

8vo (226 × 139 mm), pp. [8], 173, [1]; some offsetting and spotting; contemporary red morocco elaborately tooled gilt, marbled endpapers, all edges gilt; rubbed, sometime neatly rebacked and recornered, preserving the original spine; ink ownership stamp of Fritz Fasting (1911–1979).

Printed on large paper and inscribed 'For M^{rs} Rudd' on the front flyleaf. According to Maslen & Lancaster, only 100 copies were printed on royal paper (as opposed to 2000 on demy).

Sole edition, privately printed: eleven poems written in celebration of the marriage of the young Amsterdam merchant Herman Ameshoff (1715–1768) and Alberta Hoogenbergh (1719–1803) in February 1735.

The paper used for the wrappers here, whilst sometimes known as 'Dutch gilt' paper in English, is German. The design of this particular brocade paper, and the date, suggests perhaps a maker such as Georg Christoph Stoy (1670–1750) of Augsburg, 'probably the most important and versatile decorated-paper dealer in Germany, if not Europe ... His firm's brocade papers are frequently of high, if not the highest quality' (Haemmerle, p. 129, my translation).



Printed at Cesena, in Emilia-Romagna: the form of service for taking the habit in the Carnaldolese monastic order.

The block-printed paper used in the binding was made by the noted Bolognese manufacturer, Carlo Bertinazzi (1731–1801). References to this particular design in the literature (Milano & Villani, *Le carte decorate della Raccolta Bertarelli*, p. 46; Kopylov, *Papiers dominotés italiens*, p. 363,



two versions) show it printed in only one colour, but here Bertinazzi has used three different colours. A special paper for a special book.


Sole editions: two occasional pieces (the first apparently set to music, the second as performance poetry), printed in Schwäbisch Hall, to mark the marriage of Heinrich XLII (1752–1818), Fürst Reuß zu Schleiz und Gera as he later became, and Caroline Henriette of Hohenlohe-Kirchberg (1761–1849). Unusually, the House of Reuss, which ruled over a tiny principality in Thuringia, practised a unique system of naming and numbering the male members of the family. All were called Heinrich, and each was given a number, regardless as to whether they were the ruling head of the house at the time.

Neither piece listed in VD18 (which lists a related item, printed for when the couple made a formal visit to Schleiz a week later) or WorldCat.

Interestingly, the block-printed papers used for both wrappers here are Italian rather than German. For similar designs, see Quilici, *Carte decorate nella legatorial del '700*, nos. 24–5.

First edition: a rare anthology of verse—epigram, sonnet, ode, anacreontic, *madrigale*, elegy—written in celebration of the wedding of the young Vittorio Emanuele of Savoy (1759–1824), King of Sardinia as he became (r.1802–21), to the even younger Maria Theresa of Austria-Este (1773–1832). Contributions include poems, by *inter alia* Leonardo Miniscalchi, Teodoro Bergera, Giambatista Vasco, and Giuseppe Antonio Cauda of Turin's university library, in Italian, Latin, and Greek.

The almost *trompe l'œil* block-printed paper used for the covers here looks surprisingly modern, but is strictly contemporary. Cf. Kopylov, *Papiers dominotés italiens*, nos. 62 and 156.

Not found in WorldCat. ICCU locates 5 copies, three of them on Sardinia (Cagliari, Alghero, Sassari, Cherasco, Turin).





Sole edition, apparently unrecorded, this being the dedication copy, printed on silk. A handwritten note, pasted to the inside front cover, reads: 'Dieses Buch gehört Sophie Wilhelmine Gräfin von Schönburg Rochsburg gebohrne Prinzesse zu Carolath Schönaich. Rochsburg den 5. September 1793.' Loosely inserted are also three hand-cut silhouettes.



Sophie Wilhelmine (1764–1795) was the daughter of Prussian general Johann Carl Friedrich zu Carolath-Beuthen (1716–1791), a prince in the House of Schoenaich-Carolath in what is now southern Poland. In November 1792, she married Heinrich Ernst von Schönburg-Rochsburg (1760–1825), an aristocrat with a keen interest in agriculture, well known for his flock of merino sheep. The present poem was written and presented to the young princess the year after her marriage by her new subjects in Rochsburg (about 20 miles northwest of Chemnitz) following her ceremonial arrival there in March 1793. Sadly, Sophie Wilhelmine was die a few years later of pneumonia after contracting measles, and was buried at the Schloss in Rochsburg. She was only 30.

Sole edition, extremely rare, printed at Acqui Terme in Piedmont: a collection of verse to celebrate the recent victory of the combined Habsburg and Imperial Russian forces over Napoleon's Army of Italy during the War of the Second Coalition. It is dedicated to the Austrian general Alexander Friedrich von Seckendorff (1743–1814).

The type of brocade paper used for the covers here probably dates from earlier in the century (or possibly an older block is being reused) and is known as *drap d'or*, whereby the paper is carefully stencilled in a variety of colours before embossing, after which some of the colours are finished by hand. Look closely and one can make out huntsmen, dogs, and their quarry (boar, stag) in amongst the swirling tendrils. The paper is illustrated in Schönborn & Rothe (no. 49), but the maker unidentified.

First (and only?) edition, extremely rare, published to benefit the poor and needy. Grand Duchess Elena Pavlovna of Russia (1784–1803), daughter of the Tsar, died suddenly, probably from pneumonia, aged just 18 years old. She was married to Friedrich Ludwig zu Mecklenburg and is buried in the specially built Helenen-Paulownen-Mausoleum at Ludwigslust (hence the imprint here), site of the Mecklenburg residential palace about 25 miles south of Schwerin.

The composer, Friedrich Heine (1764–1821), played as a flautist in the Mecklenburg-Schwerin court chapel from 1788, later becoming registrar (1809) and secretary (1815) of the local archives. 'He composed symphonies, an overture, concertos, flute duets, a sonata for clarinet or violin and piano, and church music, but he was considered to be at his best as a composer of songs' (*New Grove*). 'In the young Helena Pawlowna, Heine found a patron for his music' (MGG, my translation).



Very rare: a poem written in celebration of the birth of Karl Alexander (1818–1901), the only surviving son of Maria Pavlovna of Russia (1785–

1859; daughter of Tsar Paul I) and Karl Friedrich, Grand Duke of Saxe-Weimar-Eisenach (1783–1853). Maria, to whom the anonymous poem, presented by the aldermen and citizens of Weimar, is addressed, was a noted patron of the arts, a favourite of Schiller and Goethe who appointed Liszt as kapellmeister to her glittering court.

Cat. Russica I-281. KVK locates 4 copies: Goethe-Haus, Frankfurt (printed on paper); Anna-Amalia-Bibliothek, Weimar (two copies: one belonging to Goethe (on paper), plus another, on silk (but stitched, without silk-covered boards as here)); and Jena. Library Hub Discover and WorldCat add no others.

First edition, celebrating the centenary of the United States. One of 20 numbered copies of the 'édition de luxe' (spine) printed on *papier de Hollande*. Remarkably, this copy, no. 6, is still in its original vibrant orange wrappers.
