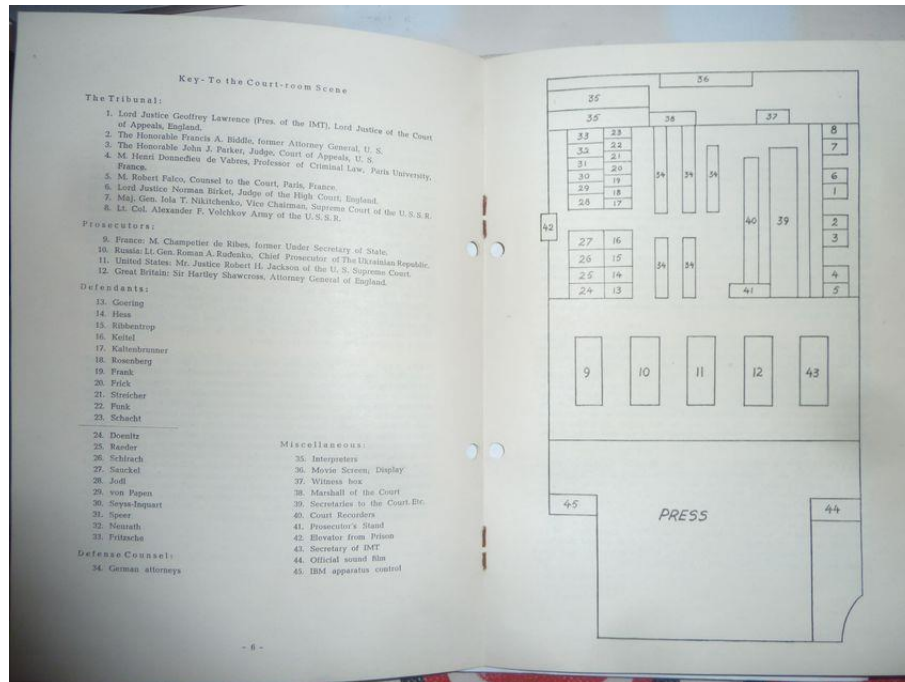

International Military Tribunal Nurnberg, Germany 1945-1946. Large folder with important collection of photographs from the trial, with mainly full page images of all the Defendants, (including Goering, Hess, Frank, Rosenberg, Doenitz, Jodl, Speer, etc.), Court scenes, Judges, Lawyers, Guards, Stenographers etc. etc. buildings and photographs taken of most of the condemned after their executions.

Most are clearly press photographs but this collection provides a remarkably full visual record of the proceedings, together with two original well executed pencil drawings of the interior of the cells, initialed P.K. and dated 1947, clearly drawn by someone who had viewed the cells during the trial.

Also contemporary documents showing seating plans and biographies of all the Defendants c.140 photographs, very few duplicates, most full page, almost all very nice condition. Plus 3 variants of an introductory overview of the Trial - includes indictments of the major criminals, a diagram of the court set up with where individuals were seated.

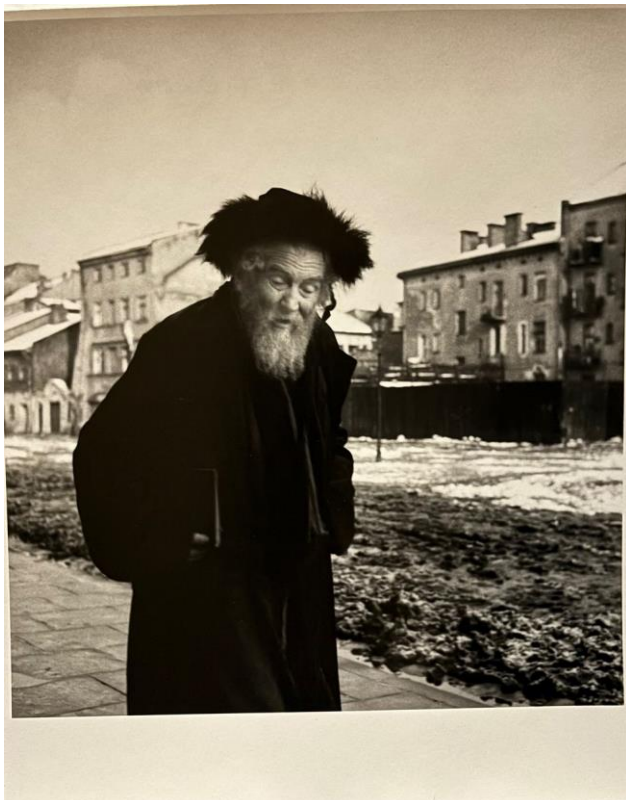
Roman Vishniac (1897-1900)

Vishniac was a photographer who was born in Russia, moved to Berlin, then Paris and eventually the USA (constantly moving because of anti-Semitism). He also had a scientific training and became a freelance photographer specializing in photomicroscopy. He is best known for his evocative photos of Eastern European Jewry in the leadup to the Holocaust.

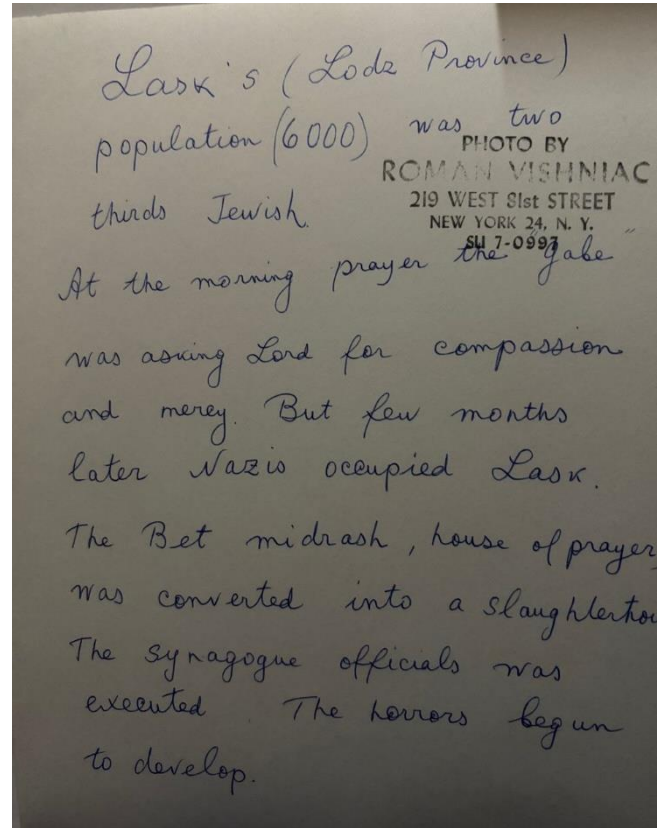
In 1935, as anti-Semitism was growing in Germany, Vishniac was commissioned by the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC) in Central Europe to photograph Jewish communities in Eastern Europe as part of a fund-raising drive to help support these poor communities. Vishniac developed and printed these pictures in his darkroom in his Berlin apartment. Further trips to Eastern Europe were undertaken between 1935 and 1938, again at the behest of the JDC.

These photographs were taken with a hidden camera both because photographers are often suspected of being spies and the reluctance of the subjects to be photographed. The results are hugely evocative images which have shaped our view of pre-war Jewry. Each one is approximately 25 x 20 cm. Priced individually.

Provenance: These silver prints, printed in 1973 or before, have the stamp of Vishniac's New York Studio on the reverse and some have his annotations. They were given as a gift to a film maker who made a film from still photographs for the Museum of the Diaspora

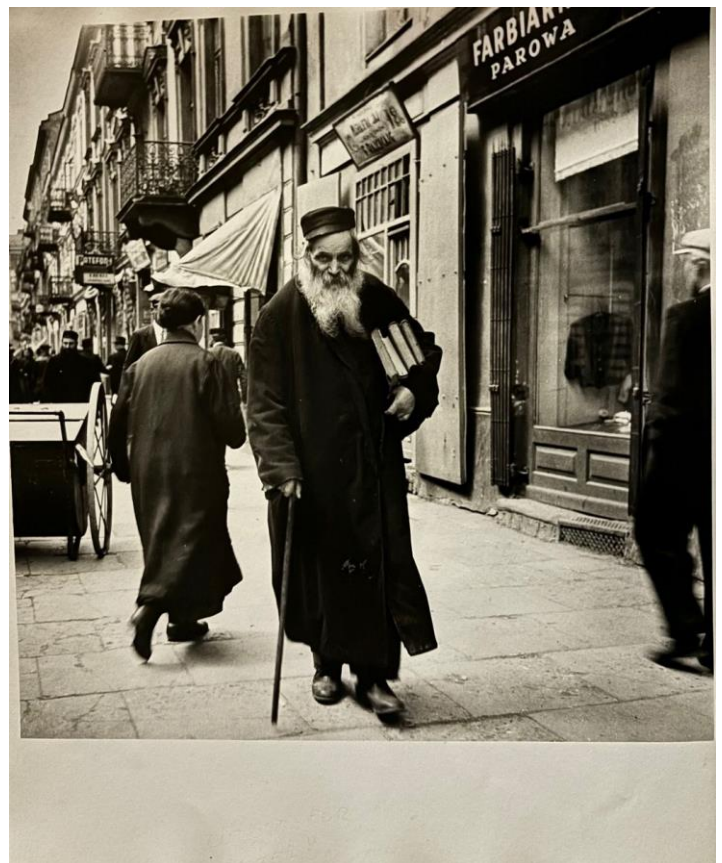

Original broadside 36cm h x 22cm w. Text in Hebrew and English. Issued in response to the opening of a 'Free School' by the London Society For the Promotion of Christianity Amongst the Jews. This was the first of the notices and is milder - it seems to have been issued before the school actually opened. Later on Rabbi Hirschell forbade parents, under threat of excommunication [Herem] from sending their children to the school. It contributed to the establishment of the 'The Jews Free School'.

"During 1807 the missionaries established their first free school for children of both sexes. Apart from teaching the children reading, writing and arithmetic, they also provided them with a hot meal each lunchtime and a complete set of clothing. It was hardly surprising that the school attracted over 150 children the first three months of its establishment" - H A Simons in Forty Years a Chief Rabbi. Some minor repairs, a little soiling. When you seek by material sacrifice to rescue the innocent victims of savagery, you give much more than the contents of your purse. You give a demonstration that invites the world to

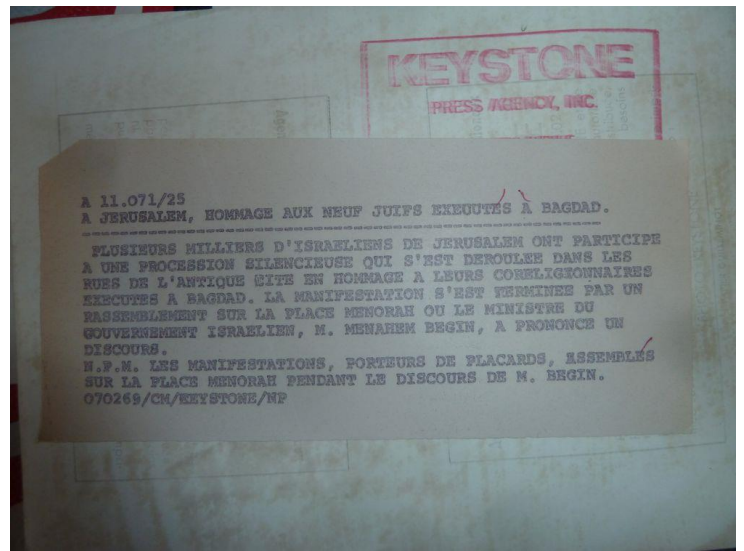

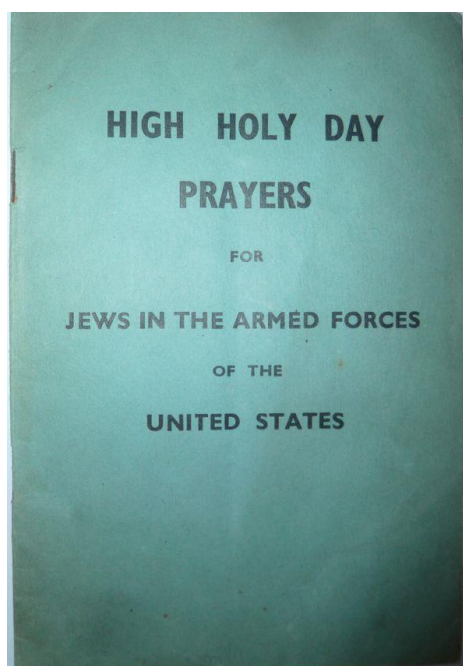

Limited edition of 550 copies: 400 copies printed on vellum and 150 copies on a specially milled parchment paper. This is number 204 and is printed on vellum. The facsimile is a faithful copy of the original manuscript and is bound in goatskin with sterling silver clasps, corners and bosses. The 109-page commentary volume is printed on Fabriano Ingres paper and bound in goatskin with top, bottom and fore-edge gilding. The presentation case containing both the facsimile and commentary volumes is covered in goatskin and lined in suede.

Traditionally, pious Jews seek to recite 100 blessings daily. This manuscript, named Me'ah Berachot means 'one hundred blessings', is a compendium of blessings, each allocated to a time of day or to a special event. It gathers together morning prayers, Grace after Meals, prayers on retiring at night (Qriat Sh'ema), petitions for the safety of travellers and many other texts to be recited on special occasions. Since it also includes three blessings specifically related to womanly duties (mitzvot nashim) – on bread making, ritual bathing and kindling the Sabbath lights – the book was probably commissioned as a special gift to a woman. Its horsemen gallop on steel horses, they surge across deserts of sand and and also mountains like walls... If we win the battle and achieve our goal, let us honour the horse and rider from the tribe of 5 MT" Aviram Paz No 4.

THEY DID NOT STAND ALONE

On December 2, 1942 at ten o'clock, five hundred thousand trade unionists in New York City stopped working. They rose from their machines and stood in silence for ten minutes.

They were Jewish trade unionists and their silence was a mass prayer for millions of their faith put to death by the order of Adolf Hitler for the crime of being a Jew.

They did not stand alone. Hundreds of thousands of Protestant and Catholic workers silently stood with them their heads bowed, their eyes misted. For millions of men and women throughout the democratic world, December 2, 1942 was a day of mourning.

Five thousand years ago on the tenth day of the seventh month of the Hebrew calendar, a live goat chosen by lot was brought before the high priest, who was robed in linen garments. He laid both his hands on the goat's head and confessed over it the iniquities of the children of Israel. Having thus become the symbolical repository of the sins of the people, the animal was taken out into the wilderness and released.

Today the people of Israel are the scapegoats of Adolf Hitler. But the high priest of hatred hasnot led them into the wilderness to be released but into the slaughter house. He has butchered men, women, and children without mercy.

"My Jews," Adolf Hitler once told a confidant, "are a valuable hostage given to me by the democracies. Anti-Semitic propaganda in all countries is an indispensable medium for the extension of our political campaign. You will see how little time we shall need in order to upset the ideas of the whole world, simply and purely by attacking Judaism."

In 1932 there were fewer than 600,000 Jews in Germany out of a population of 67,000,000. Their race had given to Germany Mendelschm the composer, Heine the poet, Ehrlich the life-giver, Einstein the physicist. But in the narrow, twisted brain of Adolf Hitler, who in his youth preferred to scab rather than form a union, there was only hate. He proscribed the music of Mendelschm, he burned the books of Heine, he profaned the memory of Ehrlich, and he drove Einstein into exile.

Today the Jews do not stand alone at the wailing wall. The Poles have been bled white, Czechs and Yugoslavs have been lined against pitted brick walls and shot down. Belgians and Greeks, Norwegians and Danes - and Germans, too - have been martyred on the hooked cross of the Third Reich. There is hardly a village on the continent of Western Europe where the sound of the firing squad hasnot been echoed by the sudden high-pitched rattle of death.

Are these the fake atrocity tales of the last war? Ask the State Department of the United States! Ask the Polish Government-in-Exile! Ask the white-faced men in a hundred cities who saw with their own disbelieving eyes the deed done!

Trade unionists have been martyred, too. Their crime was possession of the union card, their sin was a warm faith in the fellowship of labor.

Those extra ten minutes are a symbol of our cause. Let us be worthy of it."
