Henry Brougham,(1778 - 1868), later Lord Chancellor, was an early champion of parliamentary reform who advocated the enfranchisement of large towns, the reduction of rotten boroughs and the grant of the franchise to copyholders, leasholders and all householders.

In this speech to the local freeholders he targets Lord Lonsdale's control over Westmorland's two parliamentary seats: "To rank, and wealth, and power, like his, I have not the shadow of pretension - but I differ from him in one other particular...Had I his possessions, aye, or the tenth part of them, I would never allow a son of mine to take eleven or twelve hundred pounds a year from the public."

Opens with an address To the Navy and Army of Great Britain as co-heirs of Nelson's fame followed by a further address To the Public in which the author writes that he "has felt the force of British Virtue, when opposed to more than punic Perfidy. / While on one page, the Virtues of the British Hero smile; on the other, are pourtrayed, imperfectly, the Corsican's Enormities..." There follow three laudatory cantos extolling Nelson's virtues with occasional footnoted references.
