FIRST and ONLY EDITION, rare. This speech made at the opening of the provincial legislature of Grão Pará provides a wide ranging picture of the state of the province, covering education, the public library, police, militiary, public health, waterworks, public gardens, commerce, finance, etc. There is also a section covering the various municipalities of the province. The final xxx pp. contain "Annexos" with an introduction by José Luiz Coelho, followed by documents and statistical analysis.

José Coelho da Gama e Abreu, Barão de Marajó, a native of Belém de Pará (1832-1906), was a Brazilian political figure and historian. He was President of his native province from 1879 to 1881, and previously served as President of the province of Amazonas from 1867 to 1868. Having spent much of his childhood in Portugal, studying mathematics and earning a degree in philosophy at Coimbra University, Abreu returned to Pará in 1855. Among his publications was a travel account: Do Amazonas ao Sena, Nilo, Bósphoro e Danúbio ... 3 volumes, Lisbon, 1874-1876, and A Amazôna. As Províncias do Pará e Amazonas e o governo central deo Brazil, Lisbon, 1883. He was a member of the Real Academia das Sciencias de Lisboa.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. We have been able to locate only one other copy, in the Fundo Barca-Oliveira at the Biblioteca Pública de Braga. The work probably dates to 1809, when Marshal Soult invaded Portugal from the north and was temporarily repulsed by Portuguese militia at the Minho River. Page 3 includes the lines, "em Tras-os-Montes / SEPULVEDA immortal o brado alçando, / Proclama a Liberdade!"

Porbase identifies "Academico Transmontano" as Antonio Pimentel Soares, but since he was born in 1804, this cannot be the same author.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of a neo-Latin poem p. [3], followed by an address, also in Latin. The poem is addressed to Antonio Procopio, a senator in Porto, possibly "A.P.S.P." on the title page, perhaps the oration author's initials, which could stand for António Procopio da Silva Pina [or Pinna], also author of *Oração aos Serenissimos Principes do Brasil o Senhor D. João, e a Senhora D. Carlota, no faustissimo dia dos annos da Serenissima Senhora D. Maria Thereza, Princeza da Beira sua filha.... Lisbon:* Na Offic. de Simão Thaddeo Ferreira, 1794. He was corregedor da comarca de Ponte de Lima in 1780, where he favored the founding of a Sociedade Patriotica, with the aim of furthering agriculture, industry and commerce. The dedicatees, D. Fernando de Portugal and D. Pedro de Mello Breyner, were sons of the Conde de Ficalho and the Marquesa de Valença."

Here the author (who signs in print as "Um Portuguez") reacts to 13 accusations made against the *Curtissima exposição*.

The Duque de Palmella responded in 1847 with Carta ao editor do Diario do Governo em resposta á Curtissima exposição d'Alguns Factos. Júlio Gomes da Silva Sanches responded to this work with Algumas inexactidões do Additamento á Curtissima exposição d'alguns factos, 1847.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. In 1828 D. Juan Fermin Vidaurre (1770-1829) published a short work, *Gloria a Dios y a su Santa Iglesia*, that criticized the way in which the *vicario capitular* was elected in the diocese of Concepción. He was criticized and responded. This work, dated July 4, seems to be a rebuttal to Vidaurre's second publication, which the author calls "tan intempestivo como incendiario." The issue was the legitimacy of a cleric who was elected during the war of independence, after the incumbent decamped to Lima. The supporting documents at the end are dated 1813 and 1824.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION? Describes the baptism and subsequent ceremonies for Prince August Leopold of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha (December 6, 1867-October 11, 1922), known in Brazil as Dom Augusto Leopoldo. He was a prince of the Empire of Brazil and of the House of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha-Koháry. The second of four sons born to German Prince Ludwig August of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha and Princess Leopoldina of Brazil, and the second grandson of the Emperor D. Pedro II, the prince was, for some years the presumptive heir to the Imperial Crown of Brazil. He was an officer in the Imperial Brazilian navy, and later in the Imperial Austro-Hungarian navy. His descendants would form the Saxe-Coburg and Gotha branch of the Imperial House of Brazil.

The name Fausto Augusto d'Aguiar (1817-1890) appears in print at the end of the text. A native of Rio de Janeiro, he was director geral da secretaria do imperio, president of the provinces of Ceará and Pará, deputy to national legislatures from 1856 to 1864, 1869 to 1875, and finally senator. Councilor to the Emperor, he was a member of the Instituo Historico e Geographico Brazileiro.

# Economic Analysis in Verse: Why Is Agricultural Production Declining in the Alentejo and Estremadura?

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this rare and unusual poem on declining agricultural production in the Alentejo and neighboring Estremadura, set out in 10-line stanzas with annotations at the end of each section. The anonymous author lists twenty causes of the decline: among them are maltreatment of workers by large landowners (a problem for centuries in the large landholdings in the Alentejo, Estremadura, Ribatejo and Andalusia), shortage of workers and oxen, the taste for luxury goods, too many church holidays, inefficient harvesting methods, poor transportation, roads and bridges in need of repair, soil erosion, and lack of water conservation.

This is a relatively early example of a Portuguese book which preserves the original printed wrappers.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this ode honoring D. Maria I's ascension to the throne; begins: "Ode. / Ainda, Clio Divina, / Conservas essa lyra pendurada? ...." It includes references to D. Afonso I and the famous Côrtes of Lamego of 1143, as well as to India and the Ganges.

There are at least two other odes on the same subject, with 7 pp. and almost identical titles, one printed at the Offic. de Antonio Rodrigues Galhardo, and sold by Francisco Tavares at his shop in the Praça do Comercio, 1777, the other printed at the Offic. de José de Aquino Bulhoens.

D. Maria (b. 1734) became Portugal's first queen regnant on February 24, 1777, after the death of her father D. José I. She reigned until her death in 1816, although by 1792 she was suffering such severe mental illness that her son, the future D. João VI, ruled in her stead (as regent starting in 1799).

Luís Corrêa de França e Amaral (1725-1808), a magistrate with a degree from Coimbra University, was also a poet whose name in the Lisbon Arcadia was Melizeu

Cylenio. He later joined the Academia de Bellas-Letras de Lisboa, or Nova-Arcadia, where he provoked the wrath of Bocage, who skewered him with pungent satire in several poems.

In the spring of 1922 two of Portugal's most noted aviators, Sacadura Cabral and Gago Coutinho, made the first flight from Europe to South America, flying from Lisbon to Rio de Janeiro via the Canaries and Cabo Verde. It was the first long-distance flight in which rigorous methods of aerial navigation were used.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Among those eulogized are the Infante D. Fernando (son of D. João I), Henry the Navigator (another son of the same king), Nuno Alvares Pereira, Vasco da Gama, Affonso d'Albuquerque, D. Francisco d'Almeida, D. João de Castro, Duarte Pacheco Pereira, Luís de Camões, Frei Bartholomeu dos Martyres and the Marquês de Pombal. There are also "elogios" to various subjects, such as Eloquence, Poetry, Philosophy, the Liberal Arts and Geography, as well as discourses on "vantagens sobre animaes", the origin of the world, "as producções dos tres Reinos da Naturaza", the merit of artificial logic, the excelence and utility of rhetoric, the utility of arts and sciences, utility of history, and the most brilliant epochs of Portuguese history.

Frei Jerónimo Emiliano de Andrade (Angra, 1789-Angra do Heroísmo, 1847), was Comissário dos estuos in Angra do Heroísmo and the first reitor of the Liceu Nacional de Angra do Heroísmo. Abandoned as an infant, father unknown, he was taken under the care and provided an education by Father José de Andrade, entering the Franciscan Order aged 16. Early in his career as a teacher one of his students was Almeida Garrett. Influenced by the events of the Peninsular War, he became a partisan of the liberal revolution of 1820. He wrote a number of books and pamphlets. After 1834, with the suppression of the religious orders, he became a secular priest.

The Santa Casa da Misericordia (Holy House of Mercy) is a uniquely Portuguese Catholic charitable institution, founded in Lisbon in 1498 by Queen Leonor and still existing today. Eventually practically every Portuguese city had its Santa Casa da Misericordia, and the institution spread overseas to Goa, Macau, Bahia, etc. The Santa Casa's administrators (Irmãos) tackled duties that would today be the province of lawyers, accountants, hospital administrators, prison chaplains and chaperones. One of the Casa da Misericordia's functions was to make certain that every Christian received a proper burial.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. In 1707, Fernão Telles da Silva (1662-1731) led the embassy to the Court of Vienna that completed arrangements for the marriage of D. João V to D. Maria Anna of Austria (daughter of Emperor Leopold I) and escorted D. Maria Anna back to Lisbon. The embassy was described in detail in Fr. Francisco da Fonseca's *Embayxada do Conde de Villarmayor Fernando Telles da Sylva de Lisboa a corte de Vienna*, 1717. This work in Italian, with the double-headed eagle of the Empire, was perhaps written for the Conde in Vienna. That Fernando Telles da Silva is referred to as Conde de Villarmayor rather than Marquês de Alegrete surely means he was using this as a courtesy title during the life of his father, Manuel Telles da Silva, who was the Marquês de Alegrete *and* Conde de Villarmayor until his death in 1709.

Apparently the FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this summary of Argentine finances during the last four months of 1821, including income (aduana, papel sellado, pulperías, loterias, multas, etc.) and expenses (sueldos y pensiones, diezmos repartidos, hospitalidad, rescate de esclavos, etc.). It bears the printed imprimatur of García and the signature in print of Santiago Wilde. Wilde, a British subject, came to Argentina in the early nineteenth century. Member of the Academia das Ciências de Lisboa, the Sociedade de Geografia de Lisboa and of other learned institutions, he was founder and president of the Grémio dos Açores.

The Augustinian D. Fr. Joaquim Menezes e Ataide (1765-1828), a native of Porto, was Bishop of Meliapor (1804), Vigario Capitular of Funchal (1811, with the title of Archbishop), and Bishop of Elvas (1821). His political views were apparently either extremely flexible or expressed unclearly, since he was accused of being both vehemently against the Constitution and being vehemently liberal. In a famous trial of 1827, he was accused (along with the Marquez da Fronteira, the Conde da Cunha and the Conde da Taipa) of conspiring to establish a republic. He fled the country soon thereafter, and died in Gibraltar.

Augustine's *Soliloquia* is argued to be the direct literary predecessor of the *Confessions*, with respect to how allegory is used in the organization of an inner dialogue (see Brian Stock, *Augustine's Inner Dialogue: The Philosophical Soliloquy in Late Antiquity*, Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2010, p. 74). The soliloquies also influenced theologians of the Middle Ages, including Anselm of Canterbury's *Monologion* (Stock, p. 67)



Apparently the First Edition in Portuguese of a work originally published in London, 1574 (with issues or editions dated 1575, 1577, 1585, and 1586) as *S. Augustines manuell, or litle booke of the contemplation of Christ,* in *Certaine select prayers gathered out of S. Augustines meditations, which he calleth his selfe talke with God.* Its thirty-six chapters include topics such as: *Da admiravel essencia de Deos; Da ineffavel Sciencia de Deos; Da consolação que Deos dá à alma affligida; Que cousa seja, e o que contém o Paraiso; Como see ha de dezejar o summo bem;* and *Da grandeza do gozo da vida eterna.* 

According to ESTC S100328, S100358, S100360, S108221, and S101504, the work is "Probably not in fact by Augustine." See also STC (2nd ed.) 924-8. The present work is not to be confused with the *Enchiridion, Manual, or Handbook* by Augustine of Hippo (354-430), a compact treatise on Christian piety written ca. 420, which is organized according to the three graces necessary for the Christian worship of God (Faith, Hope and Love). That work has 121 chapters and opens with an address to Laurentius.

António José de Ávila (1807-1881) grew up in Horta, on the island of Faial, in the Azores. During the *Lutas Liberais* he entered politics, then served in the Côrtes; he was a member of the Chartist faction. He served as the prime minister of Portugal three times: January to July 1868, October 1870 to September 1871, and March 1877 to January 1878. King Luis I granted him the title Conde de Ávila in 1864. In 1870 he was raised to Marquês de Ávila e Bolama. In 1878 the king granted him the title of duke, usually

reserved for members of high nobility or the royal family; Ávila was the first non-nobly born individual to be so honored in Portugal.

She reigned until her death in 1816, although by 1792 she was suffering such severe mental illness that her son, the future D. João VI, ruled in her stead (as Prince Regent starting in 1799).

Mathias José Dias Azedo (1758-1821) joined the Portuguese army in 1780 and rose through the ranks to become lieutenant-general by 1813. For many years he taught at the Academia Real de Fortificação, for whose students he wrote *Compendio militar*, 1796, a handbook on military tactics. It was notable for its use of the system of orthography dictated by pronunciation that had been espoused by Verney and Theodoro de Almeida (e.g. *instrusao* for *instrucção*). Contemporaries praised his knowledge of literature and science as well as the military arts, but Innocêncio knew of only a few published works: the *Compendio militar*, this poem, and *Hymeneo*, a poem on an aristocratic marriage that was set to music by Jeronimo Francisco Lima.

General Sebastião de Sousa Dantas Baracho (Torres Novas, 1844-1921), was Presidente do Supremo Tribunal Militar, of the Supremo Conselho de Justiça Militar and of the Conselho Superior de Promoções. He was presidente da comissão encarregada de rever a legislação criminal militar, and comissário régio para a delimitação da África Ocidental from 9 July1891 to 9 March 1892, in accordance with the Luso-Belgian treaty regarding the boundaries between the Belgian Congo and Angola. Honorary Aide-de-camp to kings D. Carlos and D. Manuel, he was elected deputy for the Partido Regenerador in 1881 for Torres Novas and reelected in 1884, 1887, 1889 and 1890 for Santarém; nominated Par do Reino on 29 December 1900, he was a frequent critic of the regime. In 1911 he was elected deputy to the Assembleia Constituinte for Figueira da Foz.

Provenance: The title Conde de Tondalla [or Tondela according to present orthography] was created by decree of King D. Carlos I dated 23 February 1899, in favor of José de Aragão da Costa Lacerda da Vitória (1844-1908), descendent of the Barões de Tondella. He was a great landowner, and Mayor of Fundão. FIRST and ONLY EDITION. This discourse on the benefits of a hereditary monarchy (given at the baptism of the Prince Imperial D. Afonso (23 February 1845-11 June 1847), short lived first-born son of D. Pedro II) was one of the last orations by Cunha Barbosa (1780-1846), a native of Rio de Janeiro, "homem de invulgar atividade, combativo, estudioso, dado às letras, poeta, theatrólogo, jornalista" (Werneck Sodré p. 220). One of the most eminent figures during the Brazilian independence movement (and a very vocal opponent of José Bonifacio de Andrade, who managed to have him deported without trial), he was also a noted religious orator, one of the founders of the Instituto Histórico e Geográfico Brasileiro, director of the Impressão Regia and the Biblioteca Nacional, and founder of the Revérbero Constitucional Fluminense, 1821-22. His Parnaso brasileiro, 1829, was the first anthology of Brazilian poetry. His 1839 speech to the Instituto Histórico on slavery is widely known: "A escravidão dos negros nem aproveita à civilização dos índios, nem à sua própria, nem aos progressos da nossa indústria; os danos que daí resultam são desgraçadamente conhecidos, e só a cobiça poderá negar resultados que a inteligência, ainda a menos perspicaz, percebe e calcula" (quoted in W. Martins, História da inteligência brasileira, I, 251).

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this funeral oration for a captain-general of the Portuguese navy, dedicated to his widow and published at her order. The first half summarizes Ataide's heroic career. He was a distinguished military commander during the War of the Spanish Succession, rising to the rank of lieutenant general, accompanying the Marquês das Minas during his campaign which culminated in the capture of Madrid on 25 June 1706. The second part describes the Conde de Alva's Christian virtues.

Guilherme Francisco Lourenço Debrie (died 1755), who signed the vignettes and initials, was one of the most skilled and prolific engravers in Portugal under D. João V. He came to Portugal from his native France in 1728 along with his compatriots Miguel Le Bouteux (i.e. Jean Baptiste Michel le Bouteux, 1682-1764) and Pedro Massar de Rochefort and worked there until his death.

In 1747 the printer Antonio Isidoro da Fonseca briefly operated an unauthorized printing press in Brazil, producing the earliest documented Brazilian imprints.

José Barbosa (Lisbon, 1674-1750) joined the Theatine Order at age 13, and for some forty years was an esteemed preacher and a prolific author. He was among the first fifty members of the Academia Real de História and served as chronicler of the Casa de Bragança.

Instructions are given on collecting the ingredients and preparing the medicine. Two lengthy printing licenses (preliminary leaves 17-34) include an analysis of the state of pharmacy in Portugal at this time, with comments on the use of opium, antimony, mercury and cinchona (Peruvian bark).

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this *epicedio* (pp. 3-6) and two sonnets lamenting the death of D. Pedro de Alcantara. D. Pedro is probably unique in having abdicated from two thrones on two different continents. He was the first ruler of Brazil after it declared its independence of Portugal, ruling as Emperor Pedro I from October 12, 1822 until April 7, 1831, when he resigned in favor of his son, D. Pedro II. He also reigned as King Pedro IV of Portugal from March 10, 1826, until May 2 of the same year, when he abdicated in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II. He died of tuberculosis in 1834, a few months after the liberals had triumphed in Portugal.

Francisco António Martins Bastos (1799-1868), a native of Lisbon, was a teacher of Latin and of grammar. His most famous pupil was the future King D. Pedro V. He wrote a considerable number of poems in Portuguese and in Latin, as well as works on grammar, philology, and history.

FIRST EDITION (?) of this adaptation for pianoforte of melodies from Bellini's *Il Pirata*. It is similar to a modern overture in the sense that it presents musical highlights meant to be played continuously, although some breaks between the excerpts are marked and the start of a new aria or or duet is indicated by the opening words from the libretto or a by few words establishing the scene.

Il Pirata premiered at Milan's La Scala on October 27, 1827, as one of the earliest works of the lamentably brief career of Vincenzo Bellini (1801-1835), one of opera's greatest bel canto composers. Its influence can be seen in Donizetti's *Lucia di Lammermoor* and Wagner's *Das Liebesverbot*. Romani, the librettist, worked with both Bellini and Donizetti.

This arrangement is the work of Francesco Florimo, a composer in his own right and Bellini's devoted friend and fellow student. Many years after Bellini's death, Florimo wrote the important *Bellini: Memorie e Lettere*, Florence, 1882.

First and Only Edition in Portuguese. In 1791, as the French Revolution was nearing the height of its fury, Charles-Joseph Bevy published *Histoire de la noblesse héréditaire et successive des Gaulois, des François et des autres peuples de l'Europe,* which he refers to in a footnote to the "Advertencia do Author" in the present volume. Firmly believing that "o Povo não pode jámais ser Soberano, nem Legislador," he went on to compose the *Manuel des révolutions, suivi du parallèle des révolutions des siècles précédens avec celle actuelle.* Not surprisingly for a work so opposed to the current political tide, it appeared without place or printer in 1793, and is also a rare book: OCLC locates only 2 copies, both at the Bibliothèque nationale de Paris (464857255 and 457062920). Along with several arguments on the right of kings to rule, Bevy includes a section on Calvinism (pp. 48-60) and another on parallels between earlier rebellions in France and the current one (pp. 61-84).

We have not been able to identify the translator, who signs with the initials "J.P.M." The "Soldado Realista" who signs the dedication includes an excerpt from the epic poem *O Oriente*, by that staunch absolutist José Agostinho de Macedo. He declares that in publishing this manual his aim is to defend the rights of his monarch and the Church, in support of the absolutist King D. Miguel, then in power, who was being opposed by the liberals, led by D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil. D. Pedro, the elder brother of D. Miguel, had relinquished his rights to the Portuguese throne in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II.

The Abbé Bevy (1738-1830), a Benedictine of the congregation of Saint-Maur, was royal historiographer for the province of Hainaut (now partly in France, partly in Belgium). Bevy asked to be named historiographer of Austrian Hainaut, but the Academy of Brussels opined that he did not have adequate qualifications. Around 1785 he was admitted to membership in that Academy. According to the title page, he was also a member of an academy in Richmond, Virginia.

Juan is forced to wait until the Chilean government sends a judge qualified to hear the case.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this poem offering birthday greetings and fulsome praise to D. João, Prince Regent of Portugal, the future D. João VI.

The author, a native of Lisbon (1742-1827), was the son of a capitão mór and governor of the fort of Sancto Antonio de Gorupá, in the capatania of Pará. He served in various ecclesiastical posts: at the time this poem was published he was Abbade de S. João de Gondar; in 1802 or 1803 he became conego of the Basilica patriarchal de Sancta Maria-maior in Lisbon, serving there until his death. He published at least a dozen other works in verse and about a half dozen funeral orations and other religions works in prose, and left much more in manuscript, including more poems and several unpublished plays. One of these was an epic poem in six cantos, "Fariade." According to Innocêncio, the portrait of him engraved at the Arco do Cego Press in 1798 bore (at his request) the legend "Philosopho, Theologo, Orador e Poeta."

FIRST and ONLY EDITION? The author interprets the progress of the nineteenth century in light of the Bible. Among the points he aims to prove is that the power of kings comes from God, and that sovereignty lies with the king, not the people. In Parte Primeira, he cites passages from the Bible, followed by a *nota* explaining their relevance to his own time. Parte Segunda (pp. 35-57) deals mostly with D. João VI. Parte Terceira (pp. 58-98) covers four topics: *constituição*, *castigo e premio*, *coacção*, and *verdade*. The final 8 pages are a copy of an address to D. João VI made on July 10, 1823.

The title page verso has a statement that when he wrote it, the author was not certain that he would have this work published, and that it has been sent to the press almost as it was originally written. He begs the reader's indulgence for non sequiturs, repetition, and "outro qualquer defeito." Immediately below this statement, in a portion of the page that had been blank, is a contemporary printed overslip stating that there was no time to make corrections, and there are also so many typographical errors that one can't even list them.

Innocêncio knew nothing more of Duarte Gorjão da Cunha Coimbra Bottado than what the author himself stated on pp. 75-76 of this work: that he had been a soldier, had published an article supporting D. Carlota Joaquina in 1822, and had written articles for the *Gazeta Universal* and the *Trombeta Lusitana*. Bottado (Torres Vedras, 1782-Lisbon, 1827), a nobleman without title, holder of various morgados, was a firm believer in absolute monarchy who had been with D. Miguel during the Vilafrancada, and supported him against D. Maria II. Decorated with 2 medals during the Peninsular War, he was Military Governor of Alenquer from 1809-1812, and again in 1817.

In a letter written at Bexhill on April 18, 1850, D. Miguel laments that evil-intentioned members of the Portuguese government have refused to allow him the subscription

that was raised in Portugal for his subsistence; yet he promises not to stoop to any "acto incompativel com a minha dignidade e honra" (pp. 3-5). The remainder of the volume includes letters to Portuguese noblewomen and D. Miguel's response, and commentaries printed in newspapers in response to his original letter. The final four-page section is a long poem by J. de Lemos on D. Miguel, printed in *A Patria*.

In 1834, at the end of a six-year civil war, the former D. Miguel I was exiled. Because he refused to accept the terms of the Concession of Evoramonte, he forfeited a pension from the Portuguese government. D. Miguel lived for a time in Rome, in apartments paid for by Pope Gregory XVI, then for several years in England. In 1851—the year after this letter to *A Nação* was published—he married Princess Adelaide of Löwenstein-Wertheim-Rosenberg. He lived in the Grand Duchy of Baden until his death in 1866.

First and Only Edition in Portuguese? Discusses the causes of cholera, predisposition to the disease, its course and prognosis, and autopsies of victims, all based on observations made during the recent cholera outbreak in Paris.

Broussais (1772-1838), one of the most prominent French physicians of his time, published many works on physiology, cholera, mental illness and phrenology that were widely translated and reprinted in Europe and the United States. His research on chronic inflammations, published in *Histoire des phlegmasies chroniques* (Paris, 1808), was conducted while serving as a military doctor with French forces in Spain during the Peninsular War. Appointed a professor of medicine at the Val de Gras, Paris, Broussais founded the influential journal *Annales de la médecine physiologique* (Paris, 1822-34). Near the end of his life he became famous for his lectures on phrenology and on the relationship between life and stimulus.

The constitutional government changed this, dividing the Islands into three administrative districts, being ruled from Ponta Delgada on the Island of São Miguel, Angra on the Island of Terceira and Horta on the Island of Faial, respectively. This installation of a governing body at Horta was regarded as marking the "Independence" of Faial from the government at Angra, a theme repeated during the festivities.

Antonio Silveira Bulcão composed an ode (pp. 11-3). Another ode was recited by the Juiz de Fora Joseph Maria Osorio Cabral (pp. 14-6). A discourse recited at Horta on February 3, 1822 by Father Victorino José Ribeiro, a secular priest, gives thanks for independence from Angra (pp. 17-30). FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The author, a conservative, argues that there can be too much freedom of the press.

José Bernardo da Silva Cabral (Fornos de Algodres, 1801-Lisbon 1869), 1.º Conde de Cabral, was a noted Portuguese politician, serving as minister and secretary of State and deputy to the Cortes. A Chartist, he worked closely with his brother António Bernardo da Costa Cabral, first Conde and first Marquês de Tomar; together, from ca. 1842 to 1846 they formed the "governo dos Cabrais", a virtual dictatorship of Portugal, which largely reorganized the administration of Portugal, solidifying liberal principles along fairly conservative lines. Costa Cabral regained power, this time as Prime Minister, from 18 de June 849 to 26 April 1851. After this the brothers never again were influential in the politics of Portugal. Silva Cabral was in a continual war in the press with his opponents, and supported two periodicals that were politically aligned with his views: Estandarte and Rei e ordem. Innocêncio notes, "A guerra era tanto mais viva, pungente e por vezes affrontosa, quanto os adversarios sabiam que tinham ante si um luctador audaz e de talento. O conselheiro José Bernardo foi um estadista de grande capacidade para o seu tempo, dentro da esphera das idéas que seguia; orador correcto e escriptor vigoroso." Silva Cabral was from 1850 to 1855 7th Grande Comendador do Supremo Conselho afecto ao Grande Oriente Lusitano e 16th Grão-Mestre do Grande Oriente Lusitano.

Rodolfo G. Cantón, sometimes written Rudolfo G. Cantón, was known as Yucatan's Railway King. He was Sole Proprietor and General Manager of the Ferro-Carril de Mérida a Peto (Yucatan). General Francisco Cantón Rosado (1833-1917), perhaps a relative, was the State Governor of Yucatan between 1989 and 1902. He had supported the Emperor Maximilian agaist Juarez, and in 1876, joined with Porfirio Díaz in the Plan de Tuxtepec. He lived at Palacio Cantón in Mérida, where there is a Francisco Cantón Park. He owned haciendas and railroads, and was the superintendent of the Ferro-Carril de Mérida a Valladolid. Both Ferro-Carril de Mérida a Peto and Ferro-Carril de Mérida a Valladolid had the same purchasing agent in New York (Felipe G. Cantón). Palau lists works that were printed in Mérida from 1918 to 1940 by Francisco Cantón Rosado, in all probability the General's son of the same name.

D. José Sebastião de Almeida Neto was born on 8 February 1841 [according to Wikipedia; according to this book the date was 20 January] in Lagos, Portugal. Educated at the Seminary of Faro, he received the sub-diaconate on 20 September 1862 and the

diaconate on 21 May 1864. Ordained on 1 April 1865. Neto he entered the Order of Barefoot Friars Minor on 15 August 1875, adopting the name of Joseph of the Sacred Heart, but continued to work in the parish church of St. Sebastian until 1879. Nominated Bishop of Angola e Congo by D. Luís I of Portugal on 30 July 1879, he was nominated by the King of Portugal to the Patriarchate of Lisbon on 12 July 1883, with papal confirmation as patriarch occurring 9 August. Pope Leo XIII raised him to the rank of cardinal in the consistory of 24 March 1884. As the Patriarch of Lisbon he presided over the wedding of Prince Don Carlos with Amélie of Orléans, in the Church of St. Dominic in Lisbon on 22 May 1886. He participated in the conclave of 1903 that elected Pope Pius X. n November 1907 Neto resigned and retired to a convent of his order. Due to religious persecution with the deployment of the first Republic he fled to Spain and as of 30 May 1913, was residing in the convent of Villarino of Ramallosa. On 4 September 1913, at Sigmaringen Castle, he conducted the marriage of the exiled King Manuel II of Portugal (whom he had baptized, and given first communion and confirmation) and Manuel's second cousin, Augusta Victoria of Hohenzollern. He died 7 December 1920 in Villariño, Galicia, Spain. On 9 December, his body was transferred to Tui, Galicia. The body was received by Bishop Manuel Lago de Tuy, several canons of the cathedral chapter and the Franciscan community of the Colegio de San Antonio. The coffin was placed on a catafalque in the middle of the cathedral. On 10 December, at 11 am, Mass of requiem was sung by D. Manuel Vieira de Matos, Archbishop of Braga. King Alfonso XIII of Spain ordered military honors for the Cardinal. After the Mass, the bishop of Tui delivered the funeral oration. The remains were buried in the crypt of the chapel of San Telmo, the tomb of the bishops of Tui. On 28 April 1928, the body was exhumed and solemnly transferred to Lisbon, where he was buried on 30 April at the tomb of the patriarchs of the Monastery of São Vicente de Fora.

António Cándido [Ribeiro da Costa (São Cristóvão de Candemil, Amarante, 1850-São Cristóvão de Candemil, Amarante, 1922)]—not to be confused with the twentieth-century Brazilian writer—was a significant Portuguese literary figure of the second half of the nineteenth century and early twentieth century. He took part in the polemic "Qestão Coimbrã" as a 15-year-old in 1865, while later joining in and commenting on the dinners of the "Vencidos da Vida". FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Two extremely well-spoken shepherds celebrate the birth of D. José, an heir to the throne born 20 August 1761. As heir to the heir to the throne, the eldest child of the future D. Pedro III and D. Maria, who in 1761 was heir to the throne of her father, D. José I. The newborn D. José was titled Prince of Beira.

D. José I died in 1777, three days after his grandson D. José was married. The younger D. José and his wife had no children. He died of smallpox in 1788, at age 27. D. João (the future D. João VI) succeeded him as heir to the throne.

About Antonio Joaquim de Carvalho, Innocêncio was able to discover only that he died an octogenarian, nearly blind and very poor, in 1817. He suspected that the man had been a hairdresser, and later a dancing-master. A deputy to the Portuguese Cortes discusses who should succeed as the legitimate ruler of Portugal should D. Maria II die without issue: her first child was not born until 1837. He is particularly interested in the ramifications of D. Pedro de Alcantara's abdication and of royal heirs being born or residing outside of Portugal. On pp. 29-40, the author applies his principles to each of the possible heirs to the throne, including D. Pedro II, Emperor of Brazil. The work was written in the aftermath of the Miguelist wars, a conflict that raged for six years over whether D. Maria II or D. Miguel I was legitimate ruler of Portugal. In December 1834, the Cortes banished Miguel and all his descendants from Portugal; two years after this work appeared, the Constitution of 1838 excluded Miguel's descendants from the throne.

Apparently the true second edition, greatly expanded from the first, as opposed to the so-called second edition of 1846, also greatly expanded from the first. This pamphlet concerns the the Battle of Praia Bay, fought by the coast of Terceira Island in the Azores on August 11, 1829, between Portuguese loyalists and a Miguelista fleet as part of the Portuguese civil war between the liberals, in the names of D. Pedro, former King of Portugal, at the time still reigning as Emperor D. Pedro I of Brazil and his daughter D. Maria II, in whose favor D. Pedro had relinquished his rights to the Portuguese throne, versus the absolutist forces of his younger brother, D. Miguel I. The liberals were victorious. Joaquim Bernardo de Melo Nogueira do Castelo, a cavalry lieutenant colonial, fought in the battle. The Miguelistas under command of José António Azevedo e Lemos attempted to disembark troops on Terceira island, but were defeated by loyalist troops under command of the 7.° Conde de Vila Flor (later 1.° Marquês de Vila Flor and still later 1.º Duque da Terceira), who controlled a dozen small forts and artillery batteries along five kilometers of coast. The defeat of the absolutists in this battle was decisive for the affirmation and posterior victory of liberalism in Portugal. After the war, the municipality of Praia was renamed Praia da Vitória.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION [?] of this apparently unrecorded program describing Castilho's mnemonic techniques. More than half of the second and third pages consist of extracts from newspapers describing Castilho's mnemonic activities. Most are in French, from the *Propagateur* of western Flanders, the *Courrier de l'Escant* of Tournay, the Eclaireur of Namur, the Messager of Gand, the Feuille of Saint-Omer, the Courrier du Nord of Valenciennes, and Le Vigilant de Seine et Oise of Versailles. There are also one each in English and Dutch, from the *Times* of London and *Den Vaderlander*, respectively. Beginning toward the end of the third page, and occupying a good part of the final one is an extensive list of newspapers that have reported on Castilho's lectures about memory. In addition to the Times, the Morning Herald (three issues), the Morning Post (two issues), and Gent's Magazine are listed for London. Two Parisian newspapers are listed, six from Brussels, one each from Geneva and Lausanne, and fifty-one more cities and towns from throughout France and Belgium are mentioned, a few being represented by more than one newspaper. The program declares that during the civil war in Portugal, the proceeds from Castilho's lectures were donated to the liberal cause of D. Maria II, in the struggle against her absolutist uncle D. Miguel.

José Feliciano de Castilho de Barreto e Noronha (Lisbon, 1810-Rio de Janeiro, 1879) was the younger brother of the blind poet, literary critic and historian António Feliciano de Castilho, 1° Visconde de Castilho, as well as the journalist and author Alexandre Magno de Castilho, and uncle of the author Júlio de Castilho. Journalist, playwright, poet, literary critic and historian, political activist, physician and lawyer, he wrote three books on the subject of mnemonics, all in French, all published originally in 1831. He also held a doctorate in philosophy from the University of Rostock. After spending the years 1830 to early 1834 in exile, he returned to Lisbon, devoting himself to journalism, founding or co-founding and editing several newspapers. From 1839 to 1842 he took up a diplomatic post in Hamburg, where he published *Traité du Consulat*. In 1843 he became director of the Biblioteca Nacional, serving until 1847, and was president of a commission charged with reforming the Archivo Nacional da Torre do Tombo. He also served as a deputy to the Côrtes several times. After 1847 he spent most of his life in Brazil, where he practiced law while continuing to pursue his literary, theatrical and journalistic interests, returning a number of times to Portugal.

In the mid-1820s, José Manuel Cea was Diego Portales' business partner; their company held the *estanco*, a government-granted monopoly on tobacco, tea, liquor, and playing cards. In return for the monopoly, Portales y Céa serviced Chile's foreign debt. After the monopoly was taken back into government hands in 1826, Portales became the leader of the prominent conservative faction known as *estanqueros*.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The author complains that a law confiscating the goods of Portuguese monasteries, *cabidos* and bishoprics was useful, but was passed too hastily. He proposes a number of changes to the law, including abolition of *vinculos*, revocation of royal gifts, abolition of the *Companhia das Leizirias*, sale of the property of corporations such as those already mentioned, and reduction of bishoprics. By p. 17, however, he's discussing the abolition of pensions for public employees, reduction of the civil service, abolishing the *Conselho d'Estado Administrativo* in favor of a new organization of the government., and a change in the way payments to the government are made.

This letter is addressed to António José de Ávila (1807-1881), later Duque de Ávila e Bolama, a member of the Chartist faction who was at the time secretary of Commerce and Foreign Affairs; Ávila served as the prime minister of Portugal from January to July 1868, October 1870 to September 1871, and March 1877 to January 1878.

Abel Maria Jordão de Paiva Manso, first Barão de Paiva Manso (Coimbra, 1801-1874), published this work under the pseudonym Bruno do Ceo, "Egresso da Ordem

de S. Bruno de Convento de Laveiras." Paiva Manso studied canon law at Coimbra and became an eminent lawyer and jurisconsult, handling several notorious cases such as that of the murderer rancisco de Matos Lobo. In the *Gazeta dos Tribunais*, of which he was a co-editor, he published a large number of useful articles; he also wrote many works on jurisprudence, including the present *Carta*. He was a cavaleiro of the Ordem de N.S. da Conceição de Vila Viçosa and member of the Academia Real das Sciências de Lisboa.



Hernâni [António] Cidade (Redondo 1887-Évora 1975) is best known as an author of literary and cultural history and of literary biography. For a half century, he was a major

force in the cultural life of Portugal. Cidade taught school in Coimbra, Leiria, Porto and Lisbon before moving on to an illustrious career in higher education at the Universities of Porto and Lisbon. In his youth Cidade was linked to the modernist movement, having been involved with the reviews \(\delta guia\) and \(Seara\) Nova, among others. He also collaborated in reviews such as those of the Faculdades de Letras of both Lisbon and Porto, newspapers (especially \(O\) Primeiro de \(Janeiro\)), and numerous collective projects such as the \(Grande\) enciclopédia portuguesa e brasileira and \(Di\) icionário de \(literatura\). With Joaquim de Carvalho and Mário de Azevedo Gomes he edited the \(Di\) divio \(literatura\). With Joaquim de Carvalho dos Santos and Bernardo Marques he founded \(Col\) col\(\delta quio\) — revista de artes e \(letras\) (1959-1970), and with Jacinto do Prado Coelho, in 1971, \(Col\) col\(\delta quio\) | Letras (these last two published by the Gulbenkian Foundation).

Provenance: Américo Cortez Pinto (1896-1979), physician, writer, poet and historian, native of the freguesia de Cortes in the concelho de Leiria. Américo Cortez Pinto studied at Coimbra, interned at Leira, served as a parliamentary deputy, a member of the Lisbon municipal council, and inspector of health studies, among other posts. He contributed to literary reviews such as A Tradição, Contemporânea, A Galera, Letras e Artes, and Ícaro, of which he was one of the founders, along with Ernesto Gonçalves, Cabral do Nascimento, and Luís Vieira de Castro. In addition to a considerable output of poetry, prose, literary and historical works, he is best known for the polemical *Da famosa arte da imprimissão*: da imprensa em Portugal às cruzadas d'Além-Mar (1948), in which he defended the priority of Leiria in Portuguese Christian typography. While Chaves currently is agreed to have been the earliest Portuguese Christian printing site, Cortez Pinto's investigations and conclusions regarding the diffusion of printing in Africa and Asia by the Portuguese remain valuable. Hernâni Cidade was one of Cortez Pinto's closest friends. Others were Afonso Lopes Vieira, Carlos Queiroz, Lino António, António José Saraiva, Sebastião Pestana, and Mário Saa. It includes 25 poems, among them "Á Poesia," "Á minha terra," and "a etc. etc." The earliest published book by Coelho listed by Innocêncio is *A vida de um principe*, Lisbon, 1859; however, Esteves Pereira, *Portugal: Diccionario Historico, Biographico, bibliographico* ... II, 1067, cites *O Livrinho dos Caixeiros*, 1852, title we could not find in Porbase, Jisc, or KVK (51 databases searched).

José Eduardo Coelho (1835-1889), better known as Eduardo Coelho, was a noted writer and journalist. Orphaned at age thirteen, he moved from his native Coimbra to Lisbon, where he apprenticed to a typographer and then went to work for the Imprensa Nacional, in 1857. He published a text in *Jardim litterario* in 1854. In 1864 he and Tomás Quintino Antunes founded the *Diario de Noticias*. Coelho was its director until his death; it remains one of Portugal's most important newspapers. He was also an intimate friend of Eça de Queirós, who collaborated with him in the *Diario de Noticias*. A sculpture of him by Costa Motta (tio) stands in the Jardim António Nobre, Miradouro de São Pedro de Alcântara, Lisbon.

As a parliamentary deputy he represented Mogadouro in the legislature of 1882-1884, and Leiria in that of 1884. Considered a member of the "Geração de 70" along with Antero de Quental, Oliveira Martins, and Teófilo Braga, Cordeiro was influential in introducing German and French literary doctrines to Portugal.

Faustino de Fridão, Amarante, 1850-Amarante, 1922), known as António Cândido, was a Portuguese politician and teacher who gained extraordinary fame as a parliamentary orator. He was called "A Águia do Marão". One of the "Vencidos da Vida" along with Eça de Queirós, Ramalho Ortigão, Oliveira Martins, Guerra Junqueiro, and others, he was elected deputy to the Cortes for the Partido Progressista in the legislatures of 1880-1881, 1884-1887 eand 1887-1889. In 1888 he left his party, returning in 1890. He favored decentralized administration and proportional representation, serving as Ministro do Reino, 1890-1891, helping to put down the 31 January 1891 Revolt. Nominated Peer of the Realm in 1891, he was elected president of the Câmara das Pares in 1905. One of his protégés was the artillery lieutenant Sidónio Pais. After the 1910 republican revolution he abandoned politics, writing for the monarchist press. António Cândido had been President of the Academia Real das Sciências.







José was titled Prince of Beira.

D. José I died in 1777, three days after his grandson D. José was married. Many Portuguese hoped that when D. José succeeded D. Maria I to the throne, he would be influenced by the progressive ideas of the Enlightenment. Alas, in 1788 27-year-old D. José and his wife died of smallpox, without issue. D. João (the future D. 

A duet for piano based on an aria in Rossini's *Barber of Seville*, which premiered in 1816. Anton Diabelli (1781-1858) was an Austrian music publisher, editor and composer. With Pietro Cappi, he established a music publishing business in 1818; they focused on arranging popular pieces such as opera tunes so that they could be played by amateurs at home. Diabelli also wrote guitar music, an operetta, several masses, and piano fourhand pieces like this one that were quite popular. Today he is best known for what began as a publicity stunt: he wrote a patriotic waltz and invited every important Austrian composer to compose a variation on it. Fifty-one composers submitted entries, including Schubert, Carl Czerny, Ignaz Moscheles, and eight-year-old Franz Liszt. Beethoven submitted thirty-three variations, commonly known as the *Diabelli Variations* (Op. 120), which constitutes one of Beethoven's greatest piano works.

Provenance: "P.D.J." stands for "Princesa Dona Januária", the second daughter of D. Pedro I, Emperor of Brazil and King of Portugal as D. Pedro IV, and his first wife Maria Leopoldina, Archduchess of Austria, Empress consort of Brazil, and Queen consort of Portugal (1797-1826), daughter of the last Holy Roman Emperor Franz II (later Franz I of Austria). Dona Januária was born in Rio de Janeiro, in the Palácio de São Cristóvão, Quinta da Boa Vista, 1822. From 1835 until 1845, she held the title Princess Imperial of Brazil, as the heir presumptive of her brother the Emperor D. Pedro II. Her marriage to Prince Luigi of the Two Sicilies, Count of Aquila (brother of D. Pedro II's new wife, Empress Teresa Cristina) was celebrated on 28 April 1844 in Rio de Janeiro. Her husband was a son of King Francesco I of the Two Sicilies and his second wife the Infanta Maria Isabella of Spain. Friction developed between the Count of Aquila and D. Januária's brother, the Emperor D. Pedro II. D. Januária and Aquila were eventually permitted to leave Brazil in October 1844. In 1845, D. Januária's position as heir presumptive, and the restrictions it entailed, was lost with the birth of D. Pedro II's first child, D. Afonso, Prince Imperial of Brazil. The city of Januária in Minas Gerais was named in her honor. She died in Nice in 1901.

FIRST EDITION of this classic Brazilian epic, whose theme is the history of colonial Brazil. Considered to be the finest poem of its time, the *Caramurú* shows historical understanding as well as great literary merit. Santa Rita Durão's work, with its use of indigenous materials, reveals the nascent Brazilian national sentiment and can be seen as preparing the way for Brazilian independence. Romero calls the *Caramarú* "the most Brazilian poem we possess." It is still read by virtually every Portuguese and Brazilian schoolchild.

The main action is the discovery of Bahia by Diogo Alvares Correia, known as Caramurú ("moray") to the Indians. The poem also includes sections on the political and natural history of Brazil, and the rites, traditions, and military discipline of the Indians. Santa Rita Durão followed Camões's model, writing the poem in *ottava rima*, setting out the main action in the first three strophes, invoking the Christian deity and dedicating the work to the Portuguese monarch.

José de Santa Rita Durão (1722-1784), born in Cata Preta, Minas Geraes, embarked at the age of nine for Lisbon, where he joined the Augustinian Order in 1737. He received his degree in theology from Coimbra but soon left for Spain and Italy to avoid persecution. In Rome he found favor with Pope Clement XIV, who named him curator of the Lancisian Library, a position he held for nine years and which earned him the respect of the Roman literati. Soon after his return to Portugal in 1777, he was appointed to the chair in theology at Coimbra University. Before he died in 1784, he destroyed all his other writings: *Caramurú* is his sole surviving literary work. "One line of Brazilian criticism has found him merely a prolix versifier of historical prose. His unusually accurate

This was an attempt at reconciliation after years of conflict between liberal and absolutist elements within the clergy in the Azores.

Frei Estevão de Jesus Maria, O.F.M. (Mafra, 1786-Angra do Heroísmo,1871), was Bishop of Angra from 1827 to 1870. However, due to the 1828-1834 civil war, during which time he adhered to the cause of the absolutist D. Miguel I, he only assumed effective government of his diocese in 1840, and even so, until 1859 was in virtual exile on the Island of São Miguel due to liberal sentiment against him in the Episcopal city of Angra.

The Irmãos filed a reply, and the case went for a final decision to the Senate, for whose benefit this record of the documents relating to the case was printed.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. On August 11, 1829, supporters of the absolutist D. Miguel I under command of José António Azevedo e Lemos attempted to disembark troops at Praia on Terceira island in the Azores, the remaining stronghold of liberal constitutionalist supporters of Brazilian Emperor D. Pedro I, who had abdicated the Portuguese throne in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II. They were defeated by loyalist troops under command of the Conde de Vila Flor, later Marquês de Vila Flor and Duque de Terceira, who controlled a dozen small forts and artillery batteries along five kilometers of the coast. The defeat of the absolutists in this battle was decisive for the affirmation and posterior victory of liberal ideas in Portugal. After the war, the municipality of Praia was renamed Praia da Vitória.

This rare and curious newsletter begins with a "Relação Official da Derrota dos Miguelistas na Ilha Terceira" by the Conde de Vila Flor dated 15 August (pp. 1-5). This is followed by a note which had appeared in the *Morning Herald* from Villa Flor to the Marquês, later Duque de Palmella affirming the victory, an accounting of the naval forces lost by the Miguelistas, a declaration by the Marquês de Barbacena dated 27 August (pp. 5-6), and finally an extract of a letter from London dated 8 October (pp. 6-7), and an article translated into Portuguese, dated 2 October, that had appeared in the *Public Ledger*. This pamphlet was apparently meant for distribution to the inhabitants of Terceira, but it may also have been intended to be smuggled into continental Portugal.

António José de Sousa Manuel de Meneses Severim de Noronha, 1.º Duque de Terceira, 1.º Marquês de Vila Flor, and 7.º Conde de Vila Flor (1792-1860) was a Portuguese military officer, statesman and a leader of the Constitutionalist side in the Liberal Wars, as well as four times Prime Minister of Portugal.

João de Saldanha da Gama Melo Torres Guedes de Brito (Santos-o-Velho, 1773-Bahia, 1809) suceeded as sixth Conde da Ponte in 1802; he was also owner of a huge sugar plantation at Acupe, near Bahia. In 1805 he was appointed governor of the province of Bahia, and as such had the startling experience in January 1808 of greeting Prince Regent D. João and the royal family on their unheralded flight from Portugal

during the Peninsular War. The governor offered them the hospitality of his home and tried but failed to persuade them to make Bahia their capital while they were resident in Brazil. The Conde was still governor of Bahia when he died the following year.

His wife, Maria Constança de Saldanha Oliveira e Daun (Lisbon, 1775—1833, Rio de Janeiro), was the offspring of the first Conde de Rio Maior, João Vicente de Saldanha Juzarte Oliveira e Sousa (1746-1804), and his wife Maria Amália de Carvalho e Daun, the daughter of the Marquês de Pombal.

of Portugal. It is sprinkled with quotes from the classics, both in Latin and Greek. A neo-Latin poem appears on the verso of the title page. Fernandes, a skilled orator, goes through the subjects of the curriculum with a humanist's emphasis on their interrelationships: astrology, music, arithmetic, geometry, grammar, poetry, history, dialectics, medicine, jurisprudence, and theology. He exhorts the students at the University of Coimbra to focus on their studies in the coming year.

Pedro Fernandes was a native of Lisbon and page at the court of D. João III, where his father served the king's sister, the Infanta D. Maria. He was sent to study in Paris, where he received a Master of Arts degree in canon law. After six years he was summoned back to Portugal by the king, to join the faculty of Coimbra University.

Provenance: Guilherme João Carlos Henriques (London, 1846-Alenquer, 1924), author and archeologist. He arrived in Portugal in 1860, fixing his residence at the Quinta da Carnota in the Concelho de Alenquer, which he later inherited upon the death of the Conde de Carnota. Dedicating himself to the study of the region in which he lived, he published in 1873 the results of his studies, Alenquer e seu concelho. A second, revised edition appeared in 1902. More closely related to the present volume, he published in 1896, in two parts, Estudos Goesianos, and George Buchanan in the Lisbon Inquisition, 1906. Henriques was also responsible for publishing a part of the Correspondência do Duque de Saldanha. José Rodrigues Pires, Lisbon antiquarian bookseller and runner, was the brother of João Rodrigues Pires. João established Mundo do Livro in Lisbon shortly after the Second World War. During the 1950s, 1960s and early 1970s Mundo do Livro was one of the most important antiquarian bookshops in Portugal.



Silvestre Pinheiro Ferreira (1769-1846), a native of Lisbon, was one of the most interesting and original Luso-Brazilian political thinkers of his generation. He worked as a diplomat in France and Germany, and went to Rio de Janeiro in 1810. He served D. João VI there and in Lisbon, where, after D. João's return, he was Secretario d'Estado dos Negocios Estrangeiros until early 1823. It was Pinheiro Ferreira who first advised D. João to give Portugal a constitution.

FIRST [?] and ONLY [?] EDITION. Father Fonseca (1802-1869), a native of the Island of Terceira in the Azores, founded and edited 2 newspapers, *Iris da Terceira* and *Clarim terceirense*, wrote for the newspaper *Sentinela constitucional*, taught Latin grammar at Angra do Heroísmo, and was Canon and Dean of the Angra cathedral. This pamphlet was issued to counter attacks on his character. The author published a work in 1844 which begins with the same two words, which we have not been able to see, but think it may be a different text. Ernesto do Canto, *Bibliotheca açoriana*, lists both, without calling this a second edition, and seeming to treat them as distinct works.

# Lamenting the Death of D. Pedro

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this dialogue in verse between Fama, Atropos and Protheo, lamenting the death of D. Pedro; followed by two sonnets. D. Pedro is probably unique in having abdicated two thrones on two different continents. He was the first ruler of Brazil after it declared its independence of Portugal, ruling as Emperor Pedro I from October 12, 1822 until April 7, 1831, when he resigned in favor of his son, D. Pedro II. He also reigned as King Pedro IV of Portugal from March 10, 1826, until May 2 of the same year, when he abdicated in favor of his daughter, D. Maria II. He died of tuberculosis in 1834, a few months after the liberals had triumphed in Portugal.

Ricardo José Fortuna (Lisbon, 1774-1860) was for more than 50 years a prompter at the Portuguese national theaters, including the prestigious Teatro Nacional D. Maria II. He composed a number of farces and *entremezes* that were printed as *literatura de cordel*. (Innocêncio notes that he was not over-scrupulous about publishing the works of others under his own name.) The *Dicionário cronológico* calls him the last representative of eighteenth-century *teatro de cordel*, "cujo espírito chocarreiro e burlesco prolongou nas várias farsas e entremezes que escreveu."

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Rather than dealing specifically with the important archive mentioned in the title, this work concentrates more on the importance of public archives in general. In 1854 the author was given by the Portuguese government the task of inspecting and planning the organizing of the nation's archives, giving rise to

the present publication, which, according to José de Torres in his *História dos Açores*, can be considered the beginnings of modern historiography for the Azores.

Bernardino José de Sena Freitas (1808-1872), a native of Rio de Janeiro, was an official in the Ministry of Marinha e Ultramar, retired at the time this work appeared. Publicist, historian, contributor to newspapers and journals, he was elected a "sócio provincial" of the Academia Real das Sciencias de Lisboa, and belonged to other learned societies. He inherited from his father properties on the Island of São Miguel, living a considerable time in the Azores.


FIRST EDITION. Saldanha da Gama, a faithful supporter of D. Pedro I, here argues against the forced abdication of the Emperor, and discusses the weakness of the Brazilian government before the Regeneration, its mistakes (such as the suspension of civil liberties) during it, and improvements made after it.

The author (1808-1875) was a native of Bahia, son of its governor. He served numerous times in the Brazilian legislature and was Minister to Vienna when the revolt broke out on 7 April 1831.

This pedagogical treatise covers education through adolescence in the sciences, religion and history, with special emphasis on the education of Portuguese princes. It also deals with the education of women (pp. 189-206). Almeida Garrett, in exile in England, addressed this work to D. Maria II of Portugal when she visited England.

Almeida Garrett (1799-1854) was a man of great talent and far-reaching interests: "As journalist, founder and editor of several short-lived newspapers, as a stylist and master of prose, his country's chief lyric poet in the first half of the nineteenth century ... and greatest dramatist since the sixteenth; as politician and one of the most eloquent of all Portugal's orators, an enthusiastic if unscientific folk-lorist, a novelist, critic, diplomatist, soldier, jurist and judge, Almeida Garrett played many parts and with success" (Bell, *Portuguese Literature* pp. 288-89). He was raised to the rank Visconde de Almeida Garrett in 1852.

Rare Brazilian edition of one of Almeida Garrett's early plays. In the preface (pp. 1-2), written in 1839, the author describes the revisions he has made to *Catão* and his feelings about writing drama. *Catão* was originally performed in 1821—while Almeida Garrett was still a student—and published soon thereafter. It was very popular among the young bourgeoisie of Lisbon, who saw it as a reflection of current events in Portugal, with the Cortes Constituintes in the role of the Roman Senate. The second edition, Lisbon, 1830, was substantially revised.

Almeida Garrett (1799-1854) was a man of great talent and far-reaching interests: "As journalist, founder and editor of several short-lived newspapers, as a stylist and master of prose, his country's chief lyric poet in the first half of the nineteenth century ...and greatest dramatist since the sixteenth; as politician and one of the most eloquent of all Portugal's orators, an enthusiastic if unscientific folk-lorist, a novelist, critic, diplomatist, soldier, jurist and judge, Garrett played many parts and with success" (Bell, *Portuguese Literature* pp. 288-89).

# Garrido Behaved Like a Perfect Gentleman

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. In documents dated from September 20 to October 5, 1827, sixteen guests confirm that Garrido behaved like a perfect gentleman at the Independence Day banquet, and did nothing to provoke the insults that were offered to him. The nature of the insults and the identity of the speaker are not mentioned; from another document, we know that the speaker was Governor Francisco de la Lastra.

Garrido (1779-1864), born in Spain, disembarked at Talcahuano in 1818 to fight the Chilean rebels, but shortly afterwards defected to fight with Bernardo O'Higgins. He became a friend and counselor to O'Higgins and to other important figures in the early years of Chile's independence: José Joaquin Prieto, Diego Portales, and Manuel Bulnes. Garrido was a journalist, a diplomat, and a soldier (fighting in the campaign against Peru in 1838 under Manuel Bulnes). From 1837-1843 and in 1846, 1849, and 1852 he served as deputy in the Chilean Congress, and from 1855-1864 as senator.

The first 14 numbers of this weekly newspaper, edited by Francisco Soares Franco, which ran from October 1, 1811 to December 29, 1813. A complete run consists of 75 numbers. In addition to agriculture and commerce, including much on Brazilian products, with prices, there is a significant amount of space devoted to military operations during the Peninsular War. Each issue contains a section on ships which had arrived in Lisbon's harbor.

Soares Franco (1772-1844) was born in Loures, near Lisbon, and died in Lisbon. He was a professor of medicine at Coimbra, a deputy to the Cortes in 1821 and a member of the Royal Council. He also wrote the highly esteemed *Ensaio sobre os melhoramentos de Portugal*, *e do Brazil*, Lisbon, 1820-1821.

Nicolas Joseph Laurent Gilbert (Fontenoy-le-Château, Vosges, Lorraine 1750-1780 Paris) was still living in the provinces when he made his poetic debut. In 1774 he moved to Paris, where he became a loyal supporter of Louis XV and an opponent of the Encyclopaedists. He is most famous for satiric pieces such as *Le Dix-huitième siècle* (1775) and *Mon apologie* (1778).

Emile de Girardin (1802-1881) was a flamboyant French journalist; his conservative newspaper *La Presse*, established in 1836, was enormously popular. In Girardin's 1850 article "Le socialisme et l'impot," he suggested that there was a good socialism (promoting harmony between capital and labor) and a bad socialism (promoting war between them). The article was reviewed jointly by Karl Marx and Frederick Engels.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of Gomes's answer to a friend (and many others) who had complained that they deserved promotion within the Church but hadn't received it. The friend was opposed to the Mesa da Consciencia (established under D. João III in 1532), which had an enormous number of positions under its control, since its purview included the Colégios de São Patrício, dos Catecúmenos, dos Clérigos Pobres, dos Meninos Órfãos, and dos Militares de Coimbra, the hospitals of Nossa Senhora da Luz, Real das Caldas, Real de Coimbra, de São Lázaro de Coimbra and de São Lázaro de Santarém, as well as various *albergarias*, the Recolhimentos de Nossa Senhora dos Anjos, de Lázaro Leitão, de São Cristóvão and de Nossa Senhora do Amparo, and eventually the Ordens Militares de Cristo, de Santiago da Espada and São Bento de Avis.

Of Antonio Gomes, Innocêncio and Barbosa Machado knew only that he had a doctorate in theology. Neither lists any other works.

Caetana Efigenia Salazar and her daughters, a translation of some lines of verse from Horace, and one to a woman singing a modinha. These and other poems by Gouvea were published in editions of Coimbra, 1838, 1855, and 1863.

The "Annuncio" on the verso of the final leaf of number 2 that 6 numbers will comprise a single volume, and upon completion of said volume a general title page for that volume will be issued, along with a general index (in all probability a table of contents), as well as a list of subscribers. It is our speculation that a total of two volumes, each with six numbers, appeared; however, this is but an educated guess.

P. José Fernandes de Oliveira Leitão de Gouveia, a native of Mortagoa, not far from Buçaco, was born in the eighteenth century. A secular presbyter and a well-beloved professor at the Collegio das Artes of the University of Coimbra, he died in 1841 at Quinta do Conço near Mortagoa.

The song was for performance at a ball given by the ladies of Lisbon on October 15, 1823, a lull between two attempts of D. Carlota Joaquina and D. Miguel to oust D. João from power. In 1820, a liberal revolution took place in Porto; in 1821, the Côrtes Gerais gave Portugal its first constitution. When the royal family returned to Portugal that year, after a fourteen-year absence in Brazil, D. João VI vowed to uphold the constitution, but his wife D. Carlota

refused to swear allegiance to it. D. Pedro, their eldest son, refused the Cortes's order to return to Portugal in January 9, 1822, and on September 7, he became the first ruler of independent Brazil.

With Brazil slipping away, absolutists such as D. Carlota quickly became much more popular. She instigated D. Miguel to launch the *Vilafrancada* on May 27, 1823, declaring the restoration of the old regime. Less than a year after that rebellion was put down, D. Miguel and D. Carlota led the *Abrilada* (April 1824), attempting to force D. João to abdicate in favor of D. Miguel. The king, backed by the British, sent D. Miguel into exile and ordered D. Carlota Joaquina to remain at the Palácio de Queluz, and never return to court.

After *O Mastigoforo* ceased publication in 1829, he devoted the years 1829 to 1834 to the periodical *O Defensor dos Jesuitas*.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION [?] of this clandestine broadside condemning forthcoming elections. The Movimento Nacional-Sindicalista was a political movement that briefly flourished in Portugal in the early 1930s. Stanley G. Payne defined them as a fascist movement. Under the leadership of Francisco [Barcelos] Rolão Preto (1893-1977), the National Syndicalists emerged in 1932 from a tradition of Monarchism and Integralismo Lusitano to offer a platform leading to full corporatism of association or unionism in opposition to capitalism and communism. Calling for a totalitarian state, they placed central importance on the Catholic Church and made Catholic identity an important part of their appeal. They adopted the Order of Christ Cross as their emblem, in order to underline their Christian ethos, and set up their own armed militia that became known as the "Blueshirts" (Camisas azuis; inspired by Mussolini's Blackshirts); they also greeted each other using the Roman salute. Their main inspiration was Italian fascism although they were also linked to the Spanish Falange, who shared many of their ideas. But Rolão Preto clashed with José Antonio Primo de Rivera, whom he dubbed "too capitalist", and the MNS wished to add Spanish Galicia to Portugal, a further source of tension with the Falangists. Brigadas de choque, similar to stormtroopers, were established by the MNS although rarely used, with street battles not a feature of Portuguese politics at the time. Growing rapidly in their early stages, they were estimated to have 25,000 members by

1933, 5,000 more than the governing National Union. The National Syndicalists were critical of the regime of António de Oliveira Salazar and the Estado Novo.

Salazar allowed the group to hold a national conference in November 1933, indicating if they abandoned open syndicalism he would bring them into his National Union en bloc. Whilst this proposal was not accepted by the MNS as a group many members approved, resulting in a split within the movement in early 1934, with many of those in favor of the moderate approach rewarded with positions within Salazar's government. Salazar dissolved the group on July 29, 1934, condemning its defense of syndicalism. Preto was arrested two weeks prior to Salazar's dissolution of the organization, on July 10th, and went into exile in Spain. He returned to Portugal several months later, then went into exile for several years, and returned to remain in Portugal. His deputy, Alberto de [Morés] Monsaraz (1889-1959), also went into exile in Spain

#### The Problem with Compasses on Steamships

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Capitão-Tenente Kol was court-martialed over the loss of the steamship *Duque de Saldanha*, which ran aground under his command. Included here are summaries of a substantial number of witnesses, the interrogation of Kol, and his sentence. The shipwreck, claims Kol, was due to a combination of an error in the ship's timekeeping, an error in a map, and a deviation in the compass. Kol claims that the error in the compass was due to the fact that steamships such as the *Duque de Saldanha* were largely made of iron. He cites statistics of compass deviations recorded on British steamships from 1847 to 1853. Also included are translations of articles on compass deviation by William Walker (pp. 31-33) and A.B. Belcher (pp. 33-43).

The large folding map at the end is titled "Carta da Costa de Portugal, por Marino Miguel Franzini." It shows the coast of Portugal from Cabo Silleiro (just north of the Spanish border) south to Peniche, which is 100 km. north of Lisbon. Franzini (1779-1861), who served in numerous high posts in the Portuguese navy and government, was a pioneer of meteorology in Portugal. He was a member of the Academia Real das Ciências de Lisboa and a Grã-Cruz of the Ordem Militar de Cristo.

Joaquim José Cecilia Kol (1805-1880) rose to the rank of rear admiral and was a member of the Supremo Tribunal de Guerra e Marinha. For many years he was Lisbon's capitão do porto. He also served as general secretary for Portuguese India and was a commander of the Ordem de S. Bento de Aviz, a cavalier of the Ordem de Christo, and an official of the Ordem da Rosa (Brazil). Aside from this work, he also published Mappa geral estatistico e historico da India portugueza, contendo a situação geographica dos principaes pontos do litoral, divisão territorial e sua extensão, Nova Goa, 1850.

First and Only Edition in Portuguese? Laboulaye (Paris, 1811-Paris, 1883) was a great admirer of the United States Constitution; his 3-volume history of the United States was published in 1855-1866. During the American Civil War he was a strong proponent of the abolition of slavery. In 1865 it was Laboulaye who proposed the monument to freedom that was designed by his friend, Frédéric Auguste Bartholdi, and dedicated as the *Statue of Liberty*. After the Paris Commune of 1870, Laboulaye was chosen to represent the département of the Seine, and helped establish the Third Republic. This essay was written to the director of the *Journal de Lyon* in response to the latter's question of what system of government would best guarantee the independence of France from foreign domination and also protect the country's liberties and political institutions.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. As governor and intendant of the province of Santiago, Lastra chides his compatriots for not surrendering the goods covered by the <code>estanco</code>—i.e., tobacco, tea, liquor, and playing cards, for which the government of Chile had granted a monopoly to Portales, Céa in exchange for having that private company service Chile's external debt.

Francisco de la Lastra (1777-1852) was an early advocate of Chilean independence and in 1814 served briefly as the country's first supreme director, before signing the Treaty of Lircay. Deported to the Juan Fernández Islands from 1814 to 1817, he returned to take up a position as intendant of Santiago. In the absence of Ramón Freire, Lastra was again the supreme director of Chile for a few months in 1823-1824. Lastra later led the liberals in the Civil War of 1829. After being defeated by General Prieto at Ochagavía, he became a judge and was elected to the *Camara de Diputados* del Congreso Nacional.

The first part of this volume, in 16 leaves, was written as a prequel to the main text: "Antes que falemos do Direito Lusitano ..." (p. 1). It is a history of Portugal with emphasis on the broad outlines of its legal history, from the Romans and Visigoths through the time of D. José, allotting considerable space to D. Manuel and Duarte Nunes de Leão. The anonymous author is fairly critical, mentioning flaws he has found in Barbosa Machado's lives of eminent jurists.

This part of the manuscript ends with a comment that D. José I, "de saudoza memoria" (d. 1777) had planned to revamp the Portuguese legal system, followed by the hope that his daughter D. Maria I will continue the work. By 1792, Portugal was effectively ruled by D. Maria's son, the future D. João VI, so this section of the manuscript probably dates to ca. 1777-1792. We surmise that this first section was written by a different author than the main part of the text; it is certainly in a different hand.

The purpose of this work seems to be to present an overview of current Portuguese law. For instance, the author describes the duties of various magistrates as they have evolved over the years, with frequent references to statutes. The text was perhaps composed when the chief minister of D. José I (ruled 1750-1777), the Marquês de Pombal, was contemplating a massive reform of Portuguese law, as mentioned in the "Historia juridica." A law of 1761 is mentioned on the final leaf. Further study of the legislation cited so copiously throughout the manuscript might narrow the date even further, but the period 1761-1777 seems likely.

The work's first main division (Livro 1°) is entitled "Do Direito Publico." Since there is no Livro 2°, we assume that part of the manuscript was lost—or perhaps it was never composed. Included in the volume as it stands are the following chapters of Livro 1°.

- 1. Do Direito Legislativo
- 2. Do Direito de crear magistrados, with 18 separate Artigos and a total of 71 sections, on various government positions (Dezambargo do Paço, Tribunal da Meza da Conciencia, Tribunal do Conselho da Fazenda, Tribunal do Conselho Ultramarino, Tribunal da Meza Censoria, etc.). Artigo 9° is entitled "Das Rellaçoens da Bahia, e do Rio de Janeiro" (quire 3, f. 3r-v). Artigos 10-15 are on magistrates, judges, and arbiters.

FIRST EDITION? In an introductory paragraph (p. 7), an anonymous writer states that he had been charged with writing a biography of the Visconde do Rio Sado, but then he discovered one by the "distincto escritor Gomes Leal." Gomes Leal's name appears in print at the end of the essay. We have not been able to find an earlier published version: like many of Gomes Leal's works, it may have first appeared in a periodical.

Augusto Correia Godinho Ferreira da Costa (1840-Lisbon, 1909) was named first Visconde de Rio Sado in 1878, by D. Luís I. As a deputy, he proposed that Sunday be legally made a day of rest. As a judge, he was famous for his witticisms from the bench but also for his kindness, and for being the first in Portugal to suspend a sentence. Gomes Leal gives a summary of his career, with emphasis on his time as a judge.

Antonio Duarte Gomes Leal (Lisbon, 1848-1921) was "um dos mais importantes poetas do nosso séc. XIX" (Biblos), and according to Vitorino Nemésio, "além do grande poeta que em muitos momentos foi, um dos mais extraordinários estilistas do verso português e o verdadeiro criador da poesia moderna em Portugal" (quoted in Dicionário cronologico de autores portugueses).

Gomes Leal was briefly a notary's clerk, but became involved in literary circles early on, publishing his first poem in 1866, in the *Gazeta de Portugal*. His first book of poetry, *Claridades do Sul*, 1875, was highly praised—but throughout his career, most of his poems were published in periodicals or as separate pamphlets. (Innocêncio lists well over a hundred such pieces.) They were usually topical, political or satirical, reflecting his radical republican and anticlerical views. *A Fome de Camões*, 1870, was published for the third centenary of *Os Lusiadas*. *A Traição*, 1881, caused a scandal and led to Gomes Leal's brief imprisonment. Gomes Leal was one of the founders of the periodical *O Espectro de Juvenal*, 1872, and *O Século*, 1881. His work was at times ultra-romantic, Parnassian, Symbolist, and Decadent.

After his mother's death in 1910, Gomes Leal converted to Catholicism and lapsed into abject, sleeping-on-park-benches poverty. The state granted him a small pension in 1916 after an appeal by Teixeira de Pascoais and other writers.

José Augusto Correa Leal (1794-1861), a native of Porto, was "Sub-director graduado da secretaria da Camara dos Deputados" of the Portuguese parliament. This and a *Hymno patriotico constitucional* (1821) appear to be his only separately published original works; he translated at least two others.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this liberal hymn in favor of the proposed first Portuguese constitution, which was at the time in draft form; the final version was approved in 1822. The author's name appears on p. [3]. On p. 9, verse 30, it is mentioned that Madeira and the Açores had adhered to the new constitution, and in verse 31 on the same page it is said that Bahia, Pará, Pernambuco and Maranhão are on board. Conspicuously absent is any mention of favorable reaction on the part of Rio de Janeiro, São Paulo, or Minas Gerais. The unfavorable reaction of many of the Brazilian delegates to the constitutional Côrtes was one of the major causes of Brazilian Independence.

José Augusto Correa Leal (1794-1861), a native of Porto, was "Sub-director graduado da secretaria da Camara dos Deputados" of the Portuguese parliament. This and *Epicedio pela dolorosa occasião da Sentida e deplorada morte do Muito Alto e Muito Poderoso Senhor D. Pedro d'Alcantara, Duque de Brangança* (1834) appear to be his only separately published original works; he translated at least two others.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of two rare pieces of short historical fiction. According to Porbase, the author's full name was Joaquim Felizardo de Lima, and his dates of birth and death were 1839-1905. The *Grande enciclopédia*, and several online sources, including the Arquivo Municipal do Porto, give his full name as Joaquim Felizardo de Lima Camelo Pereira da Silva de Sousa Castelo Branco Vilhena e Bourbon, and the Arquivo further states "Foi um dos primeiros elementos antimonárquicos e socialistas do Centro Promotor dos Melhoramentos das Classes Laboriosas. Apesar da sua ascendência aristocrata, foi um republicano convicto que lutou sempre pelas classes laboriosas, sendo alvo de várias perseguições. Fundou um dos primeiros jornais republicanos que apareceu em Portugal, "República Federal". Como escriturário na estação das Devesas, no Porto, foi um dos

principais impulsionadores da greve do Caminho de Ferro do Norte e Leste, pelo que foi demitido. Em 1888 procurou criar o Partido Republicano Radical, na sequência das divisões crescentes entre republicanos desde o III Congresso do Partido Republicano de 1887, que tinha sido suspenso entre fortes tumultos. Porém, esta cisão quase só obteve adeptos na cidade do Porto. 



D. Maria Francisca Benedita (b. 1746) was the youngest child of D. José I (d. 1777) and the widow and aunt of D. Maria I's eldest son, D. José, Duque de Bragança and

Príncipe do Brasil. In 1788 her husband D. José died of smallpox at age 27, without issue. His wife, styled the dowager princess of Brazil, lived until 1829.

Rather than founding convents or churches, in the tradition of most dowagers, D. Maria Francisca Benedita founded a military hospital, the Asilo de Inválidos Militares de Runa (in Torres Vedras). The hospital was dedicated in 1827, on the dowager princess's eighty-first birthday. Today it is a home for retired military personnel, the Centro de Apoio Social de Runa.

Roque Ferreira Lobo (1743-1828) was a native of Torres Vedras. He worked in the postal administration and then for the municipal government of Lisbon. When the hospital was barely begun, he published *Oração gratulatoria á Ser[enissi]ma princeza do Brasil, a Serenissima Sr<sup>a</sup> D. Maria Francisca Benedicta, mandando fundar um sumptuoso edificio para hospital de invalidos, no logar de Runa,* Lisbon, 1793. (None of its content is repeated in the *Panegyrico*.)

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this epic poem, full of religious, mythological, and historical references. OCLC does not locate any copies of this work, but does list 2 others by the same author: *Christiada, poema epico*, Bahia, 1909 (13677309, at Harvard University and University of California-Los Angeles); and *Os Lusos ethereos*, Bahia 1923 (26342561, at Washington University). The advertisement leaf at the end of the volume gives details about 11 works by the author, including a long commentary on *Christiada*.

Given that all three of his known works were published there, Joaquim Teixeira Lopes may have been a native of Bahia. Judging from his author's portrait, he appears to have had at least some Indian ancestry, and possibly some African-American as well.

A chemist and mineralogist, parliamentary deputy, and high government official, he studied mathematics and philosophy at Coimbra University, wrote on subjects as varied as agriculture, finance, and engravings, and amassed an important library. He was a devoted proponent of progress in the national agricultural sector, which he considered one of the primary sources of public wealth. The Casa da Anunciada library of the counts of Rio Maior was one of the best private libraries ever formed in Portugal. It was dispersed for the most part not long after the April 1974 Portuguese revolution.

First edition in Portuguese of Mably's Entretiens de Phocion: sur le rapport de la morale avec la politique, which originally appeared in 1763. This translation from a French edition of The Hague, 1764, includes an introduction by the translator explaining why he considers the work useful for his contemporaries. The life of Phocion (pp. v-xiii) does not appear in the Amsterdam, 1763 edition of Entretiens; it is not clear whether the

translator found it elsewhere, or composed it himself. The *Entretiens* was also translated to Spanish and English.

Phocion (ca. 402-318 B.C.) was elected *strategos* in Athens a record 45 times. His frugal way of life earned him the nickname "the Good." Plutarch included his biography in *Parallel Lives*, which made him well known in the Renaissance and later. (Poussin painted two works based on his story in 1648.) In the preface of the Amsterdam, 1763 edition (not translated here), Mably claimed to have found a manuscript of these conversations at the Monastery of Monte Cassino, just south of Rome.

It was perhaps Phocion's legendary frugality that made Gabriel Bonnot de Mably use Phocion's name here. As the Ancien Régime staggered through its final years, Mably advocated a Republic in the manner of Plato—communism as a way to achieve well-being and moral perfection. The *Conversations* are written as a Socratic dialogue: Phocion attempts to demonstrate to young Aristias that politics and ethics are inseparable and that wisdom and virtue require a love of one's country, which will broaden into a love of humanity.

The Abbé de Mably (1709-1785), philosopher and historian, was an important figure in the history of republican thought during the Enlightenment and the French Revolution. He was the elder brother of Étienne Bonnot de Condillac. Rousseau a lifelong friend, had tutored Mably's and Condillac's nephews, and reflected upon the experience in *Emile*. Although Mably believed that private property was the root of all the ills affecting humanity, he argued that trying to achieve such an ideal would cause as much harm as maintaining the status quo, and therefore advised against revolution.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION, a COMPLETE RUN of this philosophical discourse on topics such as political and royal power, anarchism, rights, liberty, the Anglo-Portuguese alliance, and religious reform.

José Agostinho de Macedo (1761-1831) was a prolific writer of prose and verse, best known for his aggressive pamphleteering on behalf of the absolutists: "Ponderous and angry like a lesser Samuel Johnson, he bullies and crushes his opponents in the raciest vernacular ... his idiomatic and vigorous prose will always be read with pleasure" (Bell, *Portuguese Literature* p. 282). Macedo's high literary reputation among contemporaries proved ephemeral.

As a young man, Macedo caused so much trouble within the Augustinian Order that he was unfrocked in 1792, but an influential friend helped him retain his ecclesiastical status by obtaining a brief of secularization. Soon becoming a leading orator, he was named royal preacher in 1802.

Macedo is notorious for his arrogance in literary matters: he condemned as worthless Homer's poems, which he had never read in the original, and believed his own epic *Gama*, 1811 (reworked and published as *O Oriente*, 1814), could have taught Camões how *Os Lusiadas* should have been written. When the public reception for *O Oriente* was less than enthusiastic, he published *Censura dos Lusiadas*, a detailed and virulent critique of Camões. In *Os Burros*, a satirical poem published 1812-1814, Macedo skewered a host of men and women, living and dead. Barbosa du Bocage's satirical poem *Pena de Taliao*

Macedo is feeling very sorry for himself: "Por que razão este homem, que todo se votou a honra dos Portuguezes, he o mais insultado, vilipendiado, desprezado, e perseguido dos mesmos Portuguezes?" (p. 2). He reports that he has just burned the manuscript of the (unpublished) third volume of his history of Africa, and bitterly insists that when he dies, all that will be found in his home will be his brief of secularization and the letter naming him *pregador* of the royal chapel. According to Innocêncio, this work caused quite a stir in Portugal, both among those who loved Macedo and those who hated him. Macedo's self-imposed moratorium lasted 3 or 4 months and spawned a large number of pamphlets favoring and attacking Macedo.

Antonio Pinto da Fonseca Neves (Porto, 1784-Lisbon, 1836) was convicted of taking part in the conspiracy of Gomes Freire in 1817 and sentenced to ten years exile in Mozambique, which was later changed to serving with the army at Montevideo. Back in Lisbon by 1821, he soon suffered more persecution for his liberal ideas, being confined for a considerable time in the Castelo de São Jorge. Finally released in 1833, he returned in 1836 to serve as governor of the Castelo, but died the same year. He published a volume of *Obras poeticas*, Lisbon, 1822, and several short works, including two in which he argued with José Agostinho de Macedo.

Pato Moniz (Lisbon, near the Arco do Cego, 1781-1827? Ilha do Fogo, Cabo Verde), studied the humanities and devoted himself to literary pursuits from an early age. An intimate friend of Bocage, who was a major influence, like Bocage he became a ferocious literary and ideological enemy of José Agostinho de Macedo, whom he skewered as the mock hero of the comic poem *Agostinheida*. Pato Moniz is a transitional figure between *arcadismo* and romanticism. The son of a minor nobleman, he eventually sold his inheritance and lived by his pen, writing for the theater and editing political and literary newspapers. After the establishment of freedom of the press in Portugal in 1820 he wrote the first political newspaper, *Portuguez constitucional*, which began in September that year and continued on a daily basis for more than two years, with the exception of interruptions when the author was employed editing the *Diário das Côrtes*. A Freemason, he was secretary of the Grande Oriente Lusitano. He was elected from Setúbal to the Côrtes of 1822-1823. Advocating ever more radical measures, immediately following the Villa-franca coup he was sent South of the Tejo and then deported to the Ilha do Fogo in Cabo Verde, where he is said to have died under harsh conditions, probably in 1827.

Although overshadowed by such men as Alexandre Herculano and Silvestre Pinheiro Ferreira, Cavroe was a lively and prolific writer as well as an active workingman and artisan. Thus while he wrote plays, sonnets, odes, a social history of the Portuguese guilds from 1620 to 1834, and polemical pamphlets, he also designed and engraved lithographs, acted as an architect of royal, government and private buildings, and was a cabinet and furniture maker.

Furtado de Mendonça attacks what he considers a multitude of errors in Innocêncio António de Miranda's *Cidadão Lusitano*, Lisbon, 1822. The first 2 editions quickly sold out, and Miranda's extremely liberal stance was attacked by José Agostinho de Macedo and others. After the 1822 constitution had been revoked in June 1823, the Cardinal Patriarch of Lisbon, D. Carlos da Cunha, published a pastoral letter condemning on pain of excommunication the reading of *Cidadão Lusitano*, and it went on the papal Index in 1824.

Luiz Antonio Carlos Furtado de Mendonça (d. 1832) was a native of Rio de Janeiro, son of Antonio Carlos Furtado de Mendonça, who was successively governor of Goyaz, Minas Geraes, and Santa Catharina. He received his doctorate in canon law from the University of Coimbra and served as dean of Braga. While he was with D. João VI in Brazil he was nominated archbishop of Braga, but died before he could take up the position.

Manuel Leite Machado (born 1831), merchant, poet, and playwright, was a native of Chacim, Cabeceiras de Basto, Minho. In 1845 he emigrated to Rio de Janeiro, establishing a factory producing parasols. One of the founders of the Grémio Litterario Portuguez of Rio de Janeiro, he published at least 5 plays, 2 volumes of poetry, and a "romance". Augusto Vidal de Castilho Barreto e Noronha (Lisbon, 1841-Lisbon, 1912), to whom this work is dedicated, was a Portuguese naval officer, son of António Feliciano de Castilho and brother of Júlio de Castilho. Governor-General of Moçambique from 1885 to 1889, later Civil Governor of the district of Porto, and Minister of Marinha e Ultramar from 4 February to 25 December 1908, he collaborated in the press and directed the Review *Brasil-Portugal*. He ended his career with the implantation of the Republic, having attained the rank of Major-general da Armada. As Comandante da corveta *Mindello*, Augusto de Castilho granted asylum to the Brazilian insurgents who had engineered a revolt of the fleet in the harbor of Rio de Janeiro on 13 March 1894. In the final phase of his career he was ambassador of Portugal to the Holy See,, negotiating the Concordat of 23 May 1886. FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this eulogy and brief biography of Josefa Soller (Lamego, 1822-1864, Lisbon), a well-known actress. Daughter of the owner of a small acting company, she first appeared on stage at age three. As a young woman she danced as a ballerina with the company at São Carlos, but had to return to acting due to physical problems. Julio Cesar Machado, who attended her very successful debut in *Ciganinha*, wrote: "Comquanto a natureza fosse cruel para com a Soller, baixinha, sem voz, sem olhar, sem elegancia,—o trabalho, que é um segundo talento, valeu-lhe e elevou-a. Chegou a ser notavel grande" (quoted by Reis Gomes).

Soller married the actor Antonio Maria de Assis; their sons Julio and Alfredo also became actors. She resigned from the stage in 1859. João dos Reis Gomes calls Soller "uma artista que poude dominar as multidões unicamente pelo poder dos factores mentaes do seu talento .... In the first letter, dated 8 April 1826, José Agostinho de Macedo writes to Mesquita e Mello to acknowledge receipt of an *Elegia*, another poem written by Mesquita e Mello following the death of D. João VI. Macedo hails Mesquita e Mello's *Elegia* as "excellente, e mui judicioza e sublime" and compares its author to the great blind poets such as Homer and La Moth. Macedo had been asked to speak a funeral oration for D. João, and promised to send a copy of the oration to Mesquita e Mello.

In the second letter, dated 14 April 1826, Mesquita e Mello calls Macedo "o maior sabio de huma Nação" and "o esmalto de Literatura Portuguesa."

José Agostinho de Macedo (1761-1831) was a prolific writer of prose and verse, best known for his pamphleteering: "Ponderous and angry like a lesser Samuel Johnson, he bullies and crushes his opponents in the raciest vernacular ...his idiomatic and vigorous prose will always be read with pleasure" (Bell, *Portuguese Literature* p. 282). Macedo was also well known for his arrogance in literary matters: he condemned as worthless Homer's poems, which he had never read in the original, and believed his own epic *Gama*, 1811 (reworked and published as *O Oriente*, 1814), could have taught Camões how *Os Lusiadas* should have been written. Toward the end of his life Macedo became Court preacher and chronicler, and a friend of D. Miguel.

He had defended himself in the newspaper *Astro da Lusitania* and in a pamphlet, *Exposição justificativa ...*, in which he protested his innocence of charges that he had been a corrupt magistrate during his 9-year tenure (1806-1815) as *juiz de fora* on the island of São Miguel in the Açores. Pacheco de Melo ("da Ilha da Madeira," according to the title page) replies, providing details of alleged corruption in Ponta

Delgada, Vila da Lagoa and Ribeira Grande. Among other malfeasance, João Pacheco de Mello accuses Roque Francisco de Mello of stealing 5% of the income intended for orphans in Ponta Delgada.

Luis José de Mello was born in Bardés, Portuguese India, and graduated with honors from the Escola Polytechnica and the Escola do Exército in Lisbon. As a captain of infantry, he returned to India to teach at the newly established Aula de Física, Química, e História Natural. He died at Goa in 1858.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of the author's first published work, apparently celebrating the arrival in Lisbon of one of the contenders in the War of the Spanish Succession. The four-page dedication to the seventh Duque de Medina do Rio-Seco is followed by a sonnet praising the martial spirit of D. Pedro II, King of Portugal 1683-1706. A poetic *glosa* follows, with one stanza elaborating on each of the sonnet's 14 lines. The poetry is in Spanish, while the rest of the pamphlet is in Portuguese.

In September 1703, Archduke Charles of Austria was acclaimed D. Carlos III of Spain at Vienna. A few months later, D. Pedro formed a military alliance with Great Britain and Austria aimed at invading Spain. D. Carlos (now styled "S. Magestade Catholica," as in the title here) arrived in Lisbon in March, and Portuguese and English generals planned an invasion of Spain from the frontier at Beira. D. Pedro and D. Carlos unsuccessfully attacked Ciudad Rodrigo that September; then both returned to Lisbon. The following year, D. Carlos changed his tactics, sailing on an English fleet to Catalunya.

The dedicatee, Juan Tomás Enríquez de Cabrera y Ponce de Leon (1646-1705), was the eleventh (and final) hereditary Admiral of Castile; he also served D. Carlos II of Spain as governor of the Duchy of Milan (1678-1686), viceroy of Catalunya (1688), and ambassador to Rome and France. During the War of the Spanish Succession, the Duke sided with D. Carlos (a Habsburg) rather than the future Philip V (the Bourbon claimant), and was exiled from Spain. He served as a field marshal of the Holy Roman Emperor in 1705, and died at Estremoz.

Cunha de Mendonça was born in Lisbon and is believed to have died at the age of 32. Garcia Peres notes that he also wrote *La adoracion de los Magos*, an *auto cómico* published Lisbon, 1708, and left some unpublished works.

The collection includes pieces printed at Mérida de Yucatán, Durango, Puebla, Ciudad Victoria, Chihuahua, Tlapam, Tabasco, San Luis Potosí, Ures, Jalapa, Saltillo and Tlaxcala. Such provincial printing from Mexico is quite rare. Of these works 17 are not in *NUC* and six more are cited at only one or two locations. Only five (four in copies inferior to those offered here) appeared in the celebrated Streeter sale—Streeter presumably would have been interested in all, or virtually all, of the items present in our collection, given his strong interest in Mexico, Texas and the Southwest.

The constitutions and legislation for the Federal Republic of Mexico also applied to much of the southwestern United States (California, Nevada, Arizona, New Mexico,

Utah, Colorado, Texas) until Texas declared its independence in 1836 and Mexico ceded the area north of the Rio Grande following the Mexican-American War, 1846-1848. The states of Chihuahua, Sonora and Tamaulipas included present-day United States territory. The 1829 Leyes y decretos del honorable congreso segundo constitucional del estado de Chihuahua, for example, decreed relief for flood victims in El Paso (Texas). And the 1848 Mensage del ciudadano General Francisco Vital Fernandez describes not only the loss of Laredo to the United States, but also the ravages inflicted on Tamaulipas by American forces and, after war's end, by American outlaws.

The wildly successful *Robert le Diable*, first performed in Paris, 1831, is considered one of the earliest examples of grand opera, with dramatic music, a melodramatic plot, and sumptuous staging. Paulo Midosi Junior (1817-1888), son of a political writer of the same name, graduated from the University of Coimbra in 1850 and practiced law in his native Lisbon. He began his literary career at age 17, editing journals such as *O Mercurio* and *O Mosaico*. Also ("promiscuamente com os referidos," says Innocêncio), he published dramas such as *O Entreacto*, 1840, and *O Senhor José do Capote*, 1856, a parody of *Il Trovatore*. Midozi collaborated with Almeida Garrett in writing the farce *Corcunda por amor*.

There is no N.\* in Martinho da Fonseca or Guerra Andrade. We have not been able to determine who this was, or if such a collaborator even existed.

This piece was one of the earliest performed at the Theatro do Gymnasio (or Teatro do Ginásio) in the Rua Nova da Trindade. It was established in 1845 as the Gymnasio Lisbonense; after a renovation in 1846, it was renamed. During its hundred-year history, it specialized in comedies.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION [?] of this rare resumé of Marshal Beresford's instructions to the Portuguese army on parade-ground maneuvers. The 2 folding plates show the troops in formation and direct movements of the various sections. The author was a lieutenant in the Regiment of Voluntários Reais das Milícias de Lisboa Oriental. He appears to have been posted to the secretariat of the general staff of Marshal Bersford's headquarters. Porbase cites eight titles printed by António Nunes dos Santos, ranging from 1809 to 1822. Three deal with Ordens do dia by Beresford ranging from 1809 to 1815, one is an Ordem do dia by the Ministério do Exército dated 1809, while one is an Almanak militar printed in 1809. The other three appear to be literatura de cordel, an Auto and a Farsa, dated 1820 and a Testamento dated 1822.

Provenance: The first Conde de Bomfim, José Lucio Travassos Valdez (1787-1862), served in the Peninsular Wars and was in charge of putting down both the rebellion under the Conde de Amarante in 1823 and the Miguelist insurrection in Tras-os-Montes a few years later. He was governor of Madeira and served with Costa Cabral and Rodrigo da Fonseca on the Conselho. When the Maria da Fonte movement broke out he was named commander of the government forces in the south, but having been captured in late 1846 by the Duque de Saldanha, was deported along with his two eldest sons to Angola for the duration of the war. Travassos Valdez's oldest son, José Bento Travassos Valdez, succeeded to the title. The third Conde, José Lucio Travassos Valdez (1841-1926) had been born in Luanda. FIRST and ONLY separate EDITION? Report of the evidence against several men accused of participating in the May 18, 1828 liberal rebellion in Porto against the absolutist regime of D. Miguel I; some were sentenced to lifelong exile, others to the galleys, yet others were executed. The execution of 12 opponents to Dom Miguel was performed in two distinct moments. The first one took place on May 7th, 1829. Among the condemned were the following names: Bernardo Francisco Pinheiro, Clemente da Silva Melo Soares e Freitas, Francisco Manuel Gravito da Veiga Lima, Francisco Silvério de Carvalho, Joaquim Manuel da Fonseca Lobo, José António de Oliveira da Silva Barros, José Maria Martiniano da Fonseca, Manuel Luís Nogueira, Vitorino Teles de Medeiros, António Bernardo de Brito e Cunha. The second execution moment took place on October 9, 1829, involving the following prisoners: Clemente de Morais Sarmento and João Ferreira da Silva Júnior.

Second edition? The work was first published in 1757 to counter rumors that a comet would predict a major disaster or disasters; the case of the Lisbon earthquake of 1755 is discussed (p. 28). The work explains that comets are natural phenomena, giving a good idea in lay terms of their astronomical significance, and explains that they have no influence on earthly events. Halley's Comet duly appeared in 1759. The printing of a second edition in 1818 coincided with the appearance of a different comet, and was also meant to quiet rumors of impending doom.

Morganti was born in Rome in 1709, had a degree in canon law from Coimbra and was a secular presbyter. He had a benefice at the Basilica de Santa Maria.

This bronze statue, dedicated on D. José's sixty-first birthday, is among Lisbon's most important monuments, dominating one of the major squares of Europe, the Praça do Comercio (a.k.a. "Black Horse Square" or as the "Terreiro do Paço"). The Portuguese text appears on the recto of the first leaf, the Greek text on the recto of the second leaf.

Oliveira (d. 1812) was appointed professor of Greek at the Colégio Real dos Nobres in 1771. The Greek dictionary for which he was given a pension remained incomplete at his death, and was never published. Oliveira was also appointed one of the Directores

Litterarios of the Impressão Regia, serving until 1807. In that capacity he prepared the *Diagnosis typografica dos caracteres gregos, hebraicos, e arabigos* (1804), a handbook to the proper setting of Greek, Hebrew and Arabic texts for the compositors of the Impressão Regia. He also wrote a text for students of Greek and a few works on Greek authors.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION? This extremely rare work passionately defending comic theater was published in La Serena, capital of the Coquimbo region in northern Chile. O'Loghlin considers comedies in terms of morality, utility, and convenience, describes the state of drama in Chile (which lacks permanent theaters and schools for

aspiring actors), and presents a sweeping historical survey of comedy in France, Rome, Spain, Rio de Janeiro, and ancient Greece. O'Loghlin frequently refers to specific actors.

O'Loghlin was an Irish comic actor who managed Valparaiso's theatrical stock company. In Lima in 1854, he mounted an early dramatic adaptation of Harriet Beecher Stowe's *Uncle Tom's Cabin. Preocupaciones* is dedicated "A los distinguidos e ilustrados censores de Santiago D. Ventura Blanco y D. Victorino Lastarria, en prueba de aprecio y respeto."





FIRST EDITION of the Rule for the crusading Order of Aviz (the equivalent of the Order of Calatrava in Spain), and one of the earliest and most important books in the Portuguese language. This is the first book printed in Almeirim, probably produced at a time when the Court was in residence there. Only two sixteenth-century books were printed in Almeirim.

The Order of Aviz was the first of the military orders founded by the kings of Portugal, possibly established as early as 1162. It played a vital part in the foundation of the Portuguese nation and in the struggle against the Moors. While the Orders of Christ and S. Thiago also fought for the independence of Portugal at the end of the fourteenth and beginning of the fifteenth centuries, the Order of Aviz took the lead. It was Dom João I,

Master of Aviz, who vanquished the Castilians at Aljubarrota and founded the dynasty that reigned in Portugal under the name of Aviz for nearly two centuries.

Herman de Campos is recorded as a printer in Portugal between 1509 and 1518. Only 12 works are known from his press: one at Setúbal, ten at Lisbon, and this lone production at Almeirim. The only sources of information on him are his colophons, from which it appears that he came from Germany, possibly Kempen, in the Rhineland: his earliest work is signed "Herman de Kempis alemão." He may also have been the first officially appointed Portuguese royal printer. (See Norton pp. 499-500.)

Of the seven other copies known of this work (several incomplete or otherwise in poor states of preservation), only one is in North America: the Palha copy, at the Houghton Library, Harvard University. Other locations are: British Library, Biblioteca Nacional-Rio de Janeiro; Biblioteca Pública e Arquivo Distrital de Ponta Delgada; Palace Library, Vila Viçosa (King Manuel's copy); Municipal Library-Évora; and Biblioteca Nacional de Portugal. This last, missing a leaf and in poor condition, was apparently the only copy to appear at auction in Portugal in the twentieth century: it was in the Azevedo-Samodães sale (lot 2658), purchased by Vítor Ávila Perez (lot 6269 in his sale).



D. Joaquim Pedro Quintela, 1.º Conde de Farrobo (1801-1869) was a Portuguese aristocrat and businessman, the heir and successor of the great capitalist and landowner of the same name, D. Joaquim Pedro Quintela, 1.º Barão de Quintela. Farrobo was a noted philanthropist and patron of the arts. He amassed great wealth and influence owing to his intense activity in the world of industry and business. Even though the Conde de Farrobo had an unquestionable role in the political, social, and cultural life of Portugal, he is perhaps best remembered today for his legendary parties of great opulence and excess. Some claim that the Portuguese word farrobodó (meaning a big, raucous party or event) derives from Farrobo. In later life most of Farrobo's fortune was lost.

Augusto Joaquim Henriques Ribeiro de Paiva studied medicine at Coimbra and was awarded the Ordem de Christo for his services during the 1857 cholera outbreak, about which he published *Relatorio da cholera-morbus asiatica no concelho de Villa-franca de Xira no anno de 1855 para 1856*. Innocêncio states that he was born late in the eighteenth century in Castello Branco, and was still alive in 1858; according to Guerra Andrade, *Dicionário de pseudónimos e iniciaes*, p. 412, he died in 1864..

FIRST EDITION of a work containing much commentary on the Peninsula Wars. Also included are references to the Portuguese court at Rio de Janeiro, to campaigns in Austria, Germany, and Russia under Bonaparte, and to the author's service under Louis XVIII.

Martins Pamplona (1760-1832) a native of Angra, member of a titled family from that city on the island of Terceira in the Açores, served on the Black Sea under Romanzoff against the Ottomans in the Russo-Ottoman war of 1787-1791, receiving decorations for his valor. He fought under the Duke of York in the siege and taking of Valenciennes in the summer of 1793, and also campaigned in Roussillon from 1793 to 1795. Upon the dissolution of the Portuguese army after the French invasion led by Junot in 1807, he joined the Legião Portuguesa with the rank of colonel, serving at Salamanca, then in Germany and Austria, returning to Portugal in 1810 under Masséna, where for a while he was French military governor of Coimbra. In this pamphlet he defends himself and his wife against accusations of high treason for collusion with the French. Expelled from Portugal, he served with distinction in the Legião Portuguesa in Russia in 1812. Later he served in the French army under Louis XVIII at Gand, and was military governor of Loire et Cher in 1815. Remaining in exile in France until 1821, he returned to Portugal under amnesty, and was thereafter embroiled in the ongoing struggle between the Liberals and the Absolutists, on the side of the more conservative liberals. He had been created Barão de Pamplona by the French during his exile, at some point became a general officer, and was made Conde de Subserra by D. João VI in 1823, in appreciation of his help during the Vilafrancada. Holding various ministerial and ambassadorial posts, the Conde de Subserra was for a time effectively Prime Minister of Portugal under D. João VI. In 1827 he became a vegetarian, supporting animal rights. Dom Miguel had him arrested in 1828 and imprisoned in the Torre de Belem, then in São Julião da Barra and São Lourenço de Bugio. Finally he was transferred to the prison in the fortress of Graça in Elvas, where he died.



The second homily, preached on the feast of St. Bernard, is particularly concerned with *conselhos Evangelicos* and free will.

We have been unable to determine which bishop of Parma was the author of these two essays, or if indeed a bishop of Parma was the author, but the author may have been Cardinal Carlos Francesco Caselli, O.S.M. (1740-1828), archbishop of Parma from May 28, 1804, or more likely his predecessor, Adeodato Turchi (1724-1803), a Capuchin. Two years earlier the same printer published another work, probably by the same bishop: Dissertação sobre os regulares, a que se ajuntão duas homilias do bispo de Parma, que tem alguma relação com o mesmo objecto.

Apparently the FIRST and ONLY EDITION. *O Passatempo*, edited by José Avelino d'Almeida, was the first periodical printed in Valença. This issue includes an excerpt on Valença from a work by Fr. Francisco da Piedade on the principal towns of Portugal and the genealogy of important Portuguese families; the work was apparently completed in 1827, but left in manuscript. The remainder of the issue is taken up with poetry and *maximas morais*. Innocêncio mentions this periodical in passing, without any information on when or for how long it was published. Almeida (b. 1807 in Vianna) settled at Valença to teach Latin, and while there established Valença's first theater as well as a printing press.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Hintze Ribeiro (Ponta Delgada, 1849—Lisbon, 1907), was three times Prime Minister of Portugal during the reign of King D. Carlos I (23 February 1893 to 7 de February 1897; 26 June 1900 to 20 October 1904; and 19 March 1906 to 19 May 1906). One of the longest serving Prime Ministers in Portuguese History, politician, statesman, and nobleman, he was a prominent parliamentarian and Peer of the Realm, Attorney-General of the Crown, Minister of Public Works, of Finance and Foreign Affairs as well as uncontested leader of the Regenerator Party. He was one of the dominant politicians of the final years of the Portuguese Constitutional Monarchy, responsible for important reforms, some of which are still in effect, such as the insular autonomy for the Azores and Madeira islands (1895), the pharmacies' law, and forestry law (1901).

Francisco José Patrício (Vitória, Porto, 1850-Porto, 1911) secular priest, knight of the Order of Santiago, renowned sacred orator, and historical investigator. In addition to 3 volumes of published sermons collected under the title *Trabalhos Oratórios*, his *Telas Românticas* was a collection of various youthful writings, while he also published numerous articles in newspapers, such as *Comércio Português, Jornal do Porto, Província*, and *Jornal da Manhã*. Elected parliamentary deputy from Porto in 1881, from Viana do Castelo in 1896, then again from Porto in 1901 and 1904, he belonged to several learned societies, such as the Real Sociedade Humanitária do Porto, the Instituto de Coimbra, the Sociedade de Geografia de Lisboa, and the Sociedade dos Arqueólogos e Arquitectos Portugueses.

Juan Prim y Prats, 1st Marques de los Castillejos was a Catalan-Spanish general and statesman born at Reus, 1814, who spent a significant time in exile due to his prodemocratic views. He was briefly Prime Minister of Spain during the short reign of King Amadeo I, being shot upon leaving the chamber of the Cortes on 28 December 1870. He died two days later.

José Paúl y Angulo (Jerez de la Frontera, 1842-París, 1892) was a Spanish politician and writer. From a wealthy family, he first met General Prim in London. Elected deputy to the Cortes from Jerez de la Frontera in 1869, after 1871, he spent most of the rest of his life in exlile, in Perú, Ecuador, Chile the United States, and Paris, settling for a good part of the time in Argentina.

The work must have been used for Portuguese recruits to the French army, including the Legião Portuguesa during the the campaigns following the 1807 French invasion of Portugal during the Peninsular War. Organized in February 1808 from some of the best units of the disbanded Portuguese army, the Legião Portuguesa left Portugal for Salamanca en route to France during April 1808. It fought at Wagram, Smolensk, Vitebsk, and Borodino, being disbanded May 5, 1814,

This debate over permitting two Peruvian ministers to Chile hinges on whether allowing two ministers implies acceptance of the legitimacy of both governments, or whether such recognition merely establishes a means of communication with those governments. The anonymous author, responding to articles in *El Araucano* and *El Mercurio*, discusses diplomacy, maritime law, and the rights of nations, with mention of blockades, General Luis Orbegoso, the United States before it won its battle with Great Britain, D. Miguel in Portugal, and Grotius. Given the frequent mentions of Santa Cruz and Bolivia, this pamphlet was certainly published during Orbegoso's term as president of North Peru (February 7-August 11, 1836). The mention of a letter from Bolivia dated July 8 narrows the time down to late July or early August 1836.

The author of *Dos legaciones* questions the legitimacy of the 1833 election that brought Orbegoso to the presidency, as well as Obregoso's authority in Peru after he allied himself with President Andrés de Santa Cruz and formed the Peru-Bolivian Confederacy, of which Santa Cruz was Supreme Protector and Orbegoso merely the president of the Republic of North Peru. Many Peruvian politicians who opposed the idea of the confederation fled to Chile, where they were supported by Diego Portales.

António Manuel da Fonseca (Lisbon,1796-Lisbon,1890) was a Portuguese painter, illustrator and theatrical designer best known for his mythological and historical scenes. His first studies were with his father, João Tomás da Fonseca, a painter and sculptor. His

first known work is a panel depicting King João VI and D. Carlota Joaquina, executed in 1820 at the Palácio das Laranjeiras for Joaquim Pedro Quintela, 1.º Conde de Farrobo and his wife. Two years later, he produced a large series of frescoes at the Palácio de Quintela, mostly scenes from the Roman-Sabine wars, landscapes showing Rome and its environs and miscellaneous themes from Greek mythology. In 1825, he painted curtains for the Teatro Nacional de São Carlos, followed by a portrait of D. Pedro IV. Supported by the King and Conde de Quintela, he was able to go to Rome to complete his artistic training with Vincenzo Camuccini and Andrea Pozzi. He also spent time in London and Paris. Returning to Portugal in 1836, he was appointed a Professor of history painting at the Academia de Belas-Artes. In 1838, he designed costumes for a play by Almeida Garrett and did set designs for the opera Robert le diable by Giacomo Meyerbeer. Together with the lithographer, Maurício José Sendim (1786-1870), he created illustrations for the Quadros históricos by António Feliciano de Castilho. Fonseca. Fonseca continued to exhibit frequently, culminating in 1880 with a major exhibition in the Palácio de Cristal in Porto. He also served as drawing master to the future King Carlos and his brother D. Afonso, Duque do Porto.

Manuel José de Araújo Porto-Alegre, Barão de Santo Ângelo (Rio Pardo, Rio Grande do Sul, 1806-Lisbon, 1879), was a Brazilian Romantic writer, painter, architect, diplomat and professor, considered to be one of the first Brazilian editorial cartoonists ever. He is the patron of the 32nd chair of the Brazilian Academy of Letters. In 1826 he studied under Jean-Baptiste Debret at the Imperial Academy of Fine Arts in Rio de Janeiro. In 1831, he left Brazil for Europe along with Debret, in order to improve his painting techniques. In 1835, he went to Italy, where he met another Brazilian poet, Gonçalves de Magalhães. Porto-Alegre and Magalhães would create in France, in the year of 1837, a short-lived magazine named Niterói, along with Francisco de Sales Torres Homem. In 1840 Porto Alegre was named the official painter and decorator of Emperor Pedro II's palace. He decorated the imperial palace in Petrópolis, the wedding of Pedro II with Teresa Cristina of the Two Sicilies and the emperor's coronation. Reuniting with Gonçalves de Magalhães and Torres Homem, he founded Minerva Brasiliense, a review that ran from 1843 to 1845, in which appeared his poem "Brasiliana". In 1844, with Torres Homem he founded the humor magazine Lanterna Mágica, where his caricatures appeared. In 1849, Porto-Alegre founded the magazine Guanabara, with Joaquim Manuel de Macedo and Gonçalves Dias. Considered the official journal of the Romantic movement in Brazil, it ran until 1856. After a brief fling with municipal politics, from 1854 to 1857 he was headmaster of the Imperial Academy of Fine Arts. In 1860, Porto-Alegre embarked on a diplomatic career, where he served as the consul of the Empire of Brazil in the Kingdom of Prussia, the Kingdom of Saxony and later in Portugal, where he died. His title was granted by D. Pedro II in 1874.

He edited two publications, *Carapuças* (1876) and *Sonhador* (1877) at an early age. and in 1879-1880 colaborated with Leite de Vasconcelos in the *Cancioneiro português*. Afterwardshe published several lyric poems, as well as *Evangelho da revolução* (1881; 2nd ed., 1883). The recipient of an affectionate letter from Victor Hugo, he collaborated in a number of republican projects, and in virtually all the newspapers and reviews of his time.

The document is signed in print by Diego Portales (1793-1837), the leader of the prominent *estanquero* party on Chile, which was composed mostly of conservative businessmen. After the Chilean Civil War of 1829, José Tomás Ovalle was named president (March 1830 to May 1831). Portales became his "universal minister," and his ideas shaped the Constitution of 1833, which remained in force until 1925. Portales remained a powerful figure until his death in 1837.



This Alvará, signed in print at Lisbon on 9 May 1658 by the Queen, revokes the Companhia Geral do Brasil's monopoly on wheat, wine, oil and bacalhão, recognizing that free trade in those goods would result in a greater supply of them in Brazil. There are also provisions regarding sugar and the departures of the Company's fleets to and from Brazil.

In a royal decree of 11 August 1791 (the first 6 pp.), D. Maria accepts the resignation of the *Corretor e Provedor dos Seguros* (insurance broker) in Lisbon. FIRST and ONLY EDITION [?] of a pivotal decree for the history of medical education in Portugal. The Royal School of Surgery, established in Lisbon in June 1825, was transformed by this decree into the Schools of Surgery and Medicine (Escolas Medico-Cirurgicas) of Lisbon and Porto. The staff was greatly expanded, with new chairs in medicine added and significant changes in the curriculum. The decree sets out these changes, indicating the proposed course of study, examinations, requirements for matriculation and graduation, and the salaries and duties of professors. Provision is also made for the annexation of a school of pharmacy. The printed signature of Manuel da Silva Passos appears under that of the Queen at the beginning, and again at the end, for the Secretaria d'Estado dos Negocios do Reino.

Manuel da Silva Passos, better known as "Passos Manuel" (1801-1861), was a native of São Martinho de Guifões, Bouças (today Matosinhos, a suburb of Porto). He had been a key figure in the left-wing liberal *Setembrista* revolt of 9 September 1836. In the government formed by the Visconde de Sá de Bandeira, which held power from 5 November 1836 to 1 June 1837, Passos Manuel was simultaneously Ministro do Reino (a portfolio he had held since 10 September 1836), da Fazenda and da Justiça. During this time the Ministro do Reino was responsible for education, and in less than nine months Passos Manuel was responsible for a series of sweeping reforms. Many had long-lasting results, surviving the vicissitudes of political fortune. The decree announced in the present document was one of these.

Carlos João Rademaker, better known as Carlos Rademaker (Lisbon, 1828-Lisbon, 1885), was a Jesuit priest, responsible for the reintroduction of the Jesuit Order to Portugal, after the expulsion of the Jesuits from Portugal by the Marquês de Pombal in 1759 (there had been an ephemeral presence of the order in Portugal between 1829 and 1833 under D. Miguel I). Father Rademaker entered the Jesuit Order in 1846, in Italy, returning to Portugal soon thereafter. Thanks to his tireless efforts, in September of 1863 a Portuguese Jesuit mission was formed under the Italian Father Francisco Xavier Fulconis. By 25 July 1880 the Superior General of the Order, Pieter Jean Beckx decreed the restoration of the Provincia Portuguesa da Companhia de Jesus, with nine communities, three colleges, and 137 Jesuits.

José Máximo Rangel (1750s-1828) was a native of Santa Marinha do Zézere, Baião, born at an uncertain date, probably in the mid to late 1750s. Of noble birth, he was a longtime partisan of the liberal cause who fought against the French invasion in 1808, was involved with the Gomes Freire conspiracy of 1817 (a cousin was hanged), and was an enthusiastic partisan of the 1820 revolution. He followed a military career and also wrote poetry. Elected a deputy to the Constitutional Côrtes in 1822, he served for three days as Minister of War in May of 1823 during the "Vilafrancada". On the return of D. João VI to Lisbon he withdrew from politics, serving as governor of the fort of São João de Foz. He was married to D. Maria Helena de Saldanha Castro Lorena e Daun, a relative of the Duque de Saldanha and lady-in-waiting to the Queen D. Carlota Joaquina. He was assassinated in 1828 after the coup of D. Miguel. Innocêncio had a low opinion of him as a poet: "Não pulicou a segunda parte, com o que as letras pouco perderam a meu vêr. José Maximo não era poeta. A sua metrificação é muitas vezes errada, os pensamentos trivialissimos, e a linguagem empeçada e incorrecta, etc."

Second (?) edition of this translation; Gonçalves Rodrigues lists an edition of 1876 by Cunha e Sá, but calls for only 182, ii pp. (as our volume II). This exciting adventure tale for children was translated from *The Castaways: A Story of Adventure in the Wilds of Borneo*, first published in 1870, which was also translated to French, Dutch, Russian, Spanish, and Italian. Gonçalves Rodrigues lists no earlier Portuguese translations of the work.

The illustrations were drawn by noted artist and illustrator Jules-Descartes Férat (1819-1889?), who created images for works by Jules Verne, Edgard Allan Poe, and Victor Hugo. They were rendered in wood engravings by Henri Théophile Hildibrand (Paris, 1824-1897), a master in the technique who was one of the principal interpreters of Gustave Doré's drawings. The names of Férat, Hildibrand, and François Pannemaker, Hildibrand's friend and colleague, appear on various plates.

At a quick glance, these plates appear similar but not identical to those in the French translation of Paris, 1872, *Les Naufragés de l'île de Bornéo*. For example, the Paris edition has a small wood-engraving on the title page; the Lisbon edition has no engraving on the title, and the oval image on the half title is not the same as the one on the Paris title page. In the Paris edition, the frontispiece has "Les Naufragés" on a floating piece of wood in the foreground; the Lisbon edition has "Os Naufragos." The resolution of the digitized version on the Bibliothèque nationale de France's site is too low to be certain whether the other images are identical. The ones in this copy are certainly of exceptional quality.

Thomas Mayne Reid (Ballyroney, Ireland, 1818-London, 1883) arrived in America in 1840, where his first writings were published in 1842. He used his experience in New Orleans, Texas, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Newport, R.I., and the Mexican-American War as fodder for his popular adventure novels, which are reminiscent of those written by Robert Louis Stevenson. Reid was a drinking buddy of Edgard Allan Poe, who called him "a colossal but most picturesque liar." Among those who loved his novels as children were Theodore Roosevelt and Arthur Conan Doyle.

FIRST EDITION. It is not clear whether *Biographia de Remechido o celebre guerrilheiro do Algarve*, Tavira, 1892, is a second edition or a different work.

José Joaquim de Souza Reis, known as "O Remexido," fought on behalf of D. Miguel I. After D. Miguel was defeated in 1834, Souza Reis retreated to the mountains of the Algarve, where he waged guerrilla war against the government. To discover Souza Reis's

whereabouts, government forces tortured his wife and killed his 14-year-old son. After his capture he was pardoned by D. Maria II, but the Council of War sent him to a firing squad on August 2, 1838. This biography was published soon afterwards. It includes transcriptions of letters and statements from Remexido and his family as well as the Portuguese authorities.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this relatively early Portuguese work on trial by jury, including rules for the election of jurors (pp. [14]-32), and a section on their rights and obligations (pp. [33]-38). Pages [3]-13 give an historical resumé of the institution, with much on its development in England, and including, on pp. 10-11 a mention of the right to trial by jury in the Constitution of the United States of America.

António Pereira dos Reis (1804-1850), a native of Ourém, emigrated in 1828, spending time in France before joining the forces of D. Pedro in the Açores. During the siege of Porto in 1833 he was relieved of his duties as a soldier and functionary for having written articles critical of a foreign military officer in the *Crónica constitucional*, but was soon reintigrated into the liberal forces. In 1836 he was imprisoned for opposing the September revolution. Elected deputy to the Côrtes in 1838, he was reelected to all subsequent legislatures for the remainder of his life, as well as holding important administrative posts, such as *Secretário do Governo* in 1842, Secretary to the Duque da Terceira in 1846. When the duke was imprisoned in Porto, Pereira dos Reis evaded capture, arriving in Vigo, where he received the nomination of *Comissário Régio* for the provinces of Minho and Trás-os-Montes, residing in Valença do Minho during the civil war.

On behalf of Chile's cabinetmakers, José del Tránsito Cárdenas, Jorje Gaskill and Valentin Pages explain that Chilean artisans can compete in quality and good taste with foreign furniture manufacturers, but cannot compete in price, because manufacturers abroad are using industrial equipment that allows them to produce goods so cheaply that even the current 30% tariff on imported goods does

not equalize prices. Given the time frame (just before 1848, the "Year of Revolution"), it is fascinating that company owners raise the threat of revolution by the workers. The workers in Chile were paid more because their cost of living was higher, note the owners; if those workers are forced to work longer hours for less pay, the result would be "anárquica ... precipitando a la turbulencia y a la rebelion a una clase numerosa y terrible en el desencadenamiento de sus instintos. Sobran ejemplos de esta verdad, en las naciones europeas." The cabinetmakers request that goods used in furniture manufacturing be free of import duties and that foreign-made furniture be taxed so that its price is equal to the current price of Chilean furniture.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. The satiric poet and journalist José Augusto da Costa Resende [or Rezende] was born in Ponta Delgada, 1849 and died there in 1896 on a straw bed in an overnight flophouse. He led a bohemian life, working for the Semana in 1869, later editing the Diário dos Açores, where is 1874 he sustained a prolonged and heated political fight. In 1875 he left this newspaper, founding the weekly Partido popular, iniciating a regionalist campaign. In 1880 he passed over to A ventosa, afterwards Ventosa sarjada, a newspaper featuring violent political prose and verse, alienating just about everyone who counted in the Azores. From there on it was all downhill. His state of mind near the end of his life is reflected in the preface to the present volume: "Comquando isto aqui em S. Miguel seja terra mais propicia á cultura de batata do que á das lettras, não abandono a carreira que sigo por vocação." The book is dedicated to the Visconde da Palmeira, and begins with a brief biography of the dedicatee (pp. [7]-9). There are poems about or dedicated to Alice Moderno, Victor Hugo, Columbus, Ernesto do Canto, Camões, and the Conde de Jacome Corrêa. At the end of the volume (pp. [169]-183) is an essay giving a critical literary biography of Costa Resende, "Bocage açoriano" by F.[rancisco] M.[aria] Supico.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of an ode and a sonnet celebrating the birth of an heir to the throne. D. Maria Teresa, Princess of Beira (Maria Teresa Francisca de Assis Antónia Carlota Joana Josefa Xavier de Paula Micaela Rafaela Isabel Gonzaga) was born April 29, 1793, at the Ajuda palace. She was the first child of D. João, who was at the time unofficially ruling as prince regent for his mother D. Maria I, who had been declared incompetent the previous year. D. Maria Teresa was heir to heir to the throne (with the title Princess of Beira) until 1795, when D. João and Dona Carlota Joaquina had their first son, D. Francisco António.

In her political sympathies D. Maria Teresa sided with her mother. She allied herself with her brother D. Miguel (b. 1802) in his attempt to win the throne of Portugal (1826-1834). She also sided with her brother-in-law D. Carlos as he tried to wrest the crown from D. Isabella, daughter of D. Carlos's recently deceased brother Ferdinand VII of Spain. Her participation in the First Carlist War (1833-1839) led to her being excluded from the succession to the Spanish throne. She married D. Carlos (her sister's widower) in 1838; the couple left Spain soon after, when D. Carlos's attempt to become king failed. D. Maria Teresa died in Trieste, in 1874.

Simões Resurgido, a government official (*capitão das antigas ordenanças*) in Oeiras, was famous for his witty remarks and had an inclination to poetry: "na qual comtudo não fez grandes progressos, a julgar pelas obras que deixou," says Innocêncio. He died sometime before 1833.

Articles and decrees printed in full cover such topics as the national debt, the tobacco contract, crime in Lisbon, the Conde de Taipa, jurisdiction of the judiciary and the police, amnesty, and the Club Lisbonense. There are also lists of current prices, including, in number 14, p. 64 an extensive table of "Preço Corrente dos generos do Brazil em 31 de Janeiro de 1834". It was painstakingly edited by Bartolomeu dos Mártires Dias e Sousa, Rodrigo da Fonseca Magalhães, António Pereira M. Reis and A. de Azevedo Melo Ferreira Portugal. After initially supporting the Duke of Palmela, the *Revista semanal* became one of his most bitter enemies.

The newspaper was continued by *A Revista*, which began with n° 36 and was issued 4 times weekly.

The chair of diplomatics at the University of Coimbra was created for him in 1796, and transferred to Lisbon in 1801. Ribeiro was chronicler of Portugal's overseas dominions, royal censor at the Desembargo do Paço, and a member of the Academia Real das Sciencias. His many substantial works include *Dissertações chronologicas e criticas sobre a Historia e Jurisprudencia ecclesiastica e civil de Portugal*, 1810-1829 (5 volumes in 7 parts) and *Reflexões historicas*, 1835-1836.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. After insulting a priest, Rosa y Herrera had been sentenced to community service by Judge Manuel Joaquín Valdivieso. He published a condemnation of Valdivieso's behavior, to which the judge replied on March 16. Six days later Rosa y Herrera published this scathing attack on the judge, accusing him of abusing his powers ("siendo la peor de las tiranías la judicial"). If I'm such an evil man, asks Rosa y Herrera, why did the judge punish me with a mere 15 days of community service in a hospital?

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this poem in honor of the birth of the first child of D. João, heir to the throne of Portugal, and D. Carlota Joaquina. D. Maria Teresa, Princess of Beira (Maria Teresa Francisca de Assis Antónia Carlota Joana Josefa Xavier de Paula Micaela Rafaela Isabel Gonzaga) was born April 29, 1793, at the Ajuda palace. She was the first child of D. João, who was at the time unofficially ruling as prince regent for his mother D. Maria I, who had been declared incompetent the previous year. D. Maria Teresa was heir to heir to the throne (with the title Princess of Beira) until 1795, when D. João and D. Carlota Joaquina had their first son, D. Francisco António.

In her political sympathies D. Maria Teresa sided with her mother. She allied herself with her brother D. Miguel (b. 1802) in his attempt to win the throne of Portugal (1826-1834). She also sided with her brother-in-law D. Carlos as he tried to wrest the crown from D. Isabella, daughter of D. Carlos's recently deceased brother Ferdinand VII of Spain. Her participation in the First Carlist War (1833-1839) led to her being excluded from the succession to the Spanish throne. She married D. Carlos (her sister's widower) in 1838; the couple left Spain soon after, when D. Carlos's attempt to become king failed. D. Maria Teresa died in Trieste, in 1874.

The author, a career official at the Ministries of Marine and Foreign Relations, was the younger brother of Joaquim José da Costa e Sá. A native of Lisbon probably born ca. 1750-1765, he died sometime between 1820 and 1825. He was also a published poet and translator of several works from the French.

João Carlos Saldanha de Oliveira e Daun, (1790-1876) was marshal of the liberal armies fighting for D. Maria II; he was raised to the rank of conde (1827; confirmed

1833), marquês (1834), and finally duque (1846). Ninth son of the 1.° Conde de Rio Maior and maternal grandson of the 1.° Marquês de Pombal, he was also one of the dominant personalities in Portuguese politics of his era, serving as a cabinet minister 24 times (War, Foreign Affairs, Finance), four times as President of the Council of Ministers and leading a seven coups d'état.

There were laws governing it in mid-eighteenth century, if not earlier. It seems to have been concerned with the regulation and / or distribution of grains. Mention is made of a *Terreiro Público* situated near the customs house not far from the Lisbon waterfront; if not a coincidence, then the institution may have had a role in controlling the importation of grains.

On pp. 7-8 the wine trade is discussed.

The author was (Innocêncio thought) the Commissario de trigos no Terreiro Publico, and had died not long before 1858, when volume I of the *Diccionário bibliographico portuguez* appeared.

Resistance was stronger than expected, and when Austrian reinforcements drew near, Frederick lifted the siege and withdrew from Moravia. Olmütz is now Olomouc, in the Czech Republic.

The Seven Years' War, 1756-1763, was waged in Europe, North America (where it began in 1754, and is known as the French and Indian War), Central and South America, West Africa, India (the Third Carnatic War), and the Philippines. Prussia, Great Britain, and (from 1761) Portugal were allied against France, Austria, Spain (from 1761), Russia (until 1762), Sweden (1757-1762), Saxony, and the Mughal Empire (from 1757). Aside from venting the ongoing antagonism amongst the Bourbons, Habsburgs, and Hohenzollerns, the countries were battling for overseas colonies and commercial superiority. As a result of the war, Great Britain annexed Canada, much North American territory west of the Alleghenies, and Florida, and became dominant in the Indian subcontinent. France transferred Louisiana to Spain. Prussia gained influence at the expense of the Holy Roman Empire, which is often considered to be the starting point for the rise of the modern German state. Removal of the French threat to the thirteen North American Colonies and British attempts to obtain revenues from these colonies to compensate for wartime expenditures were major factors in the movement for independence that culminated in the American Revolution.

Almada, born in Troviscoso, Monção, in 1703, followed his father's footsteps to a military career at age 15, and by 1745 was a colonel in charge of the regiment at Cascais. When the earthquake struck Lisbon in 1755, his regiment was called in to replace D. José I's bodyguards. Family ties with Sebastião José de Carvalho e Melo helped him earn the trust of the future Marquês de Pombal, so that in February 1757, Almada e Melo was named *governador de armas do Porto* and dispatched to stifle an uprising in Porto against the new Companhia Geral da Agricultura das Vinhas do Alto Douro.

Almada e Melo rapidly brought the situation in Porto under control, and then remained in Porto the rest of his life. In 1761, he began overseeing the renovation of the part of Porto outside the medieval walls. D. José created the Junta das Obras Publicas in 1762, applying to Porto the same means that were being employed to rebuild Lisbon. This major effort of urban planning and renovation was funded by a tax on wine. Public buildings constructed under Almada e Melo's tenure include the Hospital de Santo António, the Casa da Feitoria Inglesa, and the Real Academia da Marinha e do Comércio (today the Reitoria da Universidade do Porto). In 1764, the year before this poem appeared, Almada e Melo was named governador da Justiça e Relação do Porto.

Almada e Melo died in 1786, and is buried in Monção. The Rua do Almada in Porto is named after him, as is a prestigious prize awarded every two years for the best rehabilitation of a historic building in Porto.

D. Mariana Victoria (1718-1781), eldest daughter of Philip V of Spain, was married in 1729 to D. José, Principe do Brasil, who ascended to the throne in 1750 as D. José I. She bore D. José four daughters and ruled as regent for her husband from 1776-1777, after he suffered a series of strokes. D. José was succeeded in 1777 by his eldest daughter, D. Maria I, to whom D. Mariana Victoria acted as an advisor.

As queen mother, D. Mariana Victoria bent her formidable energies to improving relations with Spain, which had deteriorated due to disagreements over Portuguese and Spanish colonies in the Americas. In 1777-1778 she went on a year-long trip to Spain, during which she arranged the Treaty of El Pardo, signed on March 11, 1778, which aimed to settle differences that had been building since the Treaty of Tordesillas, most recently the incursions of the São Paulo *bandeirantes* into Spanish territories in South America. Present-day Uruguay and parts of Paraguay were confirmed as Spanish, while vast parts of the Amazon basin were recognized as Brazilian. The treaty was cemented by a double marriage between two of D. Mariana Victoria's grandchildren and two children of the Spanish royal family. (One of these couples, the future D. João VI and the Infanta Carlota Joaquina, were married in 1785 and turned out to be passionately incompatible.)

João Dias Talaia Souto-Maior (d. 1795) was a member of the Academia dos Obsequiosos, which was based in his own home and under the protection of D. Pedro III (as stated on the title page of this work). Innocêncio reports that Talaia Souto-Maior was also an extremely skilled bullfighter (!) who published a collection of poetry (*Rimas*, 1790) and edited the anthology *Sessões litterarias dos alumnos da Academia dos Obsequiosos, do logar de Sacavem*, 1790-1791 (3 volumes). This poem is presumably one of the works Innocêncio uncharacteristically fails to catalogue: "varias poesias, e outras miudezas avulsamente impressas, de que me pareceu escusado fazer aqui menção especial." Talaia Souto-Maior also published birthday greetings and an oration to D. Mariana Victoria in 1778, when she was in Spain negotiating the Treaty of El Pardo.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. This discussion relates moral philosophy to the successes in India of D. Luiz Carlos de Menezes, captain-general and viceroy of India. In describing the hero's victories over the natives, Sousa claims that the name "Menezes" comes from the Greek *meneos*, bravery, and gives fulsome praise to the Captain-General. The work is dedicated to D. Francisco Xavier de Menezes, fourth Conde de Ericeira.

Manoel Caetano de Sousa (Lisbon, 1658-1734), illegitimate son of D. Francisco de Sousa, captain of the Guarda Alemã, was educated by his grandmother D. Leonor de Mello and in 1676 became a *clerigo regular theatino*. In 1709, he was chosen to assist at the Capítulo Geral in Rome, taking the opportunity to visit the city's vast libraries. Known as a tremendously erudite man, he published (according to Innocêncio) nearly 300 works in Portuguese and Latin.

It was Sousa who publicly proposed the formation of a historical academy to write scholarly histories of Portugal and its dominions. The institution was established by command of D. João V in 1720 under the name Academia Real da História Portuguesa. Sousa was a founding member and the Academia's first director. This work was read within the first year of the Academia's existence.

One of many editions of these laws setting out who pays taxes in Spain and how much. The earliest edition of the *Quaderno* listed in Palau is Burgos, 1486; the latest is Alcalá, 1560. This is the last of the numerous editions by the Crombergers: it appeared the year Juan died. Palau lists Cromberger editions of 1510, 1514, 1520, 1529, 1535, and 1540.

The 146 laws were issued by Los Reyes Católicos (D. Fernando and D. Isabel) and by "Juana la Loca," nominally queen of Castile and Aragon 1504-1555, who was imprisoned after 1509 on orders of her father D. Fernando and kept imprisoned by her son, D. Carlos (later D. Carlos I of Spain and Emperor Charles V).

In Spain in the early sixteenth century, the crown's main source of revenue was the *alcabala*, a flat 10% sales tax that was supposed to be collected on every mercantile transaction. The laws reprinted here make it startlingly clear how many exemptions and changes were accepted into the seemingly simple flat-tax code. There are special laws applying to goods used on Crusades, goods captured from Moors in time of war, and fairs held in various towns. (Such fairs, especially the one at Medina del Campo, had become the financial markets of the sixteenth century.) There are rules for tailors, spinners, and rag collectors. Dozens of laws regulate landlords and tenants. One restricts Jews and Moors: "Que los judios y mores no sean arrendadores menores saluo en lugar que tenga jurisdicion y sea de dozientes vezinos arriba" (Law 58). One can also see the trend toward taxing basic foodstuffs rather than all sales. The *Quaderno* includes dozens of taxes relating to those who sell oil, meat, wine, and bread.

Although the title page states that these laws were issued in the *vega de Granada*, the laws themselves mention Seville, Cordoba, Cadiz, the Basque town of Fuenterrabia (in Guipúzcoa), Guadalupe (Extremadura), Val de Palacios (near Madrid?), Villa Franca del Arzopisbado, Santa Maria la Nieva (Segovia), Valladolid, Madrid, Toledo, Cordoba, Jaen, Badajoz, and Ubeda (Andalusia).

Revenues from the *alcabala* far outstripped even the income from the gold and silver being mined in Spain's American colonies. Wars of Holy Roman Emperor Charles V were still funded mainly by taxes such as the *alcabala*, levied in Spain. When he could not raise adequate funds by such taxes, he had to borrow at rates as high as 43%. Collection of taxes was therefore a matter of great urgency. However, the income from the *alcabala* was problematic. Many towns had set a fixed sum that had not kept up with inflation, receipts often went to local nobles rather than the king's coffers, and, as is clear from this collection of laws, exemptions were frequent.

The Crombergers were a publishing dynasty founded by Jacobo Cromberger, a German immigrant who was active in Seville from 1503 to 1528. At the invitation of D. Manuel I of Portugal, he printed in Évora and Lisbon from 1521 to 1528 (or perhaps printed in Seville using the Portuguese imprints), while still maintaining his print shop in Seville.

In 1525 he handed management of the Seville office to his son Juan Cromberger, who ran it until 1528 using his and his father's name, and from then to 1540 under his own name. One of Juan's claims to fame is the introduction of printing to America: he sent Juan Pablos (Giovanni Paoli) to Mexico in 1539, with types from the Cromberger stock. Juan's widow took over the Cromberger press from 1541 to 1545, when it was transferred to his eldest son, Jacome Cromberger, who remained active until 1553. This work was published at the Cromberger press the same year as the first edition of Medina's *Arte de navegar*.


# Local Government in Salamanca Sets Prices for Footwear and Leather Goods

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this fascinating glimpse into the nitty-gritty details of the manufacture and sale of leather goods, one of Spain's leading industries, during an economic crisis under D. Carlos I (Emperor Charles V). In a decree of 9 October 1552 (reprinted on Il. A2r-A3v), D. Carlos ordered prices to be fixed for shoes and other leather goods. The decree was published as *La prematica para el remedio de la grand carestia que havia en el calçado*, variations of which were printed in October and November of that year at Madrid and Alcalá de Henares.

Recognizing that prices varied widely throughout Spain, D. Carlos ordered the local *ayuntamientos* to set the prices of leather goods for their regions. Here the officials at Salamanca announce prices for over a hundred types and sizes of shoes for men, women, and children, ranging from slippers to boots, in materials from the crudest cowhides to the finest cordovan leather. A shoe of cordovan leather "a la morisca" of 5 *puntos* can be sold for a maximum of 29 *maravedis*, while one of 13 *puntos* can be sold for 69 *maravedis*. Prices for leather bottles of various sizes (*cueros para vino*) range from 51 to 119 *maravedis* (ff. A9v-10r). A supplementary decree on the final leaf clarifies issues regarding *herretes* (leather cords?). The names of members of the local government are mentioned, as well as Salamanca manufacturers and sellers of leather goods, with the locations of their shops.

Price regulations such as these were an attempt to resolve severe shortages of basic commodities in Spain. The influx of gold from the Americas that began in the 1520s

eventually led to massive inflation in the Spanish economy. Spanish goods were priced out of European markets, and shortages in clothing, shoes, and other basic goods became common throughout Spain. Mistakenly believing that the shortages were occurring because too many goods were shipped abroad, D. Carlos slapped on export restrictions. In May 1552 he prohibited the export of wool, silk, and leather goods from Spain, except to the Spanish colonies in America. Within a few years the export restrictions led to an economic depression, and merchants and the *cortes* were pleading with the crown to revoke them; but the restrictions remained in place for more than a decade.

This is a relatively early imprint by Andrea de Portonaris, active in Salamanca from 1547 to 1568 and most famous for the definitive edition of *Las Siete Partidas* by Gregorio López, 1555. Descended from a family of printers in Italy who had established a branch in Lyon, he married a woman who was the widow and the daughter of Salamanca printers. Andrea published over 180 editions of books, making him Salamanca's most prolific sixteenth-century printer, and was the first in Salamanca to switch to redonda types from gothic. From his press came most of the works by the University of Salamanca's professors, including Domingo de Soto, Diego de Covarrubias, Melchor Cano, and Francisco Sánchez "el Brocense." He also published Italian Renaissance works by Pietro Bembo and Angelo Poliziano, the first editions of Luis de Granada, and works in Greek, for which he cast his own type.

Sixteenth-century Spanish works have become steadily more rare on the market. The British Library's 16th-century STC lists only 9 works printed by Portonaris through 1551.



FIRST EDITION in this form of these updated statutes for a charitable organization established to benefit Spaniards and their descendants in Naples. The *Prefazione* (pp. 5-8) gives a brief history of the Real Congregazione e monte del Santissimo Sacramento de Nobili Spagnoli, which was founded in 1614 by Pedro Fernandez de Castro, Conde de Lemos, and issued its first statutes in 1624. Its members visited prisons and hospitals, gave alms, and assisted with marriages and funerals.

The preface mentions the *demolizione* of the home of the Congregazione soon after 1812, and that it was given a new home in the Chiesa di S. Giacomo. The church of San Giacomo degli Spagnoli was commissioned in 1540 by the Spanish Viceroy Pedro Alvarez de Toledo, Marquis of Villafranca. Dedicated to St. James (Santiago), patron saint of Spain, it was a landmark of Naples until 1816, when by order of Ferdinand I of Naples, it was enveloped in the neoclassical Palazzo San Giacomo in the Piazza Municipio, which today serves as the city hall.

*Provenance*: Bound for Maria Christina Ferdinanda di Borbone of the Two Sicilies, 1806-1878. Daughter of Francis I of the Two Sicilies and Maria Isabella of Spain, she was born in Palermo, Sicily. Soon after the third wife of Ferdinand VII of Spain died in 1829, Maria Christina became his fourth wife and was queen consort of Spain until Ferdinand's death in 1833. Upon his death she became regent for her elder daughter, whose claim to the throne was disputed by her uncle in the Carlist Wars. Within months of Ferdinand's death, Maria Cristina secretly married an ex-sergeant of the royal guards, to whom she bore several children. In 1844, when the regency ended, her daughter Isabella II gave official consent and the pair was publicly wed. Under Alfonso XII's reign, Maria Christina and daughter Isabella both died in exile in France.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Thomas Sutcliffe, a British soldier serving in the Chilean army, defends himself against accusations that he is an adventurer and a mercenary. The documents he provides relate to his term as political and military governor of the Juan Fernández Islands, used by Chile as a penal colony. Two letters deal with his execution of prisoners Rafael Moreno and José Manuel Suaso after the massive earthquake in February 20, 1835. Another letter explains that when he became governor of Juan Fernández, Commandant Francisco de Paula Lattapiat sold him 8 barrels of flour that turned out to belong to the commissary rather than the commandant. Sutcliffe returned them. In March 1836 Sutcliffe tendered his resignation with the hope that he might receive a bonus for his long years of service: he was released, but brusquely denied money. In a final document Sutcliffe explains why he thinks he is owed money, including the fact that after the 1835 earthquake he used some of his own money to purchase materials to rebuild the barracks at Juan Fernández.


Sutcliffe (1790-1849), a Yorkshireman, served in the British navy and at Waterloo. In 1817 he fought beside the Colombians for independence, and in 1821 offered his services to Chile. There he remained for 16 years as a cavalry officer, rising by 1834 to the rank of political and military governor of the Juan Fernández Islands. These islands, 400 miles off the coast of Chile, were possibly the inspiration for *Robinson Crusoe*: Alexander Selkirk was marooned there from 1705-1709.

According to the *Dictionary of National Biography*, Sutcliffe returned to England in late 1839. He tried to make a living writing books on Chile and Peru, but died in abject poverty in 1849.

D. Carlota Joaquina, daughter of Carlos IV of Spain, was engaged to D. João as part of the negotiations for the Treaty of El Pardo, signed on March 11, 1778, when she was five and D. João was eleven. The marriage formally took place in 1785, but was not consummated until 1790, the year before this pamphlet appeared celebrating her sixteenth birthday. Although the couple had nine children they were famously, passionately incompatible. When the royal family returned from Brazil in 1820, D. Carlota Joaquina became allied with the enemies of the new constitutional regime in the "conspiracy of Rua Formosa," whose aim was to dissolve the Cortes, depose D. João, and name the D. Carlota Joaquina as regent for D. Miguel. On 22 November 1822, the queen refused to uphold the new Constitution, and the Cortes reacted on 4 December by revoking D. Carlota's status as queen of Portugal and as a Portuguese citizen. She was ordered to leave the country, but her doctors insisted that such a journey might threaten her life; instead, she was sent to live at the quinta of Ramalhão.

that the accused had run off with an innocent young woman and had been living with her in poverty in Santiago. He sent the young woman to a decent home, assigned 15 days of community service to Rosa y Herrera, and released him on his own recognizance to return to his family. The next Valdivieso heard of him was when Rosa y Herrera published a scurrilous attack on him.

Valdivieso (d. 1839), a lawyer, was named a judge in criminal court in 1828. Two years later he was named to the Corte Suprema. In 1826-1827 he had served as deputy in the Congreso Naional Constituyente, and from 1831-1833 he was deputy in the Asamblea Provincial de Santiago.

Francisco Valença (1882-1962) was perhaps the most important twentieth-century Portuguese caricaturist. The article on him in the *Grande enciclopédia portuguesa e brasileira* notes that Valença was renowned in Portugal and abroad, comparing him to Bordalo Pinheiro, one of the geniuses of the art of caricature: "Durante toda a sua vida tem constantemente enriquecido com os seus desenhos não só inúmeras páginas da grande maioria dos jornais e revistas de Portugal, com também de França, de Espanha e do Brasil. É, tanto pela extensão da sua obra, como pela sua intenção artística e social, **um dos maiores caricaturistas portugueses depois de Rafael Bordalo Pinheiro**, com o qual tem grandes afinidades. ..."

Valença began his career in 1900, as director of *O Chinelo*, which he founded with André Brun and writer Carlos Simões. Valença also founded *Salão cómico* (1902); *Varões assinalados* (1909-1911—winner of the "Grand Prix" in the Rio de Janeiro exposition of 1922-1923); and *O Moscardo* (1913). His work appeared in the following newspapers, journals, and reviews: *A Comédia portuguesa* (1902); *Brasil-Portugal* (1902-1909); *Suplemento humorístico do Século* (1904-1908); *Novidades* (1907); *Ilustração portuguesa* (1906-1920); *Tiro e sport* (1906-1911); *Arte musical* (1907-1908); *Alma nacional* (1910); *A Sátira* (1911); *Eco artístico* (1914-1915); *O teatro* (1922-1923); *Diário de notícias* (the *New York Times* of Portugal; 1919-1924, 1930); *O Mundo* (1918-1924); *Eco Artístico* (1914-1915); *De Teatro* (1922-1923); *República* (1918); *Ilustração* (1926); *Sempre fixe* (for 30 years, starting in 1926); *Alma nova* (1922-1925); *Portucale* (Porto, 1930). He was artistic director of the weekly *O Espectro* (1925). Abroad, his work appeared in *Rire* (Paris); *Boletin Fermé* (Barcelona); and many newspapers and reviews in Rio de Janeiro.

Together with Carlos Simões, Valença produced the *Catálogo cómico*, with send-ups of works by Portugal's serious artists shown in the Exposição de Belas Artes in 1914-1919, 1923 and 1924.

Valença's illustrations appeared in numerous special Christmas issues of the *Diário de Notícias* and the *Comércio do Porto*. He illustrated books for Emília de Sousa Costa,

As the eldest son of D. Maria I and D. Pedro III, D. José (b. 1761) was the heir to the throne of Portugal, and his death at a young age radically changed the course of the country over the following decades. In 1777, at age 15, D. José married his aunt, thirty-year-old Infanta Benedita, youngest daughter of D. José I and D. Mariana Victoria of Spain. The marriage was favored by D. José I, but it was rumored that it was particularly desired by the powerful Marquês de Pombal, who perhaps hoped to establish Salic law so that the succession to the throne would have passed from D. José I directly to his grandson D. José, bypassing D. Maria—who was known to dislike Pombal.

Three days after his grandson's wedding, D. José I died. D. Maria succeeded to the throne as Portugal's first queen regnant, and D. José became Prince of Brazil and Duke of Bragança. One of D. Maria's first acts was to remove Pombal from office and choose advisors from among his enemies. Still, many Portuguese hoped that when D. José succeeded to the throne, he would be influenced by the progressive ideas of the Enlightenment.

Alas, in 1788, the 27-year-old D. José died of smallpox, without issue. (His mother had refused to allow him to receive the recently discovered inoculation.) The new heir to the throne was D. José's brother D. João, who was very religious and favored absolutism. He acted as prince regent from 1799 and ruled as D. João VI from 1816 to 1826.

A number of works on the death of D. José were published together under the series title Collecção funebre das obras impressas por ocasião da morte do serenissimo senhor D. Joseph Principe do Brasil, Lisbon, 1788.

The only copy we were able to locate, via the Catálogo Colectivo de las Universidades de Catalunya, is in the Biblioteca de Monserrate. It appears to be a translation from a French newsletter.

The account begins describing Louis XIII's piety, stating that the King stopped at Orleans to observe the Easter festivities before heading to battle. The account builds to the battle of Île de Ré on April 16, 1622, between the royal forces and Benjamin de Rohan, Duc de Soubise (French Huguenot leader, famous for leading the Siege of Saint-Martinde-Ré in 1625, younger brother of Henri II de Rohan, Duc de Rohan and Prince de Léon). Louis XIII was victorious in this battle, and the Duc de Soubise was forced to flee to [Les Sables-d'] Olonne at low tide. Additional persons mentioned throughout the account include: the Prince of Condé, Señor Bassompierre (possibly François de Bassompierre [1579-1646] who signed the Treaty of Madrid in 1621), the Count of Soissons, the Count de

Rochefucaut, and Señor Marillac. The final paragraphs emphasize the embarrassment of the Duc de Soubise, who lost all of his authority due to, among other factors, having lost an entire regiment of 1200 men.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION. Manuel, Sabel and Ismael were born in Persia of a pagan father, but their mother raised them in the Christian faith. When they were sent by the Persian emperor to Chalcedon (Bithynia, modern Turkey) to negotiate with the Roman Emperor Julian (r. 361-3), Julian took offense at their refusal to worship pagan gods. Despite their diplomatic status, he ordered them tortured, then executed, in 362. Their bodies were immediately swallowed up in an earthquake, so that rather than being burned as Julian had ordered, they were given Christian burials. This account tells the story of their martyrdom at length, with "reports" of the exchanges between Julian and the Persians. At the end is a brief bibliography of writings on the lives of these martyrs. According to the title page, this work was written by a member of the Irmandade de São Manoel.

The finely detailed half-page woodcut on the title page shows St. Manuel about to be beheaded. At the upper right is the angel who appeared while he was being tortured and relieved all his pain, and above the angel is God in glory.

Fought by the coast of Terceira Island in the Azores on August 11, 1829, between Portuguese loyalists and a Miguelista fleet as part of the Portuguese civil war between the liberals, in the names of D. Pedro, former King of Portugal, at the time still reigning as Emperor D. Pedro I of Brazil and his daughter D. Maria II, in whose favor D. Pedro had relinquished his rights to the Portuguese throne, versus the absolutist forces of his younger brother, D. Miguel I. The Miguelistas under command of José António Azevedo e Lemos attempted to disembark troops on Terceira island, but were defeated by loyalist troops under command of the 7.° Conde de Vila Flor (later 1.° Marquês de Vila Flor and still later 1.° Duque da Terceira), who controlled a dozen small forts and artillery batteries along five kilometers of coast. The defeat of the absolutists in this battle was decisive for the affirmation and posterior victory of liberalism in Portugal. After the war, the municipality of Praia was renamed Praia da Vitória.



The author (1724-1814) was an important figure in Portuguese literature and literary criticism during the Enlightenment. Son of a Lisbon blacksmith, he became a Franciscan at age 16, and studied and taught at Coimbra. He later served as Provincial of the Franciscan Order in Portugal (elected 1768), as Confessor for Principe D. José (appointed 1769), and first Bishop of Beja (appointed 1770). He was head of the Meza Censoria, and also of the Junta de Providência Litteraria, the committee appointed by Pombal to reform the universities. When the Marquês de Pombal fell from power in 1777, Villas Boas retired from public affairs. In 1802 he was elected Archbishop of Évora, and while there suffered many indignities during the French invasion.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION? A judge explains at considerable length his reasons for ruling in favor of D. Pedro Forstall in a case having to do with insurance on a cargo bound for Caracas. No dates are given in the text, but judging from the printing and paper, the case was in the late eighteenth century or very early nineteenth century. Moreover, D. Pedro Forstall appears to have been Pedro Francisco Forstall Russell (Santa Cruz de Tenerife, 1759-Santa Cruz de Tenerife, 1810), from an Irish Catholic merchant family which had settled in Tenerife. Others mentioned in the text appear to have been active in the late eighteenth century, such as Juan Cólogan (Juan Cólogan Valois, 1746-1799), from another Irish family removed to Tenerife.

The author, who favors the Carta Constitucional, worries about the results of the upcoming national elections for parliamentary seats, and encourages all Portuguese to vote for "homens de saber, virtude, independencia, e probidade." In the spring of 1846, the peasant revolt known as the Maria da Fonte movement broke out in the north of Portugal, not far from Porto where this pamphlet was written and printed.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this response to *Carta do verdadeiro anonymo*, 1745, which seems in turn to have been a response to *Carta escripta por hum anonymo*, a certo cavalheiro, 1744. Although the events discussed in the original publication belong to the War of the Austrian Succession (1740-1748), the present writer attacks the writer of the previous *Carta* rather than supplying further information about the war. He disparages his opponent's rhetorical abilities and condemns his grasp of facts, grammar, and syntax. On p. 15, in an endnote, he declares that he will publish no further writings on this topic.

The War of the Austrian Succession began in 1740, with the death of Emperor Charles VI. It included several small conflicts: the War of Jenkins' Ear (which began in 1739), King George's War in North America (1744-1748), and two Silesian wars, finally ending in 1748 with the Treaty of Aix-la-Chapelle, which mostly returned territories to the status quo ante.

FIRST and ONLY EDITION of this wonderfully rousing piece of rhetoric from soldiers in Santiago to their counterparts in Valparaiso. The writer claims that a foreign government is protecting a "faccioso que la patria condenò a perpetua ignominia," and evokes memories of the war against Spain and the heroes of the Roman Republic to urge soldiers in Valparaiso to suppress the "fantásticas aspiraciones de un político aventurero." The object of this vituperation is General Ramón Freire, Chile's former supreme director (1823-1826) and president (1827), who had persuaded the Peru-Bolivian Confederation to subsidize his attempt to capture Chiloé, as a step toward overthrowing the conservative government of José Joaquin Prieto and Diego Portales.

Following the failure of Freire's expedition (he was imprisoned in Valparaiso, court-martialled and exiled), Portales sent an expedition that captured three ships of the Confederation's fleet at Callao on August 21, 1836. Treaty negotiations having failed, Chile declared war on the Peru-Bolivian Confederation on December 28, 1836.

This flyer was clearly written after the Quillota mutiny of June, which resulted in the execution of Diego Portales: "Decidles tambien que entre vosotros están los que en época mas reciente y de fúnebre memoria, ahogaron al nacer el monstruo impio de la rebelion, incitado por ese mismo tirano que vais a destronar." In a 180-degree shift of public opinion, Marshal Santa Cruz was blamed for the Quillota mutiny and the death of Portales, and Chileans were suddenly eager to invade Peru.

If this situation is not stopped, he warns, Chile will suffer the same horrible fate as its arch-enemy Peru.

In early June, the mutinous soldiers at Quillota had imprisoned Diego Portales as he was organizing an expedition against the Peru-Bolivian Confederation, on whom Chile had declared war in December 1836.

It also states that Marshal Santa Cruz was disliked by Peruvians and Bolivians ("Aseguran que en la Paz ha sido insultado públicamente su retrato") and that the Argentines are invading the south.

Although this writer states that "Los pueblos reciben en palmas a sus libertadores," General Blanco Encalada's troops did not receive the support from locals that they had hoped for. The Chilean soldiers were soon surrounded by Santa Cruz's army, and Blanco Encalada was forced to sign the Treaty of Paucarpata (November 17, 1837)—which the Chilean government promptly repudiated.

The Peruvians are described as standing plaintively on their shores with raised arms, waiting only for the appearance of Chilean ships to rebel. This is one of the few Chilean ephemeral pamphlets that expresses any sympathy for Peru, although it is perhaps less sympathy than *Schadenfreude*: "Llegó el momento de voltar á ser por segunda vez los libertadores del desgraciado Perú." The leaf includes at the top a charming woodcut of cavalrymen charging into battle.

The naval expedition against the Peru-Bolivian Confederation was headed by General Blanco Encalada, who had defeated the Quillota mutineers in June. In Peru his force of 2,800 was not, in fact, greeted with relief by Peruvians. Instead it was surrounded by Marshal Santa Cruz's troops, and Blanco Encalada was forced to sign the Treaty of Paucarpata (November 17, 1837), which the Chilean government promptly repudiated.

Xavier attacks Tomás Antonio Sánchez's assertions (in *Coleccion de poesias castellanas anteriores al siglo XV*, Madrid: Sancha, 1779) regarding Fernão Alvares do Oriente, whose *Lusitânia transformada* was first published in 1607. Alvares, a contemporary of Camões, had traveled widely in India and China; his pastoral poem centers on the protagonist's travels through the Persian Gulf, India, Goa, Japan, China,

Indonesia, and Ethiopia, using an Eastern rather than a European Arcadia. This pamphlet begins and ends with quotes from Alvares's work.

Father Francisco José da Serra Xavier (Lisbon, ca. 1740?-ca. 1803-5?), a secular presbyter and a distinguished philologist, as assigned by a royal *alvará* of 13 May 1780 to write "a historia completa e verdadeira das grandes e gloriosas acções obradas pela nação portugueza na America, Asia e Africa, desde o principio do seu descobrimento até o presente." Innocêncio could discover no traces of such a work. Xavier, who was related to Diogo Barbosa Machado, wrote several works defending Barbosa's works against critics.

The "Secção Official" occupies (1 l.), 7-23 pp. The "Secção Scientifica" occupies (1 l.), 20 pp. The "Secção Descriptiva das Escurcões" occupies (1 l.), 66 pp., and includes a summary of the minutes of the Commissão for March through May 1863, with "Os levantamentos e inquietações practicadas pelos antepassados de Dipú a que nos referimos são os seguintes" on pp. 65-66, listing events from 1746 to 1845.

Filippe Nery Xavier (1804-1875), historian, archeologist, and exemplary public functionary thoughout his adult life, a native of Loutulim in the concelho de Salsete, was director of the Imprensa Nacional in Goa from 1851. One of Goa's best historians, he published *Bosquejo histórico das comunidades das aldeias dos concelhos das Ilhas, Salcete e Bardez,* 1852, and *Nobiliarchia goana,* 1862-63, the enormously popular *Resumo histórico da maravilhosa vida, conversões e milagres de S. Francisco Xavier,* 1859, and many other works.
