

CHINA - BOOKS

1. BRYSON, Mary Isabella - Child Life in Chinese Homes

London: The Religious Tract Society, 1885

First edition. Octavo, pp 208, with woodcut engraved illustrations. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards, gilt and black decorated boards and spine. Bryson worked at the London Mission in Wuchang, China and had been in China for nine years at the time of writing this book. She provides a vivid account of the China she found and lived among for readers back in the UK. Clean and unmarked internally, upper board is bright and clean, lower board is marked and mottled. Overall in Very Good condition. Surprisingly rare. [B7138] £250



2. HOSIE, Alexander - Three Years in Western China; a narrative of three journeys in Ssu-Ch'uan, Kuei-Chow and Yun-nan




First edition. Octavo, pp xxxiv, [2], 302 + 4 pages of publisher's adverts at rear, large folding map of South Western China tipped in at rear as called for, frontispiece plus seven further plate illustrations. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards, lettered in silver-block and with orange decoration of hills in Chinese style. Decorative end-papers in same style as the boards. Sir Alexander Hosie (1853-1925) worked in the Consular Service in China, including as Consul on Pagoda Island near Fuzhou, and was a noted plant collector in western China, Tibet and Taiwan. This book is his account of extensive travels in the west in 1882-1884. Small ex-libris stamp to the top of the title page. Overall the book is in Very Good Plus condition, small tape stain from old repair to edge of the folding map, plate facing page 8 is pulling. An uncommon book, this copy in lovely condition. 3. COLQUHOUN, Archibald R. - The "Overland" to China

London & New York: Harper & Brothers, 1900

Second edition of book originally published earlier the same year. Octavo, pp xi, [1], 464; frontispiece portrait of the author, plates, in text illustrations and four colour folding maps. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards, gilt decoration and lettering to the upper board and spine. Contemporary gift inscription to the front paste-down dated August 1900. Archibald Colquhoun (1848-1914) was a British explorer and the first Administrator of Southern Rhodesia, as well as Deputy Commissioner of Burma. In the 1880s he took part in several exploratory expeditions to Burma, Indo-China and southern China, for which he was awarded the 1884 Founder's Medal of the Royal Geographical Society. In this book, the author recounts his journey in 1898-99 on the newly completed Trans-Siberian Railway to the terminal station at Lake Baikal and thence via the Gobi Desert to Peking. Colquhoun was also for some time a correspondent for *The Times* in Tongking, and here he adopts a journalistic approach to study on the spot the political and financial changes in China in the turbulent period immediately preceding the Boxer Rebellion. 4. BIRCH, John Grant - Travels in North and Central China



First edition, first impression. Large octavo, pp xvi, 379 + 4 pages publisher's adverts at rear. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards, gilt lettering to the spine and with lettering in red and a large gilt Chinese dragon decoration to the upper board. Illustrated with a portrait of the author to the frontispiece and with 56 further illustrations from photographs. Birch travelled extensively in northern and central China in 1899 to 1900 including from Peking to Mukden, on the Yangtze River to Ichang and We-Shan, and onto Chengdu and Chungking. Based on his diaries he recounts his travels in most readable style in this book. Near Fine condition, spine a little dust dulled and browning to the verso of the end-papers only. A pretty copy. 5. **KENT, Percy Horace - The Passing of the Manchus**

London: Edward Arnold, 1912

First edition. Octavo, pp xi, 404 + 8 pages publisher's adverts at rear. With three maps, one being a large folding map of China tipped in at the rear, and 23 plate illustrations from photographs. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards with gilt lettering to the spine and four Chinese characters in black to the upper board. An extensive and contemporary report of the 1911 Revolution and the fall of the Manchu led Qing Dynasty. Percy Kent (1876-1963) arrived in China in 1901 where he accepted a partnership at a law firm in Tientsin. He was the only British lawyer practicing in the Consular Courts, over a near 40 year period from the immediate aftermath of the Boxer Rebellion until the occupation of Tientsin by the Japanese in the late 1930's. The large map has a repaired tear but only affecting the blank border and not the printed area of the map. Book is solid but a little rubbed and the endpapers are marked and have bookplates; book grades Good Plus. [B7139] £200



6. MORSE, Hosea Ballou - The Trade and Administration of the Chinese Empire

London: Longmans, Green & Co., 1908

First edition. Octavo, pp xi, [4], 451. With two folding maps and other illustrations. Bound in blue cloth covered hard boards, gilt to spine and upper board. Morse working under Sir Robert Hart at the Imperial Chinese Maritime Customs from 1874 to 1908, retiring after to England where he began a second career as a scholarly writer on China and China Trade. This was his first book, published in his year of retirement. The book is in Very Good Plus condition, with a little dust dulling to the spine, [B7155] £300

7. KOJIMA, Sagimaru - View and Custom of North China


Tientsin: Yamamoto Photographic Studio, 1909

First edition. Printed by the Tokyo Printing Company, Tokyo. Oblong quarto, bound in cloth covered hard boards, de-bossed front cover decoration with gilt lettering within. Contains 100 pages, printed recto only of views and life (or custom) of North China printed from photographs, many pages containing multiple images. Each image captioned in Japanese and English. The book begins in Tientsin with an image of the Pei Ho River followed by the German Monument of the Boxer Rebellion and then a large image of the German concession in Tientsin with the Consulate General and German Club, the Astor House Hotel, activity on the French concession of the Bund, numerous images of Chinese people carrying out day-to-day activities, thence to Peking where we see a Manchurian lady smoking opium (unusual subject), many images of the Legation Quarter, as well as the city gates and temples. Towards the end of the book, the photographer travels outside Peking to the Ming tombs and Great Wall. Internally the book is in excellent condition, save that the endpapers are heavily creased, boards and exterior also clean and unmarked, overall this book grades Near Fine. A very good record, particularly of Tientsin, with reproductions of extremely high quality photo images. [B7124] £1,600

Sagimaru Kojima (1855-1943) travelled from Japan to Peking after the Boxer Rebellion in 1901 to document the city. He subsequently established the Yamamoto Photographic Studio in Tientsin, producing photographs, postcards and other souvenirs for tourists. This book was one of his major undertakings. The first edition was issued in 1909, and the book was reprinted in 1910 and again in 1911.





10. CROW, Carl - Handbook for China

Shanghai: Carl Crow Inc., 1921

Third Edition, Revised. Important and popular guidebook to China first issued in 1913. Green leatherette boards with gilt lettering, all edges stained orange. 12mo, pp v, 314 pp, 10pp of index and 45pp adverts. Six folding maps as called for, including of Peking, Shanghai and Hong Kong. Carl Crow was an American advertising executive and long time resident of Shanghai; he is the man credited with bringing western advertising concepts and ideas to China; as an author he is best remembered for his book 400 Million Customers. The guidebook is in Very Good condition, binding tight, all maps present. [B7324] £225



Bound in orange cloth covered hard boards with black lettering and a black and gilt decoration of the Temple of Heaven to the upper board; in the original dust jacket. With six folding maps and 24 half-tone plates by A.J. Walker. Index and appendices to rear. An excellent and comprehensive guide to Peking by long-time resident Juliet Bredon who was the niece of Sir Robert Hart. The book is in Very good condition, binding tight and square, old water-staining affecting lower half of the rear board and the rear end papers, small stain at bottom of upper board, occasional foxing within. Jacket also in Very Good condition, tanned and with a couple of small stains at the bottom of the front panel. [B7137] £250


Shanghai: Kelly and Walsh, 1922

China edition of book originally published in London by Hurst & Blackett in 1906. Octavo, pp vii, 447. Bound in publisher's biscuit coloured cloth covered hard boards, black lettering to spine and upper board. Simpson's father worked in the Chinese Maritime Customs and his brother was a Mining Engineer in China. Simpson was in China during the Boxer Rebellion and worked with the Chinese Maritime Customs himself until 1901, subsequently writing full time and he was Daily Telegraph correspondent in Peking 1911-1914. He published most of his books about China under the pseudonym Putnam Weale. A first hand account of Peking during the Boxer Rebellion. Bookplate of Henry Courtney Brocklehurst (1888-1942), soldier and explorer who visited the Antarctic in 1912 and among other things shot a panda bear and gifted it to West Park Museum. Book is in Near Fine condition, a little light spotting to the end papers only. [B7289] £90







Third Edition (originally published in 1920). Folio, 29cm x 38.5cm. Hard boards covered in black silk with leather spine and corners all covered in Gold Leaf and lettering and decoration in gilt to front board. This alternative Black & Gold binding is much rarer than the standard Blue Silk covering; in our experience around 1 in 10 copies have the variant binding. Forty page introduction by Putnam Weale followed by the 66 photogravures tipped into the recto of each page with detailed caption opposite. Printed and bound by Kelly & Walsh in Shanghai. In Very Good Condition. Black silk on the front cover is bright, but with some dust dulling towards the top, gilt decoration also bright and fresh. The silk on the rear cover is also a little dust dulled. Gold leaf is a bit rubbed to the spine from general aging and wear. Internally the front endpaper has four circular areas where the paper has thinned, possibly something was originally fixed there and then removed. The binding is pulling at the title page, beginning to split and exposing the webbing, but overall binding remains solid. A most sumptuous book. [B7160] £1,500








16. SOWERBY, Arthur de Carle - The Naturalist in Manchuria, Volumes I, II & III

Tientsin: Tientsin Press, 1922 & 1923

Three volumes in two (volumes II & III are bound together as issued). Quartos, pp xiv, 347 & xxvii, 191, xx, 358. Bound in green cloth covered hard boards, lettering and decoration in black. Illustrated with a tipped in colour plate at the frontispiece of Volume I, and with monochrome plates from photographs throughout, folding map at the rear of each book. Ex-libris Stanley Wyatt-Smith with his decorative bookplate to the paste-down. Wyatt-Smith (1887-1958) worked for the Consular Service in China from 1907 and was Vice-Consul or Consul in various Chinese cities in the 1920's and 1930's including Weihaiwei, Shanghai, Changsha and Shantou. Also with a gift inscription in near juvenile hand to both volumes to Wyatt –Smith: "Daddy from Mummy and Joan, April 3rd 1925". Joan was his daughter with his first wife Clara Mabel Smyth. These are a comprehensive work on Manchuria, Volume I focuses on Travel and Exploration, Volume II on Mammals and Volume III on Birds. Sowerby later published two further volumes of the Naturalist in Manchuria, on Cold-Blooded Vertibrates, Invertibrates and Flora; these were issued in 1930 and are not present here. The work is based on four expeditions he made to Manchuria in 1913-1915. Sowerby published several other books on the flora and fauna of China, including from significant expeditions in the west of the country and later founded and published the China Journal of Science and Arts in Shanghai together with John Ferguson. This was first issued in January 1923. Overall in Very Good condition, binding tender at the front of the second volume, boards just a little rubbed and spines creased, a few stains and marks. 



Errata slip tipped into the contents page. Ex-libris Stanley Wyatt-Smith with his decorative bookplate to the paste-down. Wyatt-Smith (1887-1958) worked for the Consular Service in China from 1907

and was Vice-Consul or Consul in various Chinese cities in the 1920's and 1930's including Weihaiwei, Shanghai, Changsha and Shantou. Sowerby wrote this book for the more general reader rather than professional biologist, and he describes his journeys through China in search of a wide range of animals, including mammals, reptiles, birds, fish and insects. A little wear to the covers, clean and unmarked inside, overall in Very Good Plus condition. Handsome copy of an uncommon book. [B7328] £180

19. GILES, H.A. - The Travels of Fa-hsien (399-414 A.D.), or Record of the Buddhistic Kingdoms [佛國記]

Cambridge: at the University Press, 1923 First edition. 12mo, pp xvi, 96. Bound in paper covered hard boards over cloth spine, paper title piece pasted to spine and a second title piece pasted to the front end-paper. Illustrated with one plate facing the title page and a map of Fa-hsien's travels to the rear end-papers. Signature in pencil to the ffep of Lionel Giles, son of Herbert Giles. Lionel was a sinologist, writer and philosopher, assistant curator at the British Museum and translator of *The Art of* War. This is a re-translation by Herbert Giles of Fahsien's travels from China across the Gobi Desert and over the Hindu Kush and down through India in the 5th century and his return to China bearing Buddhist scripts and images of Buddha. The text was previously translated into English in the 19th century by Rev. S. Beal and also James Legge. Internally clean and bright, binding is tight, boards rubbed mainly at edges, overall in Very Good condition. [B7292] £100






Mary Leslie, born Mary Martin in Yorkshire in 1879, worked as a midwife in Oxford where she met an Australian Rhodes scholar, Norman Leslie, who took a job with the Asiatic Petroleum Company in China upon graduation. Mary followed him to China and they made their life there. This and much more of Mary's life and family is in her autobiography, "Through Changing Scenes", which was published in 1972. 




There are no publication details, but this appears to be a later, possibly 1970's, reprint of the 1928 Third Edition of Green's Shanghai of Today. Possibly published in China. Quarto. Bound in paper covered hard boards over a brown leather effect spine with an image of the Administration Building of Shanghai Municipal Council pasted on the front cover. The book has the same design endpapers, list of contents and introduction as the original and the fifty pages of images are included as plates from photographs (rather than the photogravure plates in the original), each with the caption below the image. With a gift inscription to "Tee Wee Jock an' Doris" from Arnold Graham, dated 1978 to the end paper. All in just about Fine condition. [B7317] £200


Arnold Graham (1905-1996) arrived in Shanghai from England in 1928 and worked for the Shanghai Gas Company there before relocating to Hong Kong in the late 1940's where he continued working for Hong Kong & China Gas. He later retired to New Zealand.


First (and only) edition. Elephant folio, 33cm x 40cm. pp 155 with seventy-one tipped in photogravure plates (frontispiece plus 70 plates) of which eleven are in full colour. Facing each image is a full page text description. The book is bound in blue silk, highly decorated in woven silk to the upper board with detailed border and an image of the Temple of Heaven at the centre. Herbert Clarence White, credits himself in this book as Art Director, Sign of the Times Publishing House, Shanghai. Together with his twin brother, J. Henry White, he published this book as well as Romantic China (Pub: Browhite Arts, Shanghai 1930). The brothers lived in China for eight years from 1922, though their time was primarily dedicated to their missionary activities for the Seventh Day Adventist Church. The reference to 'Northern Capital' in the book's sub-title reflects the shift of the seat of Government to Nanking in 1927 (it returned to

Beijing in 1937). Originally issued in a protective box which is lacking here as usual, the woven silk is in near fine condition, though the blue has faded over time and there are a few discrete marks on the front cover. Internally the book is in Fine condition, unmarked and with no spotting or browning. Externally Very Good. [Parr & Lundgren, The Chinese Photobook, p44-7] [B7110] £4,000

25. KING, Paul - In the Chinese Customs Service, a personal record of forty-seven years by Paul King, sometime Commissioner of Customs in China



Revised edition, 1930, of book originally published in 1924. Octavo, pp 304. Bound in red cloth covered hard board, blind stamped ruled lines, device and lettering to the upper board, and gilt lettering to the spine. Frontispiece portrait of the author and with three further illustrations. Paul Henry King (1854-1938) served in the Chinese Maritime Customs Service from 1874 until his retirement in 1921. He was part of a British family with strong ties to China, his father having fought with General Charles Gordon during the Taiping Rebellion, his wife, the novelist Veronica King, was born in China, the daughter of Missionaries and two of their also worked for the consular and customs service in China. King's lengthy service allowed him a significant and deep understanding of the workings of Chinese government and society at a senior level and he maintained a strong and respectful relationship with the Chinese statesman Li Hongzhang. In this book, written shortly after King's retirement, he recounts his many years and fascinating

working life in China. The book is in VG+ to Near Fine condition, binding tight, clean internally, spine cloth and lettering a bit dulled. A most scarce book. [B7134] £380

26. WALTER, Wilhelm P.O. - China of Today. A Souvenir of China with One Hundred and twelve Illustrations



Bound in orange patterned paper covered hardboards with black title to the upper board and in the original dust jacket which has an art-deco style illustration of a temple and pagoda. Bookplate of George and Olga Crow to the ffep and also inscribed to the same page: "Olga Crow, Shanghai August 1940". George Crow was writer and marketing executive Carl Crow's nephew. The photographs show a range of buildings, people and life across China. Book is in Very Good Minus condition, 1cm chip from spine, light browning to endpapers, otherwise clean internally. The jacket is complete on the all important art deco designed front panel, but half the spine is missing and the top edge has been trimmed by 3mm, grades Good Minus. This is a scarce 1930's photo book, beautifully produced and much enhanced by the rare dust jacket. [B7283] £750

First edition. Quarto, 4, xviii, 244 pp. Original quarter calf over green cloth boards. Gilt lettering to upper board and spine. With seven full-page maps and 104 photographic illustrations, mostly full page and many of lighthouses on the China coast. Thomas Roger Banister (1890-1955) joined the Chinese Maritime Customs service after graduating from Cambridge in 1913, retiring with the rank of Commissioner in 1946. 




