This research resulted in these comprehensive 1,398 page work published by HaMesorah publications, consisting primarily of analysis of episodes of the lives of sixty eminent rabbinic personalities. This work was to be the first of four volumes on these subjects. Only a limited number of copies were produced, as R. Nosson felt that this work was not for the general public. Immediately after its publication, an uproar ensued, as some felt that some of the matters described should not be recorded for posterity. A controversial ban was placed on the book, resulting in most of the copies getting destroyed. The books were later



republished in a revised version. The books say Volume 1 – part one and part two. As more volumes were initially intended. A copy sold at auction in the USA in April 2023 for a hammer price of \$2,250 plus commission = \$2,812.50




1. Early last year the Jewish communities of Western Europe and America were much disturbed by stories which reached them of the sufferings of their Russian co-religionists under the anti-religious laws enacted by the Government of the Soviet Republic. These laws had already evoked strong protests from the Hends of all the Christian Churches on account of the prosecutions of dignitaries of the Orthodox Greek Church to which they had given rise. It soon became apparent that the very existence of Judaism in Russia was in peril, and in August the Union of Polish Rabbis and Talmudists, in agreement with the Rabbinate of Wiha, took the unusual course of appealing to the Jewish communities of the world to appoint a day of Fasting and Prayer in token of protests against the persecution. A few weeks later the Polish Committee of the Agudas Yisroel, the chief organ of Orthodox Judaism in Eastern Europe, addressed an appeal on the same subject to the Genoa Conference, which was referred by that body to the League of Nations. No statement was made by the Soviet Government in repudiation of the allegations thus made against it.

2. In September the Chief Rabbi placed the facts before the Joint Foreign Committee and asked it to consider whether any steps could be taken to prevail upon the Soviet Government to moderate its anti-religious attitude. It was clear from the outset that anything in the nature of a public protest or other hostile action would be useless, and accordingly it was resolved to address an expostulation to the Soviet Government, setting forth courteously, but firmly, the cruelty and unwisdom of the anti-religious laws, and expressing a hope that it might be found possible to adopt a more liberal policy. A letter in this sense was sent on September 11th to the Official Agent of the Soviet Government in Moscow.


