A NOTE ON THE TYPEFACE

This catalogue has been set in The Doves Type® This was developed in the 19th Century by Thomas James Cobden Sanderson, along with engraver Emery Walker for use on the Doves Press. In 1916, Cobden Sanderson began to systematically destroy the entire type to prevent Walker from possessing his promised portion and the possibility of this leading to it being used on a mechanised press. He did this by throwing it from Hammersmith Bridge! After three years of research and dredging the Thames, Robert Green has been able to re-create the type from some of the originals. We love both the look of the type and its history.

Chapter One - Art

Beautiful oil painting of Jesus [ANON]

Jesu effigies ad regem abagarum missa

Italy: NP (1695) Oil portrait of Jesus. Circa 1690-1710. On canvas with a later frame. Our copy is allegedly from the Spanish school of painting, however, following our own research, we feel it more likely to have Italian provenance. The title to the painting, states that this was painted after the Edessene image of King Abgar. See our website for more of this history. We can find only a small number of similar portraits of Jesus with the same (or similar) inscription. Black background with the face of Jesus, surrounded by a halo, which also emanates from his beard (this halo showing shoots of light seems to be one of the distinguishing features of the Abagarum image). The paint is in excellent condition, with just slight bubbling in areas. There is no loss or scratching. The painting is on and old and



darkened canvas, held on a sturdy wooden frame. The front of the frame appears to be a later layer, added to the front of the canvas surround. This is in dark green. The surround has some rubbing and loss of surface paint to it. The painted area is 50cm x 41cm and the frame 59cm x 49cm. Approximately 5cm deep. It is possible that this is a later copy of an Abagarum portrait, but is nevertheless a lovely example of iconography.

Beautiful 18th Century original piece Original Water Colour of a Geisha holding a Shamisen

Japan: NP (C1775)

A lovely large water colour, showing a woman in traditional geisha clothing, holding a Shamisen.* Painted onto thin mustard coloured paper, this has been laid onto a cream backing sheet (also thin paper), which has in turn been laid onto a larger sheet of thin paper. The three sheets together giving much more strength than a single thin sheet. The painting itself has been expertly produced, but is unsigned. (We have priced this as an un-attributable artist). The painting has some small cracks with creasing and a tiny amount of paint loss to it, but still a lovely, authentic piece of Edo art, very similar in style to the portraiture of Katsushika Hokusai (even to the background colour of the sheet). It is of a very similar period (between 1775 and 1800). The style of the painting, including the detailed depiction of clothing patterns and the graceful posture of the figure, is characteristic of bijin-ga (paintings of beautiful women), which were popular in Japanese art during this time. The use of vibrant colors, such as deep blue and red, and intricate patterns suggests that this piece may have been created by an artist influenced by ukiyo-e, a genre of woodblock prints and paintings that flourished during the Edo period. The painted sheet measures 70cm x 24cm. The largest backing sheet (and hence work overall) measures 81.5cm x 29cm. *See our website for more information.




Two graphite and white pastel portraits

France: NP (1980)

A large sheet of pale brown card with two charcoal / graphite sketches upon it. One is a head and shoulders of a black man, to the other side of the sheet is a head of a woman. Both look somewhat pensive! There is an inscription, which seems to read "From Mike to Julia, I hope.... disputes." There are also what appears to be a few lines of poetry above, but these are indecipherable. There is a little water staining to one edge, but not affecting images.





These are both beautiful portraits, sadly without artist name, as they were obviously skilled. Sheet is 50cm x 40cm.

Paris: NP (1980)

A fabulous original sketch of Samuel Beckett as a bird, sitting on a branch above a building (possibly a theatre!) Black ink on glassine. Signed and dated Xaxier Bureau. The glassine is tipped onto a backing sheet of heavy paper. The illustration is signed and titled to the bottom left, with his left. We believe that this was intended for publication in a magazine, probably "L'Arche", as it has "tel p 16-17" to the top left in pencil, and does look as if intended as a published illustration. However, we have been unable to identify if it was. A fabulous satire, Beckett is immediately recognisable. In very good, clean condition. Glassine sheet is 31.5cm x 24.5cm. Xavier Bureau, born in 1943, is a self-taught French artist who goes by the pseudonym Burlingue. He has had a diverse career in the arts, working as a gallery owner for nearly 40 years at Galerie Katia Granoff and Galerie de la Présidence. For 18 years, he was also an illustrator for "L'Arche," a monthly magazine of the FSJU (Fonds social juif unifié).

A lovely original work, reminiscent of the work of Jean Carzou or Bernard Buffet. A skilled composition of boats in a habour. Nicely framed behind passe partout, then under a gilt wooden frame and glass. The work is signed and dated 1968 to the top left edge. The the rear of the frame, is a gift inscription to Mr & Mrs Foster, also dated 1968. The signature looks like Luis (or Luigi) Hopper or Hoppen, but we cannot find any artist of these names. Still a very nice piece! painting is 36cm x 27.5cm. Frame is 53cm x 45cm.

Leningrad: Publishing house of Artists of the RSFSR (1976)

A fabulous portfolio of this Russian painter's work. Large format (55cm x 43cm) the portfolio is in cream cloth with a reproduced landscape and the artists facsimile signature to the front cover. The portfolio is in sound, strong condition, but does have some marking to the covers, particularly to the rear plain panel. It has done its work though, as inside is a 4 page introduction with details of the images (in Russian text) and then 19 beautifully reproduced works by Ivanov, all on high quality card. These are in excellent condition. (the last having a tiny touch of edgewear only). The images are of varying size, but the cards are each approx 54.5 x 42.5cm. Overall a very good example of this rare presentation of Ivanov's work. There are currently not copies for sale online. We can find no record of this collection on WorldCat. Alexander Ivanov (1806-1858) was a Russian Neo-Classical painter. He lived and painted in Italy for 28 years, returning to Russia two months before his death from Cholera age 51. 550 x 430 mm (21³/₄ x 17 inches).

LATENAY, Gaston de Le Vieux Bassin

Paris: de Lateney (1925)

An original, signed etching by de Latenay. Undated, but circa 1925. Numbered 12/50 copies in pencil to the bottom left. Signed to the bottom right. To the edge of the sheet is a comment by de Latenay in indecipherable pencil. "la planche....de no 15." The scene shows a young child standing before an ornamental pool in a woodland scene. It is quite similar in composition to his water colour "La-clef-des-cœurs". In very good, clean condition. It is a nice quality brown / sepia etching on heavy laid an watermarked paper. Clean sheet to front and reverse. Just a couple of light foxing spots. Image is 30cm x 38cm. The sheet is 36.5cm x 52cm.

Gaston de Latenay (1859–1945) was a French painter, aquarellist, engraver, and illustrator. He briefly studied at the Académie Julian in Paris and became a member of the Société des Artistes Français. He exhibited his works at the Salon des Artistes Français between 1886 and 1893. De Latenay was known for his delicate water colours, lithographs, and etchings, often depicting serene landscapes and coastal scenes, such as "La mer sauvage Belle Île." His artistic style emphasised subtlety and refinement. His works include depictions of Breton life and nature, such as "Young Breton woman knitting" and other pastoral themes.

PICASSO, Pablo Le Visage de la Paix par Picasso et Eluard

Paris: Éditions Cercle D'Art (1951)

A very nice copy of this limited first edition. 590/2100. Original soft covers. Cream with black text to the front cover. There is light foxing to the front cover. Small area of splitting to the top edge of the spine. 29 half page lithographs by Picasso printed by Mourlot illustrating a poem by Paul Éluard located below. The paper is vélin Offset Supérieur. The pages are clean and bright, with only fractional darkening. A very nice copy. 29.5cm x 22.5cm. Paul Éluard and Pablo Picasso met in the 1920s, at the heart of the surrealist movement, but their artistic collaboration took on a more committed dimension from the 1930s onwards. Their friendship was consolidated in particular during the Spanish Civil War and after the tragedy of Guernica, events which cemented their fight against fascism, their quest for freedom and peace and an opposition to the horrors of war. "Le Visage de la Paix" is the ultimate fruit of this collaboration. Published a year before Éluard's death, it brings together 29 of the poet's poems and 29 of Picasso's drawings on the theme of peace.

PARIS, Alfred & Louis.

Sketch book and album - A collection of Water-colours, pencil sketches and photographs of Alfred and Louis Paris.

Fontaine-Bonneleau: NP (1889)

A wonderful collection from the end of the Nineteenth century. This contains work from the artist Alfred Paris, and his brother Louis (also a good artist). There are 38 leaves (mostly double sided) containing pasted elements (76 pages). Inside are 14 water-colours, approximately 150 ink sketches (many practice sketches of animal anatomy, military figures etc). Approximately 24 pencil sketches, 27 photographs of the artists and their families and home, and about 29 items of printed matter (including several that were printed examples of Paris's published work). Hardback buckram album. The album was put together in Fontaine-Bonneleau, between 1887 and 1905. There is evidence that a number of pages have been removed from the album. There are a significant number signed Alfred Paris (or AP) and a similar number signed Louis Paris (or LP) For further details, see our website.



Alfred Jean-Marie Paris was a French painter, illustrator, and lithographer (1848, Tarbes- 1908, Fontaine-Bonneleau). Paris had a prolific career as an illustrator, working for publishers such as Boussod, Valadon & Cie, Hachette, and Mame,

A not so tempting Seventeenth Century prostitute PICCINI, Giacomo, after CASTAGNA Curtius. Life of the Whore

Venice: Piccini (C1660) A very nice engraving from the mid seventeenth century showing a prostitute looking for custom from a musketeer Tipped onto backing card. We have been unable to locate an identical image, but image search shows a slightly later engraving of identical composition, with the same italian text below. but a much cruder engraving. This example state Cur. Castagna to the bottom left of the image. This is Curtius Castanga, or Casangnia. A hand written note in french. states that this was engraved by Jacques Piccini. Piccini (although his first name was Giacomo) (1617-1669) was a significant Venitian engraver. Interestingly, his daughter Isabella, also became an important



engraver, and although she became a nun, continued to work as an engraver to fund her convent, She died at the age of ninety. The hand written note cites Brulliot p 305, #2257. The lower quality image from 1680 was attributed to Joseph Lunghi. The Italian text is "In stato lagrimabile e meschino, Con le brutte ferite in su la faccia, Va col' uaso da l'eglio e non il vino. Con infami esercty ogni hor procaccia, La vita sostenere perfida, et trista, Et vuol cie che ella fè ch'ogni altra faccia." Which seems to translate as "In a tearful and miserable state, With ugly wounds on her face, She goes with the accustomed one and the wine. With infamous exercises every hour she seeks, The life to sustain perfidious, sad, And she wants what she did that every other does." The engraving is in good condition, with a few stains to the bottom edge only. 32cm x 23.5cm. The backing card is 42cm x 30cm.

Paris: Le Portique (1930)

First Edition. One of only 625 copies (this 289), on vergé de Rives. With Vollard's portrait by Raoul Dufy, signed in the copper plate, as a frontis and with second portrait of Vollard by Auguste Renoir reproduced later in the text. A comprehensive catalogue raissonnee of the superbly edited "Vollard editions" up to the year 1930 including his published illustrated works. Original cream coloured paper covers. These are a little creased to the yapped edges, and there is a small hole / tear with slight loss, to the rear edge. Still in very good condition overall. Internally in good, clean and tidy condition throughout. 72 pages. Largely uncut. 29cm x 23.5cm. Conforms to WorldCat / OCLC: 31881929. Ambroise Vollard (1866–1939) was a pioneering French art dealer, collector, publisher, and writer, widely regarded as one of the most influential figures in the promotion of modern art during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Vollard played a crucial role in shaping the careers of many now-renowned artists. He is credited with discovering and promoting figures such as Paul Cézanne, Pablo Picasso, Paul Gauguin, Henri Matisse, Georges Rouault, and Vincent van Gogh. His gallery on Rue Laffitte in Paris became a hub for avant-garde art exhibitions, hosting groundbreaking shows such as Cézanne's first major exhibition in 1895, Picasso's first solo exhibition in 1901, and Matisse's exhibition in 1904. In addition to his work as a dealer, Vollard was an avid publisher of illustrated books and print series. He collaborated with artists such as Pierre Bonnard and Marc Chagall to produce works like Les Fleurs du mal and Fables de La Fontaine. Vollard also commissioned Picasso to create the celebrated "Vollard Suite," a set of 100 etchings.

Water colour over graphite drawing, signed lower left. Although undated, this is very similar to works dated 1930-1935. Visible area 45.5cm x 30cm. Under passe partout (sealed into this from behind) and under glass in a wooden frame with a little handling only. The water colour is in very good condition, and clearly signed. There is a touch of paint remnant to the top right edge. An attractive portrait of a dancing nude. The frame is 67cm x 51cm. Odilon Roche (1868–1947) was a French artist renowned for his work as a watercolourist, draftsman, and painter. Roche's work included water colours, wash paintings, and drawings, often characterised by delicate and detailed execution. In addition to his artistic pursuits, Roche had a multifaceted career. He worked as a wine taster, colour merchant, and antiquarian specialising in 18th-century and Persian art. His works include lithographs and signed pieces such as "Musiciennes antiques" and "Port Issol," which reflect his mastery of both pencil and watercolour techniques, both of which he utilised in this piece.



First edition. A fabulous copy of this complete set of hand coloured plates. 95 beautiful double sheets on a range of topics. The purple blind stamped hardback boards have a decorative gilt title to the board. "Münchener Bilderbogen III." Boards are clean, with a little fading. New leather spine without titles. Inside are the plates 193-288, complete. Our collation exactly matches the Library of Congress record 2011646102, and we are indebted to them for the detailed information below. Each of the sheets (43cm x 33cm) are folded in half and tipped into a bound hinge, printed on one side only. Very high quality, bright colouring. The sheets are clean, with just a touch of darkening. The Munich picture sheets

(bilderbogen) were a series of single-sheet prints or picture sheets that the publisher Braun & Schneider in Munich published every two weeks from 1848 to 1898. Kaspar Braun managed to get a large number of artists, who later became wellknown, to design this series and to implement his concept of the 'artistic' picture sheet. The printing technique he chose for this was wood engraving and not lithography, as was usually the case with picture sheets, See our online listing for complete contents (number, title, date and artist). 335 by 235mm (131/4 by 91/4 inches).

First edition. A rare surviving copy of Tschudi's moving theatre. A Swiss German picture book with moving hand coloured images. Music by Paul Burkhard and Stage sets and costumes by Fritz Krumenacher. Hardback with stiff card boards. Picture of two mice taking a bow on stage. There is some marking and bumping to the boards, but overall not bad. Inside, there is sporadic marking throughout. Red and black title page. There are several text pages (with black and white images) and three pasted leaves with a circular disc to be moved (so six different theatrical discs to move). The scenes on the discs are hand painted. A nice, and seemingly rare example of a moving book. There has been a neat repair to the binding where staples have pulled out, so the binding is now firm. Text is in German. 12 pages. 25cm x 18.5cm. We have been unable to find another copy of this work for sale or at auction. There is one entry in World-Cat / OCLC: 83714402. One unidentified library copies.



First edition. A lovely copy of this rare children's illustrated work. A re-telling of the Tom Thumb tale. Soft covers, with lovely hand painted illustration to the front cover, heightened with gold paint to the leaves. Slightly darkened covers and a crease to the rear cover corner. The paper inside is a little darkened and brittle, the first few pages have loss to the corners. The title is particularly darkened. Hand coloured vignette to the title. Ten lovely coloured illustrations on higher quality paper. These appear to the hand coloured, but possibly a high quality print. There are vignettes throughout the book have blue detail added by hand. One page has had major tears to it. These have now been repaired with archival tape (see photograph). Overall, a delicate but rare item. We have been unable to locate any other copies of this book. None for sale, no WorldCat record, no auction records. We can just find a mention of the work on the wikipedia entries for the author and illustrator. 76 (+ plates) pages. 31cm x 21.5cm.



Émile Berchmans (1867-1947) was a Belgian painter, designer, illustrator and engraver. He was above all one of the main Belgian poster artists at the turn of the 20th century.

Rodolphe de Warsage (The pseudonym of Edmond Schoonbroodt) (1876-1940) was Liège lawyer and author of novels, poetry, stories and plays.

A lovely manuscript copy of this selection of Royal ordinances, attributed to Andre Barrigue de Montvalon. This work existed only in copied manuscript form from 1724 to 1752 when it was finally published. Our copy is an early manuscript. Attractive manuscript title with a coat of arms beneath. (It appears to show the arms of a Marquis). The work contains the Royal Laws, along with the commentary of Philippe Bornier. The author is quite critical of Bornier's work, and corrects his errors and dating. As stated in the preface, content in red ink refers to Bornier's work. Dates of ordinances are indicated in side notes. There are also two tables. One shows them in chronological order. The other in alphabetical. Text is throughout in a neat French secretarial hand. This work is almost identical to a 1728 version, found in the Bibliotheque de Droit Schuman in Aix-en-Provence, and a slightly earlier (1724) edition currently on sale in the USA. Our copy is slightly enlarged, as BOUND IN is a lovely genealogical tree of the French Royal family and 8 pages (4 leaves) of a red and black list of the kings and their significant dates.

Condition. The full leather period binding is in good, strong, condition, with just a little rubbing and slight loss to the head of the spine. Attractive gilt decoration and titles to spine. Barrigue de Montvalon was a legal advisor to the Parlement of Provence. He was sent to defend the King physically when a disputed broke out between the parlement and the court at Aixes. He was a great supporter of the Jesuits. Barrigue lived to the age of 101. P. Girard, noting his devotion, said of him that he "knew only the Palace and retirement. A long life is the reward of good morals". Bornier was an Advisor to the King, serving as a counselor to the king and lieutenant principal at the présidial court of the city.





Ours conforms with WorldCat / OCLC: 213799963 which states that there are 18 plates including the title (others range from 10 to 19 plates). The title is uncoloured in this edition, but the 17 "Actualités" all have bright and attractive hand colouring. Hardback volume with the title repeated to the front board. This is quite darkened and rubbed, and about 1/3rd of the spine is lacking. Binding is weak to the front hinge and has been reinforced with archival tape. The end papers are significantly darkened, but the plates less so. They all have the running title "Actualités" to the top. He is surrounded by a circle of newly freed slaves. The music is supplied by Mr. Stanley, the Colonial Secretary; and Lord Althorp, as Chancellor of the Exchequer, calls on John Bull to pay the piper, as he had called for the dance. John Bull is not so keen now, and asks why Buxton (who here represents all emancipators, and particularly the Quakers) should not pay. This print is referring to the newly passed Slavery Abolition Act of 1833. This Act abolished slavery across most of the British Empire, freeing over 800,000 enslaved individuals, primarily in the Caribbean, South Africa, and Canada. £20 million was allocated to compensate slave owners. It received Royal Assent on August 28, 1823, and took effect on August 1, 1824. The Act introduced a system of "apprenticeship," requiring formerly enslaved individuals over six years old to continue working for their former masters for a transitional period. Although anonymous, we are convinced that it is by a professional photographer, as the quality of images, the selection and framing of subjects and the variety of print sizes all speak to a professional eye. Green hardback buckram photograph album, with a simple leather and gilt label to the spine stating "London 1968." Inside is a wonderful unpublished collection of 78 photographs in immaculate condition. From Street urchins to shop mannequins. From bearded buskers to Old ladies feeding pigeons.

It contains 17 double page maps and seven city views (including one double page view) which were printed to accompany Lalande's voyage in Italy. Original hardback with brown marbled boards, leather spine and gilt decoration and titles. There is some chipping and slight loss to the spine leather, and moderate rubbing to the boards. Inside are a small French bookseller label and a neat ex libris to the end paper. The contents are neat, and mainly clean, with a little darkening and foxing only. Overall in very good shape. 



His work provides vivid portrayals of the English court, society, and landscapes. He praised Queen Elizabeth I's intelligence and multilingual abilities, portraying her as a symbol of England's prosperity and strength.





There is some darkening to the linen backing, but the maps themselves are in and excellent, clean state.

The maps contained are: Vassy, (1833) #68; Troyes (1837) #82; Reims (1826) #34; Chalons (1831) #50; Bar le Duc (1833) #51; Verdun (1831) #35; Arcis (1833) #67; Chaumont (1837) #85. These maps of France were drawn up by officers of the General Staff Corps under the direction of Lieutenant General Pelet and published by the Dépôt de la Guerre. A remarkable work for the finesse and quality of its details. The revision date is important because it explains, for example, the presence of railway lines or the fortifications of Paris built by Thiers after 1841. Maps of Paris and its region were first published between 1832 and 1839. The whole of France was covered with 247 maps. The Paris sheet is always centred on the Paris Meridian (Observatory) and not that of Greenwich. This series of maps is very precise and gives a state of the territory in the first half of the 19th century, both in terms of land use and relief.

These maps are all dated between 1831 and 1837, however, caution is always required. Indeed, the publication date shown at the bottom of the map has not been changed, although updates were made up to 1889. It is therefore important to avoid misinterpretations. As the box was made and labelled for these maps, and dated 1842 in gilt, we believe that this is an accurate final date for these maps, and they are all made before 1842. Box is 23cm x 14cm x 10cm. Maps are each 60cm x 88 cm.


