BEERBOHM, Max THE HAPPY HYPOCRITE [1896].

The complete original manuscript of Beerbohm's first work of fiction. 54 hand written pages on 53 foolscap leaves, with extensive deletions, emendations and periodic marginalia throughout. Ten of the versos contain drawings by Beerbohm. No preliminary drafts of The Happy Hypocrite are known and this manuscript appears to be the fully formed conception and refinement of the work in a single document, resulting in a text in its final iteration, as published in The Yellow Book and subsequently.

I NAKAZANIE *Bazunov, Prats and Veidenshtraukh, 1867.* The first edition of the author's most famous novel. Two volumes bound in contemporary quarter Russian roan. It was originally serialised in the literary journal, Russkii Vestnik (The Russian Messenger) in twelve monthly instalments during 1866. First editions are rarely available in commerce. *\$29,500*

GEORGE ELIOT'S FIRST BOOK IN ORIGINAL CLOTH

ELIOT, George SCENES OF CLERICAL LIFE Blackwood, 1858.

First edition. An exceptionally clean bright set with tight hinges and bright gilt to the spines. The author's first and rarest book, and very rare in the original cloth, particularly in such nice condition. \$19,500

First edition. Bound in contemporary quarter roan over pebble-grained cloth boards. The first edition of Le Fanu's most famous work and the first to gain the author widespread success. \$24,000

THE THIRD FOLIO

SHAKESPEARE, William COMEDIES, HISTORIES, AND TRAGEDIES *Printed for P[hilip]*. *C[hetwinde].*, 1664. The third folio. Folio (329×215 mm), 513 leaves (of 514 lacking the portrait leaf). An unusually well preserved and tall copy of the rare third folio. The third folio is generally regarded as the rarest of the four great seventeenth century folio editions of Shakespeare's plays, it long being accepted that a significant (but unknown) number of copies were destroyed in the Great Fire of 1666. \$250,000



This is the only copy we have encountered in a dustwrapper and is, so far as we have been able to ascertain, the earliest known example of a Conrad first edition to retain its jacket. \$39,000





Seven works in eleven volumes, all first English language editions. A truly exceptional set and very rare in such a complete state. Between approximately 1000 and 2500 copies of each of the volumes of the translation were issued, making complete sets uncommon and almost inevitably found without dustwrappers. Sets in dustwrappers, particularly unrestored and so well preserved are very rare indeed. \$65,000





The Archive Of Horace J. Knowles

The archive of the British illustrator Horace J. Knowles, containing original artworks, books, and sketchbooks. There are over 1,200 original illustrations and 289 separetely catalogued items in the collection, only a small portion of which can be displayed at the book fair.

The survival of such an archive is most uncommon for an illustrator of this period. His contemporaries, such as Arthur Rackham and Edmund Dulac, routinely sold their original artwork throughout their own lifetimes, whereas Knowles's illustrations stayed with him.

The fully illustrated manuscripts for three further works: *The Legend Of Glastonbury, Countryside Treasures,* and *My First Book Of Prayers.*

The original maquette for *Hans Andersen's Fairy Tales* (1923), an unpublished book.

Knowles's collection of books illustrated by himself and his brother Reginald L. Knowles. \$170,000
