
London, *The Foreign Jews Protection Committee Against Deportation to Russia and Compulsion, 1916.* During the First World War many Russian Jews living in England refused to serve in the army, as this would have meant fighting as allies of Russia. This was an act of protest against the antisemitic policies of the Tzar. This led to British authorities wanting to deport those that refused to enlist. However, after the Russian Revolution, Russia was no longer fighting alongside the Allies and with the issuance of the Balfour Declaration there was greater allegiance to Britain. This is a note in Yiddish containing a letter from Han Sek to the secretary of the Committee to discuss the option for Jews to volunteer in works of "national interest" instead of serving in the army. It includes 2 resolutions of the

Original wrappers, 22cm, 24 pp, text in English, some creasing and soiling. The Protest was chaired by the Archbishop of Canterbury and the speakers included Winston Churchill, Wladyslaw Sikorski and Jan Masaryk.

“I have been to many public meetings in the Albert Hall, and most of them have been impressive; but in many ways this meeting of protest against the horrors of the Nazi persecution of the Jews was more impressive than any of them. On this occasion there were no flags, no stirring bands and music, no brilliant array of uniforms. Instead - a great bare hall, filled with ordinary men and women in everyday clothes, listening quietly to the protests against Nazi barbarity delivered by the representatives of the Church of England, the Roman Catholic Church, The Free Churches of Great Britain, by the Chief Rabbi of the British Empire, and by the Prime Minister of Poland, General Sikorski. It was a moving and heartening experience to be present at a meeting to which men and women had obviously been drawn, not by any love of pageantry, but by a burning sympathy for the sufferings of a persecuted people, by a deep sense of the dignity of man, and the outrages inflicted on that dignity by Hitler and his Nazi barbarians.” (page 3). *OCLC 656272 [ref: 17445]* **£500**

This item is a highly comprehensive record of the three years spent by the deportees of the Etzel and Lehi in detention camps in Africa. Extraordinarily it was produced in Gilgil, Kenya.

There is a loose Appendix in this copy which includes a dozen (mimeographed) pages printed after the book itself was completed, containing sequels to stories of the deportees, extending to July 1948, when the deportees were finally sent home to the newborn State of Israel. The final paragraph states as follows:

*"After three years and nine months, the end of our exile is arising. We are yet enveloped by the foreign skies of Kenya; the spikes of barbed wire still encompass the compound; but an air of freedom is already penetrating our hearts, and 254 exiles from Zion are making their way back to the motherland, to Israel, to join the ranks of the fighters, to do battle and triumph."*




