
This collection, formed over many years by a private collector, consists not of grand folio town & county histories, aimed at the local historian, but predominantly of the small pocket guides, produced locally for the visiting tourist. Although mainly modest in design, & priced attractively for the visitor, they often include essential local information, places to visit, & sometimes recommend walks & excursions in the location. Adverts announce local inns, hotels & shops, their owners hoping to attract customers.

Travel for a reason other than trade, work or religion increased dramatically in Britain from the 18th century onwards. The Napoleonic wars & subsequent naval blockades, curtailed travel to the continent for the rich, & alternative watering places were sought, & Britain's coastline discovered. The Industrial Revolution & the advent of the railway, made accessing the coast much easier, & laid the foundation that allowed seaside & rural holidays to become a reality for the masses.

Designed for the pocket, & for use whilst travelling, the survival rate of such guides is fairly low, as are the 'view-books' also collected here, which were again produced locally, & taken home by the visitor as a memento of their holiday.

The books in this catalogue form in some small way a snapshot of 19th century local tourism in Britain.






Sixteen huge chains held up 579 feet of deck, giving 100 feet of clearance for tall sailing ships navigating the Menai Strait. The Menai Bridge not only made Thomas Telford's reputation as a civil engineer, it also dramatically reduced the time and dangers involved on the journey from Ireland via Holyhead to London.


~ Charles Edward Davis (1827-1902), was the son of Edward Davis, an architect in Bath and pupil of Sir John Soane. He began as his father's pupil, and in 1863, having recently won a competition for the cemetery buildings on the lower Bristol Road, was appointed city architect and surveyor to the corporation of Bath. He held these posts for forty years.

Philip Brannon was the publisher of a number of guidebooks about towns and resorts on the coast of Hampshire and Dorset from 1850 onwards. The Illustrated Historical and Picturesque Guide to Poole and Bourne-mouth, and the Surrounding Country was one of the first guidebooks for Bournemouth, a settlement that was only forty years old. It was published by R. Sydenham, who ran Sydenham's Promenade Library and Reading Room.

Wyatt demolished the remains to the bell tower; drained and levelled the churchyard; removed the perpendicular screen, tow medieval wall paintings, and two porches; rearranged the medieval tombs, and whitewashed or removed medieval wall paintings. Wyatt's remodelling was carried with the aim of creating a simpler interior, and the results were applauded by many of his contemporaries. However his disregard for the historical integrity of the Cathedral appalled the antiquary John Carter (1748-1817), and subsequent generations of historians. This guide offers a 'particular account of ghe great improvements made... under the direction of James Wyatt', and cites Wyatt's pre-works survey in Chapter III.




~ Lady Georgiana Fane, (1801-1874), lived at Brympton d'Evercy manor house near Yeovil. She is renown for two things, a much commented upon portrait of her by Sir Thomas Lawrence, when she was five or six years old, dressed as a peasant girl, and for her apparent stalking of the Duke of Wellington. She met Wellington in 1815, shortly after his final victory over Napoleon Bonaparte at


the Battle of Waterloo; she was 14 years old, and he was 47. Lord Palmerston, who was carrying on an affair with her married half-sister, Sarah Villiers, Countess of Jersey, proposed to Lady Georgiana, twice, in 1823, but she turned him down. The existence of suggestive letters, from Wellington, seems to confirm they did have a sexual relationship in the 1820s.
