There can be little said about P.G.Wodehouse which has not been said already and certainly nothing which better or more succinctly encapsulates his work than Waugh's comment above. However, whilst Wodehouse's work has been delighting readers for well over a century, for collectors of his first editions, he offers a number of challenges. Firstly, there is a question of scale: Wodehouse worked feverishly from the publication of his first book in 1902 until his death in 1975; then there is variety, from children's books to musicals via romanic humour and humourous romance, and in amongst it all, a number of rarities which are tantamount to unobtainable. The collection detailed in the pages which follow, falls just short of comprehensiveness, and owes it's existence to forty years of assiduous collecting by Roger Clark. For his diligence and good taste, I am sure a future generation of collectors will be suitably grateful.

The collection contains all but a handful of the British first editions and a similar showing from America (more than small number of which precede their British counterparts). Brightly illustrated dustwrappers abound from the 1920s onwards and the condition is generally excellent. The catalogue is laid out in three parts: British first editions, followed by the American first edition from page 23, followed by a small section of Omnibus editions and periodicles. I hope the catalogue will offer something to add to your collection.


The book that introduced Jeeves, the perfect gentleman's gentleman, to the world. The book appears to have been originally issued in May 1919 as part of the 1/9s series. When, in late 1919 or early 1920, inflation caused Newnes to replace this series with their 2/- series, it would appear that all unsold copies were thence issued with a newly priced jacket (as here), prior to being reprinted in a slightly larger format in July 1920. Only one copy is known in the 1/9 dustwrapper and well preserved copies in the 2/- are very rare.


