Album of thirteen engravings on nine plates. The first plate is a portrait of the goldsmith holding a sheet with an ornamental design; beside him a draped table with the tools of his trade and a glass vase from which emerges a display of 'engraved ornament' acanthus flowers. Engraved by Louis Cossin after a painting by Pierre Rabon. Inscribed in the lower right corner 'Louis Roupert M.tre orfevre A Metz : P. Rabon pinxit : Ludouicus Cossinus sculp : 1668'. The second sheet has three engravings; one an engraved address by Roupert to his friend the harpsichord (Monsieur Clavier mon amy) concerning his work (Symphonie) to rebut any possible accusations of copying Sadler, Israel, or Callot and inviting the reader to make a fine salad of his leafes (de trouver bon une salad de mes feuilles). Seemingly quite rare, Guilmard records a suite of six, plus the portrait in the 'Bilbiotheque de Paris'; seven in the Bérard and nine in the Fould collections and seven in Berlin. On one suite he records a one-line inscription but makes no note of the charming and curious address to Monsieur Clavier. Literature:
