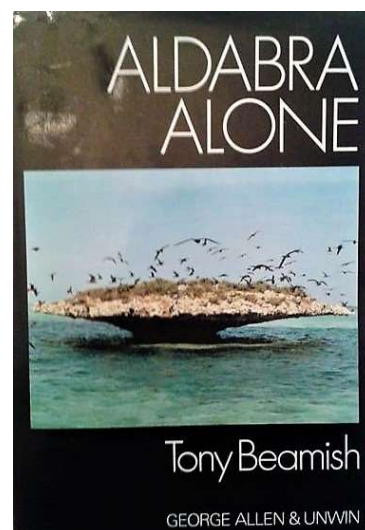
Fanny Barkly was the daughter in law of Sir Henry Barkly who had been Governor of Mauritius. Her husband had been his father's private secretary in Mauritius, and was later appointed to two terms as Chief Commissioner in the Seychelles. Due to failing health he was appointed Governor of Heligoland, the minute island off the coast of Germany, for two years. At the end of his term of office he returned home and died in 1890.

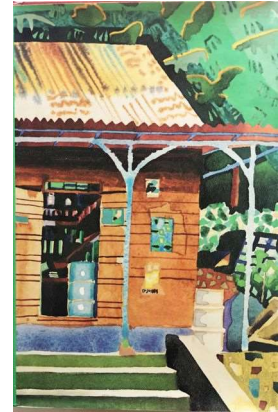
Aldabra, in the Indian Ocean, is the second largest and most remarkable Coral Atoll in the Indian Ocean. It boasts a population of 100,000 Giant Tortoises, far outnumbering the 3,000 surviving on the Galapagos Islands, their only other refuge. This is the only book to deal with Aldabra, and of the huge campaign, led by the Royal Society and the American Academy of Sciences to conserve, and preserve the remarkable habitat of the extraordinary wild life population.

There is so very little literature on the Seychelles that this eccentric and rare work must be considered one of its Incunables. Henry Watley Estridge was appointed a Collector of Taxes and Manager of the Savings Bank. He describes charmingly, the islands and their inhabitants, productions, and vegetation. His six years in the islands were a naturalists delight, and like so many amateur botanists of his era, corresponded with Sir Joseph Hooker, and occasionally sent specimens off to Kew. He was memorialised by Marianne North in her Recollections, and



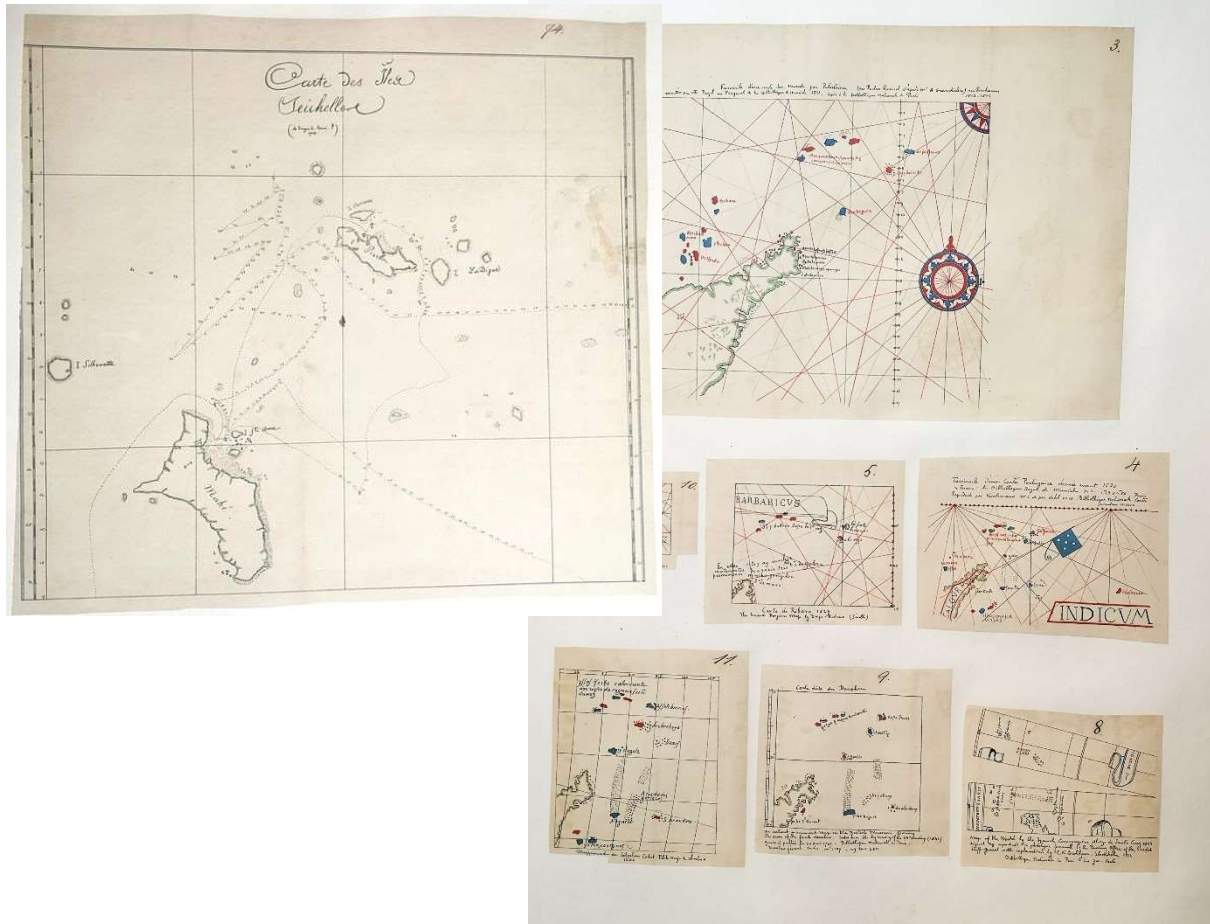
who stayed with him and his wife and painted the wonderful view from his house framed with an Hibiscus liliflorus, that now hangs at Kew. This work is dedicated to Sir A.E. Havelock who, in 1874 became Chief Commissioner in the Seychelles and was Estridge's superior.

FIRST HISTORY OF MAURITIUS

17. This is the first History of Mauritius and a cornerstone of Indian Ocean Literature. It was a book compiled by Charles Grant, Viscount de Vaux, in 1801. It was primarily based on the papers and memoirs of his father, Baron Grant, who lived on the island for twenty years.

Grant left Mauritius for good in 1758 after the death of his wife. The manuscript is in the form of an open letter to "Chere Societé ..." and to good friends who live tranquilly in Mauritius. Born in Calvados, Grant went to seek his fortune in Mauritius after the bankruptcy of his father. There he joined his uncle, who gave him part of his estate in the Plaines Wilhelms. He was married in 1746 to a Creole from Reunion who bore a son in 1749. This son, with the help of his father's manuscripts put together the well known History of Mauritius published in 1801.

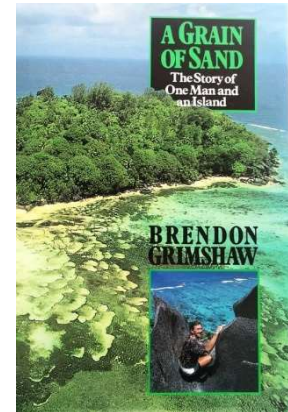

Not surprisingly, he was immediately impressed by the lush natural environment. "When we finally reached Sans Souci," he was to write later, "the peace and beauty of the spot soothed my sorrow over my exile, and calmed my anxieties. If I had stayed at Sans Souci under other circumstances, I could have been happy. It is a place

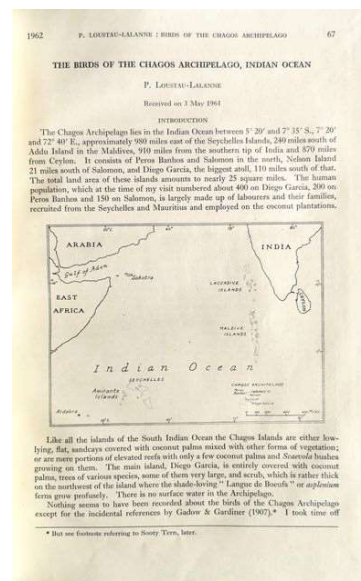


where one can meditate in tranquility and find a sanctuary away from the troubles of the outer world."

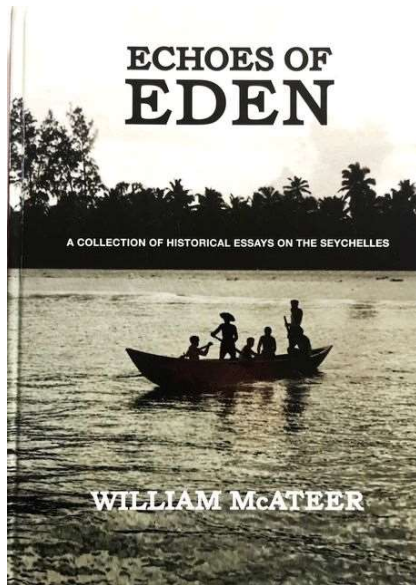

On the island of Valle de Mai, Gordon believed that he found the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the form of a Coco de Mer palm tree whose fruit bore a close resemblance to a woman's body. The house was later demolished.

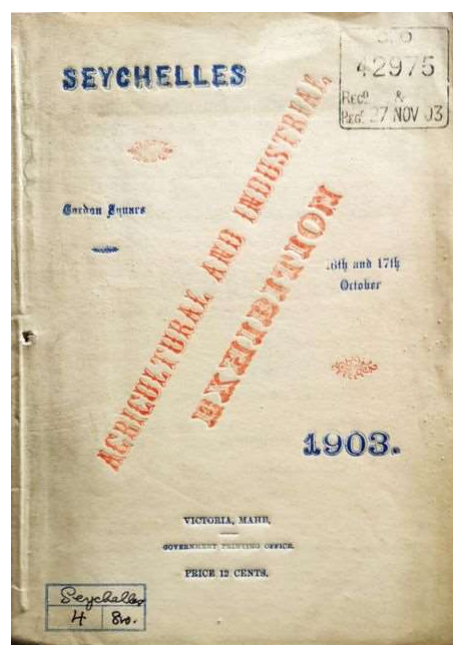

This rare image of the Bay showing the Capital Port Victoria in November 1861 is before much of it was destroyed in the great avalanche of November 1862.

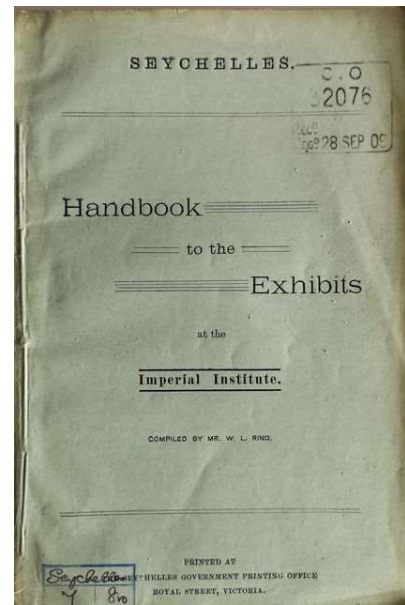
The Seychelles in 1861 were in the middle of a labour crisis. This was alleviated with the arrival on May 14th of a steam sloop of war H.M.S Lyra bringing slaves rescued from Arab Dhows in the Mozambique Channel. Slavery had been abolished in the United Kingdom in 1807 but in the Seychelles it was a slow process and was not finally outlawed until 1835. The labour for Coconut Farming, Sugar and other crops, was by a moitié system, whereby the squatters or former slaves worked 3 days for the proprietors of the plantations and then 3 days for themselves. To make up for loss of manpower, Indentured labour had been sanctioned from India, but payment for transport was not forthcoming. Because of the convenience of the Seychelles for the Arab Slave routes, it became a rule to land any slave taken below the Equator in Mahé. This new arrangement revived the colony and the flagging agricultural industry. See Deryck Scarr The Seychelles since 1770 - Hurst 2000. He is listed as Ship's Paymaster in H.C. Devereaux's work Cruise of the Gorgon or Eighteen months H M.S. Gorgon, engaged in the suppression of the slave trade on the east coast of Africa : including a trip up the Zambesi with Dr. Livingstone, London 1869. The Gorgon was a wooden paddle sloop with 6 guns.

Beaver played a distinguished part in the capture of Mauritius in November 1810, going on to the capture the Seychelles. Going onwards to Madras Smyth notes "He took the degree and a half channel, which though scarcely known, is wide and safe, and saved nearly 1000 miles of route." In Beavers own words "Having been but little in India... I have never heard of this channel, till a Gentleman at Seychelle gave me a manuscript chart by which it appeared to be about 15 leagues wide; I therefore determined to take it, in preference to the 8 degree one."

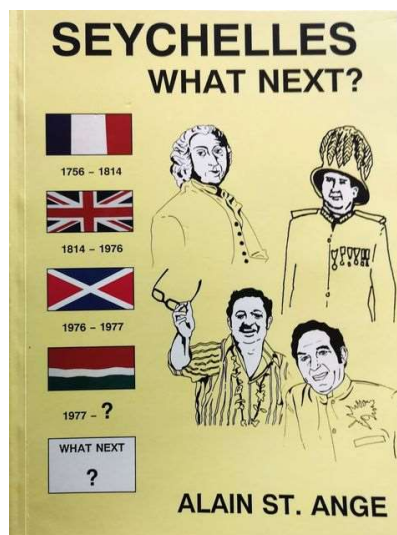
Beaver and the Nisus then moved to a squadron under Rear-Admiral Robert Stopford and took part in the conquest of Java in August and September 1811. He spent nearly a year in Mozambique and off the coast of Madagascar, and received orders by the end of 1812 to return to England.
