

Hastings, Edinburgh' Ex Officina Elzeviriana, Amsterdam, 1630,* Willems 325. Latin text. **£120**

Leifchild [son of John Leifchild - Independent Minister] on verso of free endpaper, additional handwritten note and catalogue clipping underneath the bookplate, Ex Officina Elzeviriana, Amsterdam, 1671. * Willems 1438. Willems states that 'this is the best edition'. Latin text. £175

Editio Postrema*. 531 + (x) pp, engraved title relaid with small tear but no loss, marginal tear on page 25/6 with slight loss, 24mo, 2.5 x 4.75 inches or 6.5 x 12cms, bound in original full calf, neatly and expertly re-spined (early re-spining), raised bands, gilt lettered, good condition, Provenance: with the armorial bookplate of T. Rice, Mount Trenchard with word 'Fedelta' [Thomas Spring Rice, 1st Baron Monteagle of Brandon - 8 February 1790 – 7 February 1866), Danielem Elzevirium, Amsterdam, 1676. * apart from the

minor defects a good copy: the last Elzevier Edition. Buchanan was long regarded as the best Latin poet of his age. £120

Cum Notis Isaaci Vossii.* (xii) + 330pp + (38) index, engraved title with portion cut from margin of title page with no loss, 12mo, 5.25 x 3 inches or 13.5 x 7.5cms, some minor extinct marginal worm but with no loss and not unsightly, bound in contemporary vellum, vellum rather discoloured o/w good, Provenance: previous owner's name 'Koehler', Louis & Daniel Elzevier, Amsterdam, 1656. *Willems 1203. Latin text. £200

CLASSICS/290. PLAUTUS, Titus Maccius. *Comoediae Superstites XX. Accuratissime Editae.* 715 + (5)pp including engraved title, 12mo, 3 x 5 inches or 12 x 7cms, bound in contemporary vellum, manuscript title on spine, spine slightly soiled, Provenance: with previous owner's name on blank endpaper: 'C. A. Wheelwright, Tansor [Northampton]', Typis Ludovici Elzevirii, Amsterdam, 1652. * Willems 1152n: this edition is printed without the ornament on P.3 - the assumption being that in spite of the imprint, it is almost certainly a pirated edition. Latin text. **£110**





R. Bamby, good condition, Ex Officina Elzeviriana, Amsterdam, 1658. * Willems 1237. Latin text. £110

Gislenii Busbequii Omnia Quae Extant Cum Privilegio.* 575pp + index, engraved title, 24mo, 2.5 x 4.5 inches or 6 x 11.5cms, expertly and finely re-bound by Stephen Conway in new old-style calf with blind-stamping to boards, spine, raised bands, title label inset on black morocco, gilt lettering, new endpapers, all edges red, very good condition, Elzeviriana, Leiden, 1633. * the re-binding by Stephen Conway, has made this a very sound appealing volume. Willems 380. The first Elzevir edition with the running title 'Epistolae'. According to Willems, the best edition. Latin text. £250

CLASSICS/298. CHARRON, Pierre. *De La Sagesse, Trois Livres Par Pierre Charron.* (xxiv) + 1-264, 295-366, 377-621+ (12) + (3 lvs. blank) pp, fine engraved title, 12mo, 3.5 x 5.5 inches or 8.5 x 14cms, bound in contemporary vellum, vellum a bit marked but a good tight binding with slight damage to bottom corner of front board, title in ms on spine, Provenance: with the bookplates of Robert J Hayhurst and Col. George Callander of Craigforth, no date of publication given but precumably1659 because of dedication by Jean Elzevier 'a messieurs du conseil de la cour provinciale d'Hollande', Jean Elsevier, Leiden, 1659. * Willems 843 - not the best but most sought after. French text. George Callander, a Scottish antiquary, an authority on Milton and highly regarded. £550


